Welcome to the Jungle! We are here to help you have a wonderful time on your Expedition.

#### Check-In at Dining Hall

You will receive a Welcome Packet with all the information you need to have a wonderful expedition.

#### Campsite Set-Up

The speed limit is 5 mph. Carefully drive to your campsite, unload, and immediately drive back up to the parking lot.

We have small roads and limited space. Please do not leave your vehicle at the campsite while setting up your camp or for any other reason, drop off only

At the parking lot, leave the front end of your vehicle pointed out towards the parking area. This is for emergency purposes.

#### Check-Out / Leaving Property

Any time you leave R-C, including departing at the end of the session, please check-out. We must account for everyone on the property.

During the session, please go to the Health Lodge / Headquarters (*Kevin's Lodge*) to check-out. If it is after hours, there will be a book on the picnic table that you can sign out.

#### Medical Attention:

If you need medical attention, visit Health Lodge/Headquarters or contact a staff member who will contact the Health Officer. The Health Officer is available 24 hours a day.

Remember:

- 1) Stay calm, and
- 2) Never move an injured person

#### Coffee with the Director

There will be coffee available on the porch of Health Lodge/Headquarters (*Kevin's Lodge*) every morning from 6 to 6:45. Come up for good coffee and hang out with Jennifer.

#### Announcements

Announcements will be during morning and evening ceremonies. Information will be posted on the bulletin board outside the Dining Hall entrance.

#### Morning Ceremony

Please gather at the Flag Grounds for our Flag Raising Ceremony and Announcements. Campers will have a staggered release for breakfast. After breakfast, there is 30 minutes for family time.

#### Lunch

After your last activity, campers will go directly to the dining hall for lunch.

#### Evening Ceremony

Please gather at the Flag Grounds for our Flag Lowering Ceremony and Announcements. If possible, Cub Scouts should wear their Field Uniform for the evening events. Campers will have a staggered release for dinner.

#### Flag Ceremonies

Cub Scouts may volunteer to participate in the camp ceremonies at the Flag Grounds or can organize their own at the campsite. Flag ceremonies may be part of a Cub Scout adventure requirement.

#### Dining Hall Duty

Each campsite is asked to help with the Dining Hall Duties. Please see the staff member in charge of kitchen duty for directions.

#### Scout Attire / Uniforms

We ask that all attire worn by youth and adults be scout appropriate. During the day, pack/scout t-shirts are great. In the evenings, if possible, Cub Scouts should wear their Field Uniform for Evening Ceremony, Dinner and Campfire.

#### Lost & Found

Please check the lost and found box in the dining hall. We want to make sure you go home with all your belongings!

At the end of Cub Scout summer camp, unclaimed items are bagged and then sent to the Council Service Center in Phoenix. If you realize you lost something, contact Council. Items are only stored until the middle of July, then donated.

#### Trading Post

Our Trading Post full of amazing and fun things. It is located across from the Art Hut in Cabin 3. Hours will be posted at the cabin.

#### Youth Showers

The Youth Shower is located on the main road on the right side, near the Director's Cabin. The boys and girls shower hours will be posted. There are six stalls in the shower house and outside each stall is a plastic shelf unit where youth can place their towels and clothes.

#### Family Showers

The Family Showers are located next to the Health Lodge / Headquarters. Youth must be accompanied by an adult member.

If needed, an hour each day will be reserved for Scouts BSA Fish Camp participants..

#### In the Wild

##### Campfires

There are to be no fires at campsites. If needed, you may use a propane stove.

##### This is a Wilderness Area

Do not leave any food in your tent! Do not attempt to pet or touch any wild animals regardless of size, cuteness or any reason. Cub Scouts always use the **buddy system, no exceptions**. *Do not wander into the wilderness areas alone or with your buddy. We don't want any lost campers.*

##### Forest Closures

As private property of the Grand Canyon Council, we do not close during forest closures. However, under no circumstances are campers permitted to enter the National Forest during such closures.

##### Water Conservation

Please keep all showers short. We are always need to be careful with our natural resources and need to conserve water. Adults, please monitor your Scouts. Make sure they have left the shower facilities with all their belongings. A bag of "Shower Beads" is in each Campsite Box. Adults can award them after showers for the Scouts.

##### Smoking

Smoking (includes vaping and other similar devices) while at R-C, is only allowed in your vehicle with the windows rolled up per regulations of the forest service.

##### Fire or Other Emergency

In the case of an emergency situation, there will be an alarm sounded that is a signal to all campers and staff to report to the Flag Grounds for further instruction.
