How to Get to Camp

Most families will be traveling from the Denver Metro area so we will start from the Denver Technology Center (DTC) on I-25. [22799 North Elbert Road, Box 97, Elbert, Colorado 80106](#)

- 1) Travel South until you approach Castle Rock, CO.
- 2) Take Exit 184
- 3) Turn left at stop light to Founders Parkway.
- 4) Take Founders Parkway to traffic light (Highway 86 intersection).
- 5) Turn left at stop light onto Highway 86 and follow Highway 86 through Franktown and traffic signal at Parker Road.
- 6) Continue on Highway 86 through Elizabeth until you come to Elbert Highway on your right (just before the town of Kiowa).
- 7) Turn on Elbert Highway and continue through the town of Elbert.
- 8) Turn left (east) into Peaceful Valley Scout Ranch at the 2nd Entrance Gate 1 for Camp Cris Dobbins.



Accommodations & Programs

We will have an array of activities, new Cub Scout Families will get to experience fun and exciting games like Field Games, Archery, BB's, Slingshots, Climbing, Rappelling, Obstacle Courses, Bouncy Houses, Carnival Games, and much more! This year, there will be no rotations. All programs will be open for your choosing, so you can feel free to explore all the options we have and spend time on the activities you enjoy the most!

The night will close with a closing campfire at McKenzie's Range with songs and skits. This is one of the few events that have an actual bonfire at McNeil Scout Ranch! Once the fire is concluded we will be having smores using the fire! (protip: bring a good stick for marshmallows, we'll bring the rest of the supplies!)

Mealtime & Chuck Wagon Dinner

Families will be responsible for providing their own food during the event. We suggest bringing a cooler to store your meals as there will be no storage space available to store food at the Kephart Dining Hall.

A '**Chuck Wagon Dinner**' is available to each person for an additional \$5 per person. Chuck Wagon Dinners must be purchased no later than **5 days prior** to the event date.

Facility & Sleeping Arrangements

Families attending will need to provide their own tents and sleeping bags. Each campsite will have a pit latrine equipped with a hand washing station, showers & toilets.

There is a Shower House building located near some of the campsites.

Check-In/ Check-Out Process

Check-In

- 1) Check-In will open at the Headquarters Building on Saturday morning at 8:00 AM and end at 9:30 AM.
- 2) Every person that is *Camping Saturday Night* will need to have a completed [**BSA Medical Health Form Parts A & B**](#) which does not require any doctor's signature.

*Please note that you will need to provide a physical copy at Check-In. We will keep it **so please do not provide us with the original.** Digital Copies are **NOT** recommended.*

- 3) You will be given your Campsite Location as well as a schedule & map.
- 4) Then you will be shown to your campsite, where you can drop off your camping gear.

All vehicles must always be parked in the Main Parking area unless specifically authorized by Camp Management. Equipment can be delivered to the campsites however vehicles must return to the Main Parking Area before beginning to set up your camping equipment.

Check-Out

- 1) Check-Out will begin at Your Campsite on Sunday morning at 8:00 AM and will end at 10:00 AM.
- 2) Every person on each campsite will need to search around their camping area for trash or non-natural items. Trash bags can be laid on the side of the nearest main road for the Event Staff to pick up.
- 3) Vehicles will be allowed to travel to the campsites to collect gear. There will be event staff will be placed around to ensure traffic flow is maintained.

- 6) Day Pack
- 7) Sunscreen
- 8) Small First Aid Kit
- 9) Ice Cooler for Meal Storage



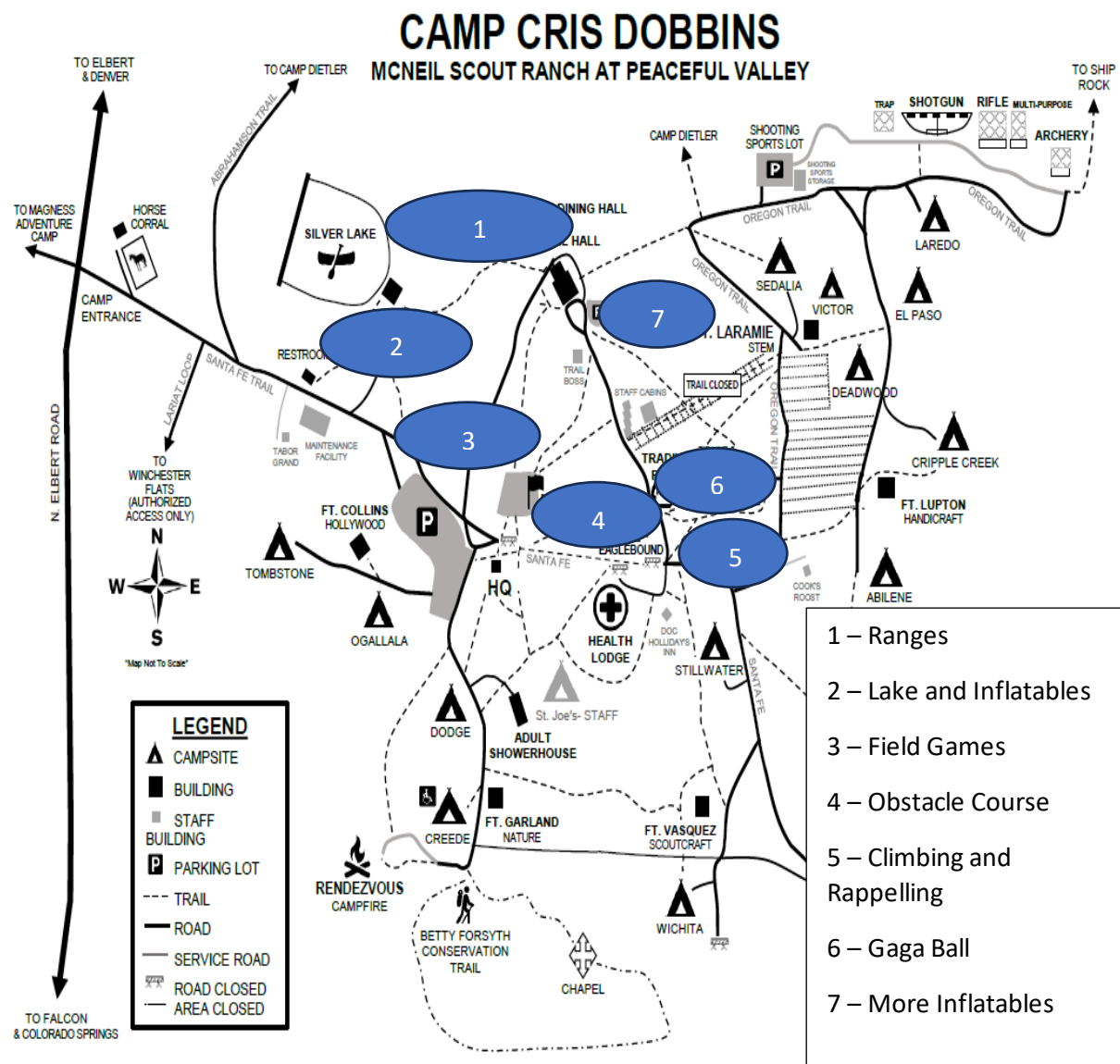
Participant Schedule of Events
