#### **ELEVATION & WEATHER:**

The camp sits at 6,500ft. Daytime temperatures in September typically range from the mid-60's to low 70's, while nighttime temperatures can drop to the 30's and 40's. It's normally sunny, but occasional rain showers can occur. The air is dry and hydration is essential.

#### WILDLIFE:

Due to the size of this gathering, we do not expect many animals will stay in the area. There are bears, squirls, and mice, so please keep your campsite clean and pick up your garbage. Rattlesnakes are also around. Please be aware of your surroundings.

The medical officer will be located in the A-Frame Building at the front of camp.

You won't be able to drive to your campsite, but an equipment shuttle will be available from the parking lot. Please have your gear in easily packable and transportable form. Many people will hike their gear to their campsite, which is uphill.
