#### \*\*1. What is Cub Camp?

• Cub Camp is an exciting outdoor adventure designed for Cub Scouts, typically aged 6 to 10. It's an opportunity for Cubs to engage in fun activities, learn new skills, and strengthen their bonds with fellow Scouts.

#### \*\*2. When and where is Cub Camp held?

## \*\*3. Who can attend Cub Camp?

• Cub Camp is open to registered Cub Scouts and their families. Scouts who are Tigers as of 6/1/2024 going into 1<sup>st</sup> grade can come but must come with a parent or guardian. Lion Scouts who are new Scouts going into Kindergarten are not eligible to come to day camp.

# \*\*4. What activities are offered at Cub Camp?

• Cub Camp provides a diverse range of activities, including nature hikes, crafts, games, archery, and campfire ceremonies. Specific activities may vary each year.



#### \*\*5. Pack Incentives

If a registered adult comes and volunteers for the week of Day as a
Camp Den Leader the Scout can attend Day Camp for Free. In addition,
for every Adult that the Pack sends as a Camp Den Leader the Pack can
receive up \$50 off per Scout per Den Leader up to 3 Den Leaders. (Exp
Pack 201 sends two Camp Leaders that pack receives \$100 off for each
Scout that attends Day Camp. \* Please note the discount is issued in a
refund after the week happened assuring leader participation in the
week.

#### \*\*6. Is there a cost to attend Cub Camp?

 Yes, there is a registration fee to cover the cost of facilities, meals, and program materials. The cost is \$295 for Day Camp and \$500 for a Resident week. Financial assistance may be available through camperships.
