SAFETY

Always prioritize safety. Follow safety protocols provided by the business, including wearing protective gear and observing safety guidelines in labs or workshops. Hair should be sufficiently secured to prevent accidental tangling.

ASK QUESTIONS RESPECTFULLY

Engage in the visit by asking relevant and respectful questions. Avoid interrupting presentations or discussions and wait for appropriate opportunities to ask questions.

STAY WITH THE GROUP

Remain with the designated tour group at all times. Do not wander off or explore areas that are not part of the scheduled visit without permission.

CELL PHONE USAGE

Minimize cell phone usage during the visits. Refrain from taking photos, videos, or making calls unless explicitly permitted by the business.

FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS

Follow all instructions given by tour guides, instructors, or employees of the business. This includes emergency procedures and evacuation protocols.

GRATITUDE

Express gratitude to the employees and staff of the business for hosting the visit. Thank them for their time and for sharing their knowledge and expertise.

NO DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR

Avoid any behavior that may disrupt the visit or cause inconvenience to others. This includes loud talking, running, or engaging in horseplay.
