C William Carl Garner Visitor Center

- William Carl Garner (1915 to 1998) was the Resident Engineer for Greer's Ferry Dam from the beginning of the dam construction in 1959 until his retirement in 1998. He organized the Greer's Ferry Lake Cleanup in 1969 which was later expanded nationwide to be the Federal Lands National Cleanup Day in 1985. In 1995 it was renamed the Carl Garner Federal Lands Cleanup Day.
- Proceed to Mossy Bluff trail on East side of Visitor Center. This will end at the overlook.
 Items of interest Balancing Rock, House Rock (big as a house), Stream and bridge,
 After the bridge, take the fork to the left for overlook of stream leading that leads to a
 waterfall. You are on top of Dog Rock. Before ascending stairs Mossy Bluff on the
 right dripping water. Ascend steps to overlook.

D Overlook View of Greers Ferry Dam

- Constructed 1959 to 1962. Dedicated by John F Kennedy on Oct 1 1963. Impounds
 Little Red River, 248 ft high and 1704 feet long. Houses two turbines capable of
 producing 96 MegaWatts of electricity.
- Proceed back on the road, not back down the trail.

 Bring your own Frisbee

 E Frisbee Golf Course Play one hole if you like. Be courteous of other players.
 - Proceed to the Waterfall. Start trail across from Frisbee Golf Course Parking Area.
 Takes you along a bluff above the creek. Back down to the bridge. Easiest way is to follow the trail over the hill down to Mossy Bluff trail, take a left and the bridge is about 200'. Shortcut is to follow the old trail to the left and go down the rocks. At one time there were stairs here.
 - Over the bridge follow the main trail a little and turn right off the trail to follow the creek.
 A little way down note **Dog Rock.** Keep going downhill to find the waterfall.

C Visitor Center Proceed back up the road to the visitor center. And cross the road.
