

FROM THE NORTH

- From the 55 Freeway exit Chapman Ave. and go East.
- Continue on Chapman Ave., passing Jamboree Road. (NOTE: Chapman Ave. has now become Santiago Canyon Road.)
- Continue on Santiago Canyon Road past the 241 and 261 Toll Roads.
- Continue PAST Irvine Lake. DO NOT turn into Irvine Lake.
- Make the next Left.
- Look for the orange PICNIC signs to Lakeview Park.

FROM THE SOUTH

- From the 5 Freeway exit El Toro Road and go North.
- Continue on El Toro Road until it becomes Santiago Canyon Rd.
- Pass under a small bridge, and prepare to turn at the next Right.
- Look for the orange PICNIC signs to Lakeview Park.

It's the Law!

Scouts and Scouters and all Attendees are expected to adhere to these standards. Please make sure that we are cleaning up after ourselves. If you see trash, be scout-like and pick it up. Be respectful of others and their property. Regardless if it's your units property, another units property, or Decorations for the event please do not mistreat it. Please do not attack or damage the props in the haunted hallway. Lastly lets all do our part to make sure that the restrooms are clean. There will be designated restrooms for boys and girls. Cub o Ree follows the Boy Scouts of America Policy concerning the use of alcoholic beverages, drugs or other mindaltering substances. Adults will be restricted to smoking within the parking lot area only, not in campsites. There shall be NO alcoholic beverages, drugs or other controlled substances present at or consumed during Cub o Ree. Participants that violate this Policy or who become disruptive to others will be required to leave the event.




Background

The lake is formed by the Santiago Dam at the lake's north end, which was built between 1929 and 1931, and was originally called the Santiago Reservoir. The dam was built by the Irvine Company and the Serrano Water District (known as Serrano Irrigation District at the time); it is now owned by the Serrano Water District and the Irvine Ranch Water District and operated by Serrano Water District in conjunction with OC Parks. The lake provides drinking water to Villa Park and some parts of Orange, and provides supplementary irrigation water to neighboring ranches.


Stocked with largemouth bass, catfish, trout, and crappie, the lake fishery opened to the public in 1941. The land around the lake is owned by the Irvine Company, which leases the fishing, boating, and camping concessions to SWD Recreation Inc.

Registration and Fees



Registration is available online at http://www.ocbsa.org. Most forms of credit cards are accept-ed. Each participant must be registered and pay all fees online. The registration deadline is October 24th. Youth participants under 18 years old must be accompanied by an adult parent or guardian that is also registered for the event. Scouts who participate in shooting sports must bring a signed release forms for those activities. On check in each participant will be given a wrist band to show they cleared for activities.

Medical Forms for each PARTICIPANT will be collected at check-in.



Arrival & Check In/Check Out

Unit check-in would be preferred, but individuals may check in as well. Check in is available on Friday between 5PM to 8 PM on Friday and will reopen Saturday morning at 7:30 AM.. The Registration Station located near at the top of the Camp near the Troop Camping. Arrival times are between 4:00PM and 10:00PM Friday. Late arrivals are accepted with prior notification to event staff. Check-out is Sunday @ noon.

If you need to leave the Camp Early or leave for a period of time during the event you must notify the Registration booth with the Unit, the Individuals Names, Time of Check Out, and Expected Return time (if applicable).

At final checkout your medical and consent forms will be returned to your Unit

Parking

Carpooling is strongly encouraged. All vehicles must be parked in designated parking area. Parking is not permitted at campsites and there is no driving to the campsites. Participants may drop off their gear at the designated drop off location, and immediately return their vehicle to the designated parking area. Unattended vehicles at will be towed or moved to a safe location for safety reasons. Drivers should keep their keys with them at all times. Per BSA camp rules, driving in camp is prohibited except during check-in and check-out only. Please leave the vehicle Identification sheet on the window in case we need to contact the vehicle owner.

Campfires and Open Flame

No Open Flame or campfires are permitted at this time. Cooking equipment, lanterns/lighting with open flame or pressurized fuel are permitted at this event.

Meals


Meals are not provided to attendees as part of the camp. Individuals are recommended to discuss arrange-ments with their units or bring their own food.


Please bring coolers to store food, bags may attract unwanted attention for near by wild life. Additional storage will not be provided.


Remember do not eat or store food in your tents.

Footwear

Shoes need to be close toed, that can be tied or strapped (Velcro) to stay on the foot. They can be a boot or a shoe, but it's recommended to bring something that can provide ankle support. Sandals, Slip-ons, and Croc's do not provide that kind of support. Our youth are going to want to run and play, and as much as we will remind them, "No Running" there will be some times where it will happen. There are also hills and divots in the ground where footing isn't the greatest either. Tying the shoes with an ankle lock can be helpful to give better support.








Hygiene Kits

It's Highly Recommended that families bring their own Hygiene Kits, to help maintain cleanliness. Near the camp sites there will be Porta Potties and while there will be a Cleaning on Saturday we recommend supplementing your Kits with some Items that may come in handy if the supplies in the Portas run low or become compromised.

First Aid

First Aid Staff will be available on a 24-hour basis during the entire event. They are outfitted with a wide range of emergency equipment. Minor incidents will be handled on-site, while major or life-threatening emergencies will be reported immediately to local authorities. Parents or guardians will be contacted immediately in response to any major incidents. Packs are encouraged to bring their own first aid kits with them for their campsites.

Youth Protection

Youth Protection remains our top priority. Cub-o- Ree follows BSA's policies on Youth Protection, scouts must be in Buddy Groups and there should never be One-on-One contact between youth and adults. For more information please refer to the following link.

Prohibited Items

Do not bring alcoholic beverages, drugs, any type of liquid fueled device (White gas, Kerosene, etc.), play or real weapons, firearms, fireworks or pyrotechnics of any sort. Since this is an outdoor Scouting event, no radios, electronic games, tablets, computers, and other electronic equipment will be allowed during the event. Adults are also discouraged from bringing or using these devices as an example to the Scouts.

Campsite Clean-Up & Trash

Campsites must be inspected by staff prior departure of the members in your pack. Participants are responsible to "Leave No Trace" at their campsites. Pick up all trash, remove all personal gear, and ask for a campsite inspection at the Registration Station before leaving. Units are expected to hull out trash so please pack

lightly.






Fishing Derby -

Irvine Lake Regulations

- No license required. California Department of Fish and Wildlife fishing regulations regarding fish limits apply.
- Additionally, the following fishing regulations apply:
- · Five fish limit.
- Bass is catch-and-release only.
- · Catfish larger than 24 inches must be released.
- One rod per person maximum,
- · Approved baits only (worms, mackerel, dough baits, or artificial lure). No live bait allowed (except worms).
- Bass (catch-and-release), catfish, carp, bluegill, crapple and sturgeon are in the lake. The lake will not be stocked.
- Shoreline fishing only. No boats, float tubes, paddleboards, kayaks, bodily contact or entry or other recreational activities available.
- Bait and light snacks available to purchase,
- No alcohol permitted.
- No access to Irvine Ranch Open Space.
- Do not stop or park anywhere along Santiago Canyon Road. The entrance gate will not open until 7 a.m. Anyone stopped or parked along Santiago Canyon Road prior to the opening will be subject to citation. Thank you for your cooperation with regards to the safety of everyone on the road. Please plan your drive accordingly.
- No camping is allowed.
- No RC boats or drones allowed,
- No amplified music is allowed.
