Registration

- **AB 506 Mandated Reporter Training** requires **ALL** *registered* adults and adult/parent *volunteers* attending Camporee overnight or for the entire weekend must complete this training before attending Camporee.
- **Live Scan background check** must be completed by **May 4th, 2023**.
- **Youth Protection Training (YPT)** must be current.
- No adults will be able to participate at Camporee without completion of **ALL** of the required training.
- Each Unit is responsible for collecting and verifying requirements and obtaining the certificates.

Click on either the Troop or Webelos link, sign in or create an account. All scouts will be registered under Youth Participants, including Youth Staff. Adults will be registered under Adult Participants. Non-Participating Adults "Parent Helpers" are only for adults NOT camping overnight and assisting your troop at various activities. **You must register as a Unit, not individual**, and there must be a minimum of 2 registered adults. You will receive an emailed invoice of your registration.

May 4th is the deadline to make changes or revise your current registration (i.e. adding or removing participants).

You only have the option to either pay the full amount at the completion of registration. The fee schedule is on the next page.

- All participating Troops must register online by **May 4, 2023**.
- ~~Webelos deadline is **May 4, 2022**.~~
- The last date to submit a revised registration is **May 4, 2023**
- There will be no refunds on overpayments after the registration deadline based on current council policy.

Diablo Sunrise District Camporee - 2023

1. All scouts and adults attending camporee **MUST** be registered with their Troop using the online registration process.
Note: Youth Staff must be registered with their troop.
2. Each Unit **MUST** have Medical Forms [A, B1 & B2](#) for **ALL** participants attending: scouts, adult leaders and parent volunteers. **Medical Forms should be kept in a binder with the Unit's Medic and be readily and easily available if needed for any medical issue.**
3. As needed, all registered adults will be asked to help with events, inspections, and logistics throughout the duration of Camp.
4. Scouts who wish to participate in events that involve Archery, Rifles, Tomahawks, or BB guns must bring **two** signed copies of the [Parental Firearms Permission](#) form.

Health & Safety

Camp Health Officer: Alison Overzet, RN

Key Points:

- ❑ **ALL** participants (scouts, adult leaders and volunteers) must have a current BSA Medical Forms part A, B1 & B2.
Every Unit will be responsible for keeping their medical forms in a binder and at their campsite, available at all times if needed by adult leadership or Camporee medical staff.
- ❑ **COVID-19 vaccination is highly recommended but not required.** No COVID-19 antigen or PCR test is required prior to camp. It is still recommend to ask the COVID-19 Pre-Event Medical Screening checklist prior to arrival at camp.
- ❑ **Masks are not required and considered optional**, but we encourage all to bring a mask and wear it according to your comfort level. We highly recommend that scouts sleeps head to toe with no more than two per tent.
- ❑ **Anyone experiencing a COVID-like symptoms at Camporee will be isolated and the parents of the scout will be contacted to pick-up their scout immediately. We are not equipped to isolate camper for more than an hour or two, nor do we have time to see if the symptoms will resolve.**
- ❑ Troops & Packs are expected to be self sufficient in treating minor injuries and accidents. Every Unit should bring their own medical kit.
 - ❑ The Camp Health Officer will be on-site during the weekend to address more serious issues if any should occur.
- ❑ Each Unit needs an adult **Medic** who:
 - ❑ Will have the medical forms for all participants, including non-participating adults..
 - ❑ Submit a printed Troop Medical Attestation & AB506 Compliance form to the Camp Health Officer during check-in
 - ❑ Is the primary contact on safety issues between Camporee Staff, your Unit, and your Scouts' families, if needed.
 - ❑ Each Unit must be prepared to clear any equipment from the Activity field in ten minutes or less in the event an Air Evacuation.
 - * If necessary, a helicopter would land on the Activity field
- ❑ Make sure to prepare for both cold weather and heat. Bring sun protection. Water flavoring is suggested because some campers avoid drinking the camp's water and seasonal allergies.

Order of the Arrow Yerba Buena Lodge Moluk Village



The Order of the Arrow was founded in 1915. Camp Director E. Urner Goodman and Assistant Camp Director Carroll A. Edson searched for a way to recognize select campers for their cheerful spirit in service at Treasure Island Scout Camp in the Delaware River near Philadelphia. As the popularity of the organization spread to other camps, local lodges attended the first national gathering called a Grand Lodge Meeting in 1921.

The Order of the Arrow was one of many camp honor societies that existed at local Scout camps across the country. As the years went on and more camps adopted the Order of the Arrow's program, it gained prominence and became part of the national Boy Scout program in 1934. By 1948, the OA, recognized as the BSA's national brotherhood of honor campers, became an official part of the Boy Scouts of America. Toward the end of the twentieth century, the OA expanded its focus to include conservation, high adventure, and service-leadership. Throughout the years, the Order of the Arrow has played an integral role in the program of Scouts BSA and in the community service its members contribute to their communities. To date, more than one million people have been members of the Order of the Arrow.

Presently, the Order of the Arrow consists of nearly 275 lodges which form approximately 40 sections in two geographical regions. Leadership positions and voting rights are restricted to members under the age of 21. Through the program, members live up to the ideals of brotherhood, cheerfulness, and service set forth by the founders.

What you need to know:

❑ For Drop Off:

- ❑ Arrival and departure from Camp is a time for everyone to be on high alert. There's lots of people and vehicle movement, and that's a recipe for trouble if people are not fully engaged and paying attention to ALL instructions from the parking staff.
- ❑ We urge Troops to bring Scout's backpacks with their equipment vehicle. **Scouts will hike in *without* their backpacks for safety.** The Los Mochos entry area at Mines Rd is very constrained which makes unloading Scouts with their backpacks very unsafe and therefore unacceptable.
- ❑ Scouts must be dropped off in the designated drop off location (see the diagram pg 30). Youth Staff will assist them for their hike into camp. Vehicles will need to leave the area immediately - no photo ops!
- ❑ Vehicles will not be allowed to drive into Camp just to do a drop off. Priority will be given to vehicles dropping off equipment, and any that do can expect to wait until after 7:30p before being able to drive out.

❑ Parking is very constrained:

- ❑ **Carpooling is a necessity.**
- ❑ All vehicles must back into parking spaces so they are facing out to ensure a quick and safe exit.
- ❑ The Manzanita drop off area for Troop camping gear accommodates only a few vehicles at a time. Troops need to consolidate their equipment into one vehicle if at all possible. This consolidation should take place before you arrive a camp, preferable at your gathering location before departure.
- ❑ Follow directions from the traffic & parking staff (yellow traffic jackets) when you arrive.

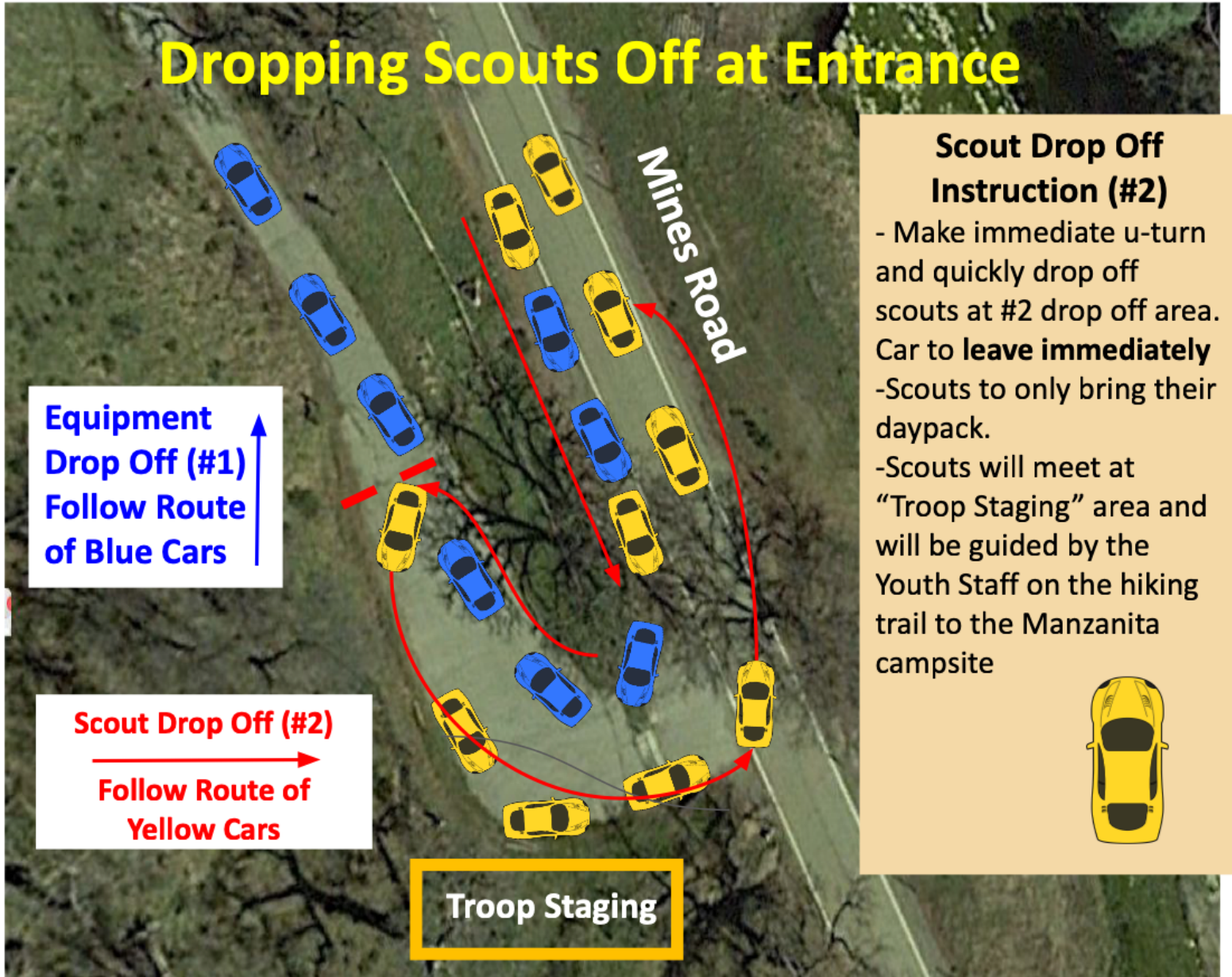
Camp Entrance

How to know when you've arrived.



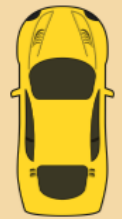
Friday Night Drop Off Procedure

- Scouts to only bring their daypack.
- Scouts will meet at "Troop Staging" area and will be guided by the Youth Staff on the hiking trail to the Manzanita campsite



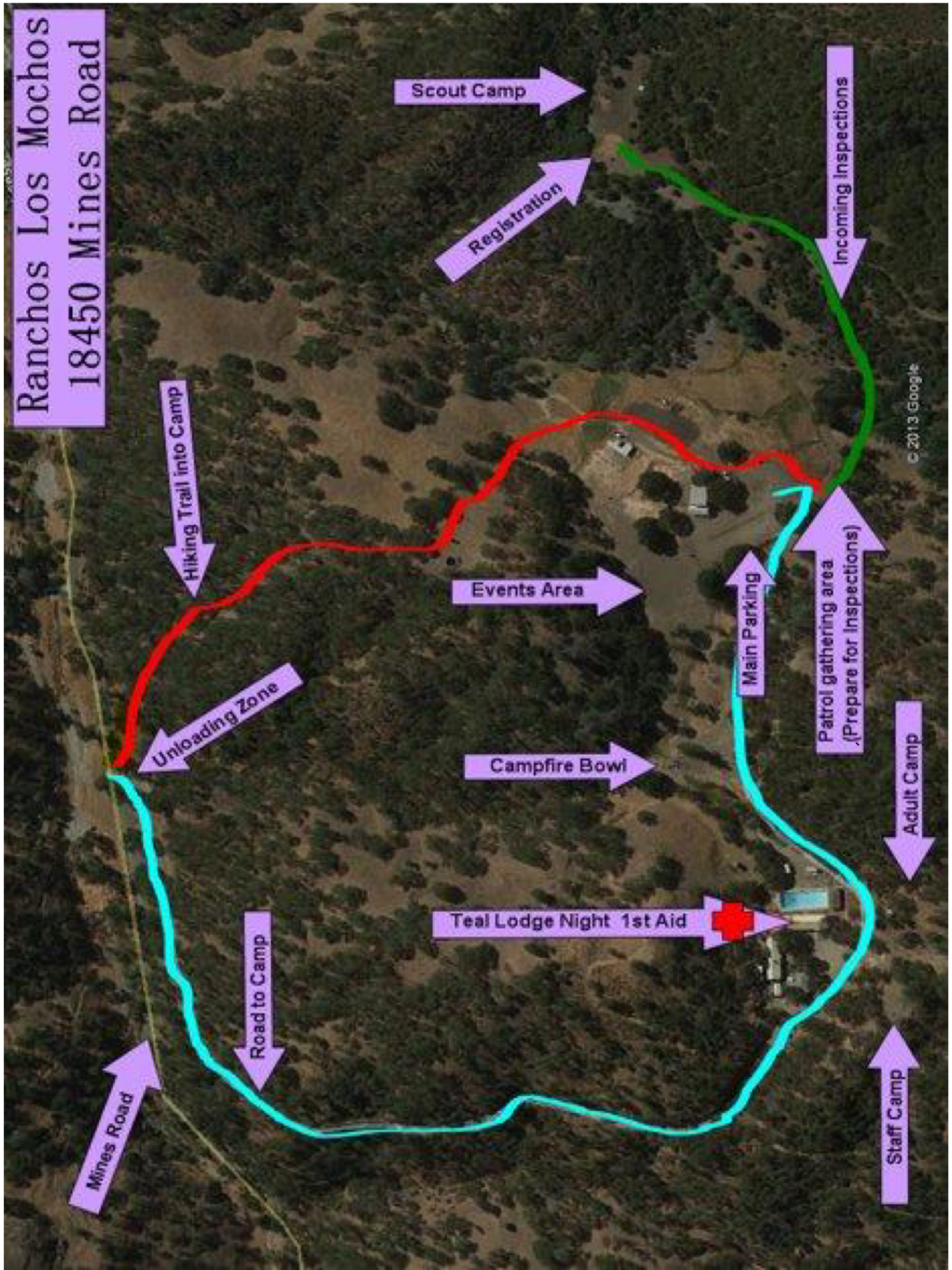
Equipment Drop Off & Overnight Parking (#1)

- Troop equipment, camping gear and supplies are dropped off at the Manzanita unloading zone.
- Troop **must be** at campsite to unload before vehicles will be allowed entry.
- Any vehicles staying overnight will park at the Main parking area.
- **\$10.00** per vehicle if parking overnight.
- **Free** if only dropping off equipment/supplies and departing campsite.



Driver must follow directions provided by the Traffic & Parking Staff

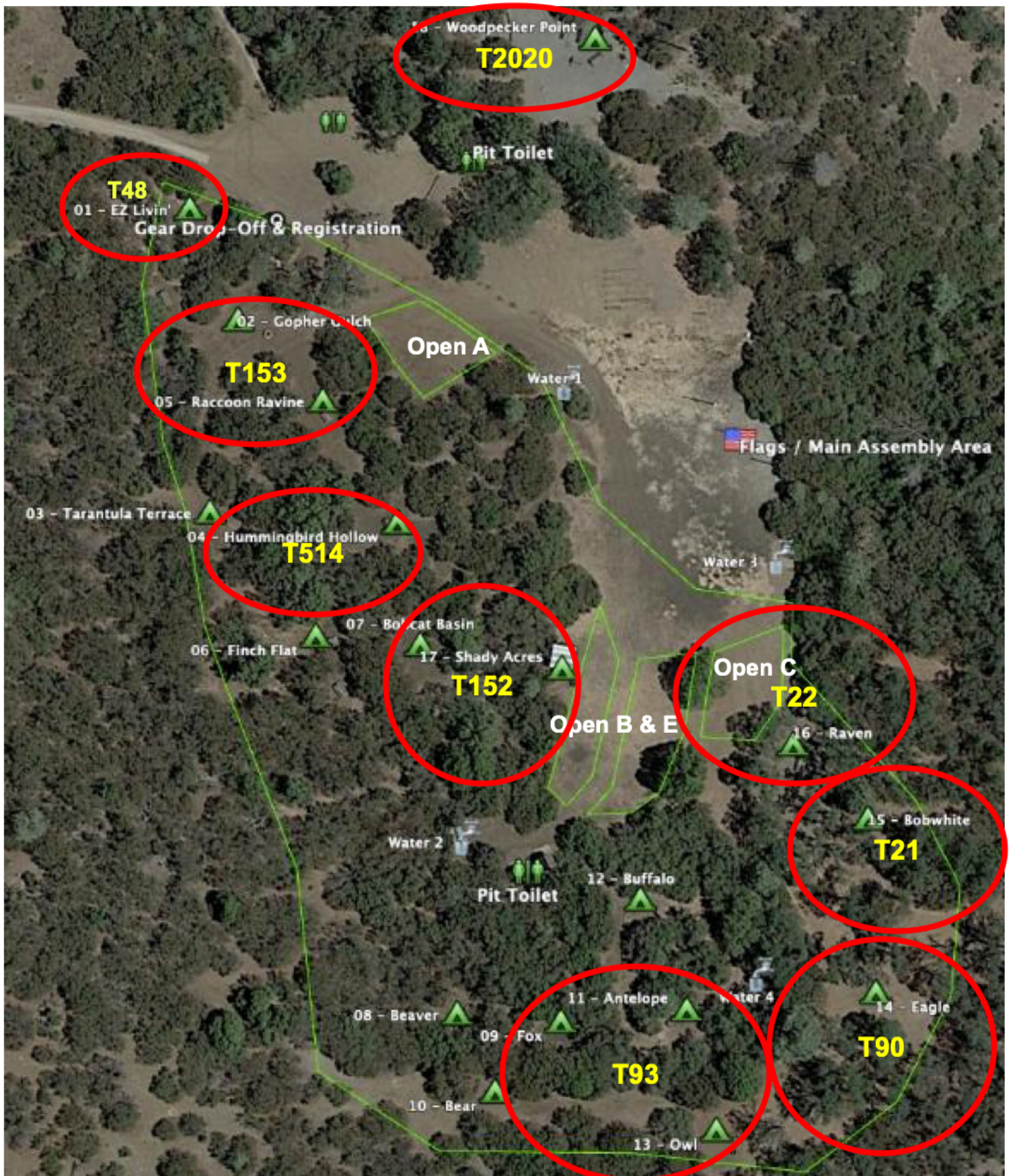
Campground Layout

Manzanita Campsites



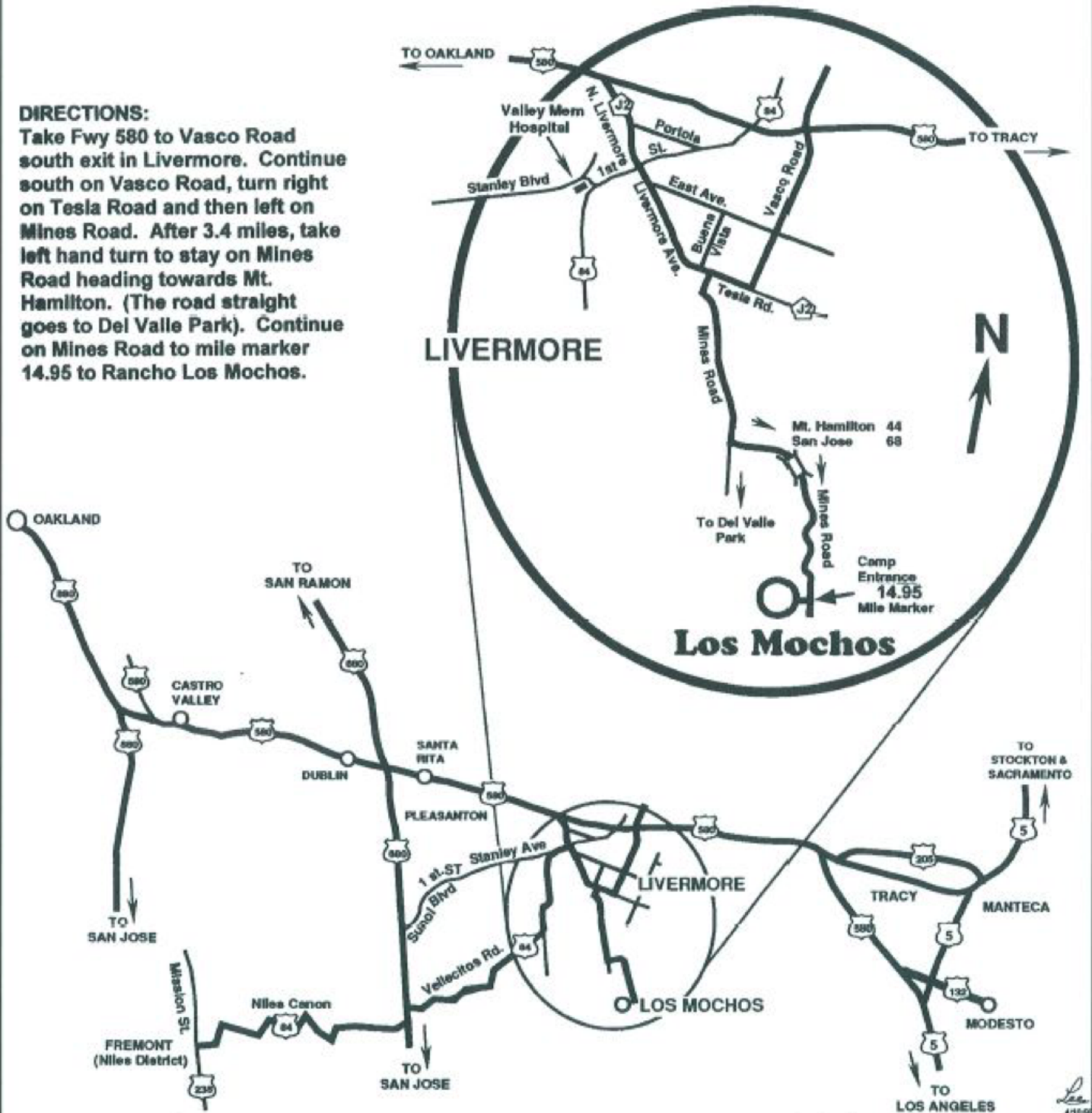

After 3.4 miles, take left hand turn to stay on Mines Road heading towards Mt. Hamilton. (The road straight goes to Del Valle Park). Continue on Mines Road to mile marker 14.95 to Rancho Los Mochos.
