Eagle Achievement Camp – FAQ

Logistics & Timing

Q: When is drop-off and pick-up?

A: Drop-off is Sunday, June 29 at 2:00 PM. Pick-up is Thursday, July 3 at 10:00 AM.

Q: Can we pick up scouts at camp instead of using the bus?

A: Yes, pick-up from camp is allowed. Just update your plans in BlackPug and notify the team via chs@svmbc.org.

Q: What if my scout arrives late due to another event?

A: Late arrivals are okay by 6pm—just email the staff in advance to coordinate.

Transportation

Q: Where and when does the bus depart?

A: Bus departs June 29 at 8:30 AM from 1900 The Alameda, San Jose.

Q: Are scouts required to take the bus?

A: No. You may choose to drop off or pick up your scout yourself.

Q: Can friends or troopmates ride the same bus?

A: Yes, scouts from the same troop can be placed together on the bus.

Merit Badges & Classes

Q: How many merit badges can my scout take?

A: Four badges in blocks 1, 2, 3, 4

Q: Will they get help with prerequisites?

A: Scouts are expected to complete prerequisites ahead of camp. Contact <u>19chs49@gmail.com</u> for help.

Q: Are there smaller badges offered during free time?

A: Yes—badges like Fingerprinting and others will be offered between Block 4 and dinner.

Q: Can scouts earn partials toward badges like Camping?

A: Yes—rappelling will count if completed. No for 1,000 foot hike.

Q: Do they need blue cards or Scoutmaster approval?

A: No physical blue cards needed. Everything is tracked digitally via BlackPug.

Medical & Camp Forms

Q: Is a doctor's signature required for Form C?

A: Yes.

Q: Can we upload physical A/B/C forms?

A: Yes—upload Form C into CampDoc; complete A/B digitally in CampDoc.

Q: When will we get CampDoc info?

A: It will be emailed shortly before camp.

Q: Can medication be kept with the scout?

A: No, with the exception of inhalers and EpiPens. It may be kept with the adult leader or in the health lodge.

Housing, Gear, and Food

Q: How many scouts per tent?

A: Two is recommended; three is possible if within two years of age.

Q: Can my scout tent with friends?

A: Yes—if within a two-year age range.

Q: Can my scout tent with same-gender siblings?

A: Yes—no matter the age gap.

Q: Will dietary needs be accommodated?

A: Email 19chs49@gmail.com at least one week prior to camp.

Q: Is the camp nut-free?

A: Yes, except for the Trading Post.

Q: Can scouts bring and refrigerate personal food or drinks?

A: Yes, if for medical or dietary reasons, label items clearly. A fridge and microwave are available.

Q: What should my scout wear?

A: Class A uniform for travel and flags; Class B is okay afterward.

Q: Will there be a packing list?

A: Yes, it will be emailed before camp.

Activities & Schedule

Q: Will there be evening activities?

A: Yes, open programs (like climbing/rappelling) will be available after dinner.

Q: Will there be a swim test?

A: Yes—on Sunday, even if scouts bring a form, due to elevation and water temp.

Q: Is the Clavey trip offered?

A: No Clavey trip during Eagle Week.

Communication & Systems

Q: What is BlackPug?

A: The system used for registration, merit badge sign-ups, and completion tracking.

Q: How do I access BlackPug or CampDoc?

A: You registered through BlackPug. CampDoc info will be sent out soon.

Q: Will we get photos from camp?

A: Yes, photos will be shared after camp.

Q: Will merit badge completions be uploaded to Scoutbook?

A: No. A BlackPug report will be sent—you can use it to update Scoutbook.
