Ammunition at the club will be restricted to 12, 16, 20, 28 gauge or 410 caliber shot shells with a maximum load of one and one-eighth (1 1/8) ounce of shot, and a maximum shot size of seven and one-half (7 1/2) and a maximum of 3 drams of powder. Please contact us about any ammo concerns for the shoot.
