Who Should Attend?

Wood Badge meets the advanced leadership needs of all Scouters, particularly unit level Scouters, such as Cubmasters and Den Leaders, Scoutmasters and Assistants, Venturing Crew Advisors, Committee Chairs and Members. Additionally, Scouters serving at district and council levels can achieve greater effectiveness through Wood

Qualifications: Badge.

To attend a Wood Badge course, you must:

1. Be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America, and complete Youth Protection Training.
2. Have completed the basic training courses for your Scouting position. Most required training is available online at my.scouting.org.
3. Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment. All participants are required to provide the Annual Health and Medical Record form {Parts A, B, & C} completed within one year of the course start date.
