Directions

The 2026 Dutch-Oven Cooking Competition/ Cub Scout Family Camp weekend will be held at Camp Discovery. Camp Discovery is located in Red Bluff, CA. From Interstate 5, take the Antelope Boulevard exit and head east. Turn right on Sale Lane and drive approximately 2 miles until you reach Camp Discovery.

Parking

Although the campsite has a developed road, all vehicles must park in the designated area (outside of the gate) after unloading. At 8:30 pm on Friday night, we will be closing the gate till Sunday morning. If you get there after 8:30 on Friday or arrive on Saturday, you will have to carry everything in.

Weather

This event will occur rain or shine. Come prepared for rain, and hope for mild sun. STAY HYDRATED AND COVERED!!

Available Facilities

The site is at a developed campground. Adequate sanitary facilities (toilets) are located around the area. However, each unit will have to consider:

- **Water:**
 - There are water spigots, but you will need containers.
- **Garbage:**
 - Collect, contain, and remove all of your own and any other you find.
- **Campfire:**
 - We will have a central campfire at the campground fire pit.

- **Firewood:**

- You must bring your own if you plan to have a campfire in your camping site; however... You must verify whether wood fires are allowed this year in sites outside the campfire bowl.

- **Sanitary Facilities:**

- Toilets will be located around the campsite. Please encourage their use. Handwash stations should be provided by units or families.

- **Cabins:**

- For Cub Families **ONLY**, You can use a Rustic Screen Cabin if you pay the extra \$10. There are 11 Cabins, and each cabin can hold up to 8 people. Families can share cabins to fill them. These cabins are enclosed cabins with a partial mesh wall, each cabin has plywood bunk beds that hold up to 8 people.

Webelos/Arrow of Lights with Troops

Webelos/Arrow of Light scouts can join a troop for the weekend and stay with them as another scout. If a Webelos/Arrow of Light scout would like to stay with a Troop, they would have to have a buddy with them within 2 years of age and their own tent. For sign-up, they would only pay \$5 for the weekend.

Camping & Activities

All circuit games will be for fun, having no official scoring or prizes

Eagle Scout Court of Honor

On Saturday, we will be having Matthew Rilea's Eagle Scout Court of Honor. This will run from about 11:30 am - 3 pm. At the beginning, we will have adults cooking hot dogs for the whole camp as well as all guests for the Court of Honor.

Camp Museum

Each troop/pack will decorate their campsite with different aspects of the Chuck Wagon Theme. Decorating time is finished when the cooking starts (refer to the schedule). While the cooking is happening, judges will come around to everyone's campsite and judge their display. Points from this will go into Scout Spirit. **(Decorations will not be provided)**

Campsite Inspection

Each Troop (Packs can participate if they want to) will hold themselves up to the expectations of the campsite inspection checklist. During Free time, selected OA members will come around to each campsite and do a campsite inspection, referring to the checklist. The checklist is out of 115 points, and your score from inspection goes into spirit. The Checklist is in the leader's guide at the bottom.

Cub Scout Activities

Throughout the day, we will have a variety of activities that Cub Scouts can participate in. These include: Backyard Fishing, Slingshots, and Rope Making, with a possibility of more. During the running of these events, older scouts will be encouraged to help and possibly run some of these events.

Important Note

Remember, this event (just like Camp-o-ree and Klondike) is planned and put on by your local OA Chapter (Wintun Chapter of the Pacific Summit Lodge). Everything is handled by this small group of scouts and their adult advisors. If you (or a youth you know of) have been inducted into the OA but haven't been to a meeting in a while (or maybe ever), don't be embarrassed... no shame...just contact one of us to find out how easy it is to come back.

“Dutch Oven” Cooking

A big focus of this event is to bring people together and get back into the swing of camping...and to learn a few skills. There will be 2 different Rounds of judging this year: Cub Scouts and Scouts.

To that end, there are only a few rules

- 1) Cook part of your meal using cast iron - Griddle, Dutch oven, skillet, pan, etc...
- 2) Food safety protocols must be followed (proper refrigeration, cross-contamination controls, etc.)
- 3) For extra points - decorate your area to the theme of Chuck Wagon

Prizes

Even though the day is full of fun, it is still a cookoff, and there are still prizes.

There are 4 categories of prizes for Scouts and Cub Scouts; the different categories are: Best Main Dish, Best Dessert, People's Choice, and Spirit!

Adult Dishes won't get judged, but feel free to make a dish for potluck at the end of the night. Adults can help the cub scouts make their dishes but don't do it for them.

◆◆ Campsite Cleanliness

- ___ Trash is picked up and properly disposed of
- ___ No food left out or unsecured
- ___ Fire pit clean and cold (If there is one)
- ___ Gear neatly stored and out of walkways
- ___ No evidence of wildlife attractants
- ___ Patrol Tents together with a sign labeling patrol campsite (if multiple Patrols)

◆◆ Tents & Sleeping Area

- ___ Tents are set up properly and staked down
- ___ Tent flaps zipped when not in use
- ___ Sleeping bags and gear inside tents, off the ground

◆◆ Kitchen & Cooking Area

- ___ Cooking area clean and organized
- ___ Wash station set up and **labeled** (hot wash, cold rinse, sanitizing)
- ___ Food stored in sealed containers or bear box
- ___ Fire tools and stove fuel safely stored
- ___ Patrol duty roster visible and up-to-date

◆◆ Safety & Sanitation

- ___ First aid kit accessible and stocked
- ___ Water source clean and marked
- ___ Handwashing station present and functional
- ___ Axe yard clearly marked and safe

◆◆ Scout Spirit & Extras

- ___ Patrol flag displayed
- ___ Distinctable Entrance
- ___ Camp gadgets (e.g. clothesline, tripod) safely built and used
- ___ Roped off Campsites
- ___ Decorated Campsites (up to 5 extra points)
