Code of Conduct for Adult Volunteers

**I agree to serve as a Volunteer, in a manner consistent with the Scout Oath and Law and Twilight Camp Code of Conduct and National Standards for Cub Scout Twilight Camps. I also agree with the terms below:**

- \*Have FUN! Make sure the Cubs are having FUN! The 1st priority of every adult volunteer is the Cubs. With your help & support this Camp exists and operates for them in a safe manner.**
- \* Follow all Camp Rules.** The Twilight Camp 2026 Training & Safety manual is located on the registration page. Please take time to read that document.
- \* An adult must sign in and out each day with their child's den leader. (You will be provided with a form)
- \* Everyone **MUST** have closed toes and heeled shoes. Even if you are just dropping off or picking up your cub.
- \* No Pets at Camp.
- \* Everyone brings dinner. **Do Not** share food or feed others, please make sure your scout knows this. \*Watch allergies. **Please, No Nuts** at Camp. (If someone doesn't have dinner, then send them to the camp director, as we will have extra dinners.)
- \* Have a water bottle.
- \* Have sunscreen & bug spray applied.
- \* Everyone needs to have their camp T-shirt, a hat, dinner and backpack each day. Have their items labeled with their name. Leaders may want to bring a wagon.
- \* Use the Buddy System, always. (2 youth, same gender goes together when leaving the den)
- \* Adults agree to notify Twilight Camp Medical Staff/Camp Director promptly of all medical or difficult situations with a Scout." If anyone is hurt in even the smallest way, they **MUST** see the nurse.
- \* An Adult shall Not punish a Scout. If a child needs a time out, use your envelope "Please bring this envelope to the Camp Health Officer" discretely to ensure that there is minimal to no impact to the camp experience for the Scouts. Follow all directions from Camp Directors and Program Directors. Make sure all Scouts are following the Scout Oath and Law. Remember to treat others the way you want to be treated. Absolutely, no name calling or bullying of any kind.
- \*I am a registered BSA member and hold a current Youth Protection Certificate.**
