The Ordeal is a vital part of the Induction Process of the Order of the Arrow. The Ordeal provides a time for a Scout to reflect upon their experiences within Scouting. These reflections will hopefully broaden their experiences, and reaffirming their love for Scouting.

During the Ordeal experience, a candidate is required to:

- Maintain silence
- Work on Camp improvement projects
- Receive small amounts of food
- Sleep alone and apart from other campers

The entire experience is designed to enrich significant values that are a core part of scouting. Induction weekends are filled with many activities, all of which are safe and fully supervised in accordance with BSA Policies. There are hundreds of thousands of OA members, all of whom have participated in an Ordeal. The Ordeal experience is one that no scout will ever forget because of the honor that has been given by being inducted into the Order of the Arrow.
