Thank you for your class registration. We're excited to have you aboard!

ALERT: Due to the Covid-19 pandemic we are taking special precautions to ensure the safety of our staff and campers this year. Please be aware that all campers will be required to wear a face mask while on property and must have a backup ready (bring 2 masks). Campers are asked to keep at a safe distance from individuals at all times and will need to bring their own refillable water bottles to camp (we have a refillable station on site). All of our camp staff will be wearing masks and ensuring that campers follow safety measures and protocols. When you arrive our staff will help guide you through our security checkpoints from the comfort of your car. You will be asked to stay in your vehicle for pick up and drop off and we will not have spots for parking. All campers will receive a temperature and health screening before being allowed to enter camp. After the health screening campers will join their counselor and group. We know this is a difficult time and appreciate your help and cooperation. Please also be advised that our office will remain closed to the public. Course Description:

Scouts discover that they are already citizens of the world. How good a world citizen each person is depends on his/her willingness to understand and appreciate the values, traditions, and concerns of people in other countries. Compare the duties, rights and obligations of citizens in the United States to those of citizens in other countries. Learn what types of governments exist, how international law differs from national law and why countries must cooperate to thrive economically. Study world events in relation to security, health, values, geography, natural resources and climate.

Below is information you'll find valuable in helping you prepare for the class:

- Be sure your camper picks up a syllabus from the instructor on the first day of class and reviews the syllabus with parents/guardians.
- Most of the merit badge requirements and course information are covered and discussed in class, however we do also assign homework for certain classes.
- Families may check in at the pedestal directory/site map at the Building C staircase or visit the NSB office upstairs.
- CLOSED TOED SHOES are required at ALL TIMES. No sandals, Crocs, or roller shoes.
- Electronics and other valued items should be left at HOME.
- Campers can carry their belongings with them to class; Sea Base is not responsible for any damaged or lost items.
- Snacks/drinks are recommended if your camper is at Sea Base for an extended period of time.
- Campers are not permitted to leave the Sea Base without a parent/guardian.
- Campers should label all personal belongings.
- Scouts must bring blue cards on the last day of class. Instructors will not hold blue cards for students before the last day of class.

This highly interactive and exploratory class is open to and enjoyable for all youth (girls and boys, ages 11-17), not just Boy Scouts.

Note: Orange County Council, Boy Scouts is dedicated to the safety of all youth who participate in our programs. Consequently, Scouts must be able to repeat back, in their own words, an accurate understanding of all safety instructions. Scouts who are unable or unwilling to do so, may not be eligible to participate. (Youth who are working on their English language skills can decide to bring an interpreter but may still not be eligible to participate.)
