Dear Future Counselor in Training,

Welcome to your 2024 summer camp leadership experience at June Norcross Webster Scout Reservation. If you are new to the CIT world, I assure you that you will have a great time. Wherever you are placed throughout the week, you will receive instruction in teaching that will significantly improve your leadership skills. In Scouting America, the emphasis is on leadership. This emphasis is what every CIT will be getting. Whether you are here for one week, two weeks, or the whole summer, leadership will be very important and stressful at all times.

A CIT is the kind of person who is willing to step up to the plate when asked and will help anybody in need. They are very caring about their surroundings, fellow CITs and scouts alike. They are also professional at all times. Misconduct around scouts, scoutmasters, or staff will not be tolerated, and a professional attitude will be expected. CITs are not staff! But they are not campers either, placing them in the middle of the spectrum. The following guidelines are included to help you realize what you need to do to potentially become part of the most incredible camp staff in the Connecticut Rivers Council:

1. **RESPECT** Everybody – This means that you have to be nice to everybody. Just because you are a CIT does not mean that you are better than anybody.
2. **Be SMART**—Making the right decisions can be tough, but if you think them through the first time, there will be no problems.
3. **Be on time**—90% of success is being on time. Being five minutes early shows that you care and want to be there. (I need to see this!)
4. **Have FUN** – the greatest thing about being at camp for one week or the whole summer is that you are AT CAMP! Enjoy it; the week will go by way too quickly, and you will wish you could do it again.

The Camp will provide a hat, a Polo shirt, and a neckerchief. You should bring your class A, which is not required; most CITs will have Scout Shorts and Socks.
