# Creating a Culture of Safety



Scouts and their parents expect all Boy Scouts of America activities to be conducted safely. To ensure the safety of participants, the Boy Scouts of America expects leaders to use the four points of SAFE when delivering the Scouting program.



## Adults in Camp (New for 2019)

- Must have 2 adult leaders in camp 21-years old or over in camp at all times.
- There must be a registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over in every unit serving females.
- To assist units with adult leader supervision 2 adults from each unit may attend camp at no cost



## Adults in Camp (New for 2022)

- Old North State Council Policy
- Effective June 1, 2022, any adult who spends at least one night while accompanying a Scouting unit to a long-term camp activity, sponsored by the Old North State Council or any of its agents, must be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America with a completed criminal background check and unexpired Youth Protection Training certificate.
- Suggest you submit BSA adult leader applications by April 1
- Verified through the Unit Aging Report submitted during the 12-dayout meeting




- Internet-based Mass Communication Tool
- Allows for communication to multiple stakeholders
  - Adult Leaders
  - Scouts
  - Staff
  - Family members back home





- Broadcast Alerts Send one-way messages with important information
- Read Confirmation Alerts see who has received alerts immediately
- Surveys Confirm status and engage campers with two-way communication features

















- Data entered into Black Pug must be accurate
  - Camper cell
  - Camper email
  - Parent 1 cell
  - Parent 1 email
  - Emergency contact 1 cell
  - Emergency contact 1 email





- Submit Health Forms via the internet
- Still in development phase



#### Pre-event Medical Screening

- Reduces introduction of communicable disease into the summer camp setting
- MUST be completed on Sunday morning prior to the Scout leaving home to meet at unit's rendezvous location
- If Scout cannot pass the pre-event medical screening, Scout should stay home
- First document collected upon arrival at camp on Sunday
- Useless to complete once in camp parking lot
  - Already introduced pathogen into camp population



#### **BSA Health Forms**

- New Form (Print date of 2019) REQUIRED
- Required by everyone
- Must be completed annually
- Everyone has a re-check on Sunday at camp
- Physical clinic
  - Saturday, March 26 Greensboro
  - Saturday, June 8 Cherokee
  - \$25



## Pre-Camp Swim Checks

- Reduce anxiety during Sunday check-in
- Guidelines posted on the web
- Unit leaders current in Swim & Water Rescue may conduct swim checks
- Submit at 12-day-out meeting
- Pre-camp Swim Check June 8 at CSR

- Conducted by campsite host
- Sunday afternoon during check-in
- 15 minutes

# Major Change to First Aid Merit Badge

• 2 hour merit badge



- Fingerprinting
  - Monday, Tuesday, or Wednesday
  - Sign up for one night
- Astronomy & Space Exploration
  - Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday evening
  - Sky Observation Workshops
- Bird Study
  - Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday morning
  - Bird identification hikes



- Wilderness Survival
  - Tuesday overnighter
- Fishing
  - Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday during Twilight
  - Must attend all three nights



- Metalwork, Advanced Metalwork, Welding, Advanced Welding
  - Long pants required
  - Close-toed shoes required (boots desired)
  - Long-sleeve shirt suggested
- Automotive Maintenance, Farm Mechanics, Home Repair, Plumbing, Woodworking
  - Long pants suggested
  - Close-toed shoes required (boots desired)
  - Long-sleeve shirt suggested



- ATV PowerSports
  - Pay attention to age and weight requirements
  - Long pants required
  - Boots over the ankle required (boots desired)
  - Long-sleeve shirt required
  - Pre-camp web-based course (3 hours)
  - Hold harmless forms
  - \$65 fee



- Canoeing, Small-boat Sailing, Kayaking
  - Bring water shoes
- BSA Lifeguard
  - Requires Basic Life Support
  - BLS offered at Camp
  - Additional \$50



#### Provisional

- Sunday through Saturday
- Cost: \$495
  - Eligible for early bird
  - \$445 if paid in full by 11:59 pm on Thursday, March 28
  - The late fee does not apply to Scouts who register for the provisional unit after May 23.
- Multi-week discount (\$100)



#### Day Camper Program

- Monday through Friday
- 9:00 am to 5:00 pm
- Cost: \$220 (not eligible for early bird)
- Includes lunch and a patch



### First-Year Camper & Family Open House

- Saturday, June 15
- See camp, walk schedule
- Meet camp leaders
- See adirondacks

### Merit Badge Completion Day

- Scouts earned a partial because they did not complete requirement taught at camp
- Come back to camp on Saturday, July 27 to complete
- \$25

# Processes & Procedures



### Fees & Payments

• Camp Fee: \$485

• Early Bird: \$435 if paid in full by 11:59 pm on March 28

• Provisional Fee: \$495

• Day Camper: \$220

• Adult Leader Fee: \$215



## Payment Schedule

### Fees & Payments

- Early Bird: Pay \$435 by 11:59 pm on Thursday, March 28 to receive a \$50 discount on total camp fee.
- Late Fee: After 12:00 am Friday, May 24, a \$20 late fee will be added to the registration fee.
- Fees are the same for in-council and out-of-council units.
- Campership Deadline: Thursday, April 25
  - Camperships are available to in-council and out-of-council units
- Payment 1 is non-refundable but are transferable.



### Fees & Payments

Scouts who join your unit after summer camp payments begin automatically receive the early bird discount.



### 60% Capacity Rule

• Payment 1: \$160 per camper is due by Thursday, March 23. The total amount of Payment 1 for the unit must be equal to or exceed 60% of the campsite capacity.



### Payment Methods

- ALL Payments will be submitted online via Black Pug
  - No convenience fee
  - Convenience of you home
  - Allow parents to pay for their Scout
  - Facilitate accounting
  - Refunds back to credit card on file
  - In response to loss of events secretary due to budget cut

### Refunds

- Payment 1 (\$160 deposits) is nonrefundable, but is transferable.
- Once the camper has paid more than \$160, the refund amounts will not exceed 50% of the funds paid at the time of the refund regardless of circumstances.
- Scout pays \$320. Refund will be \$80.
- Refunds should be requested during the unit's 12-Day-Out Meeting.
- Refund requests are only approved by the camp director.
- If a Scout is unable to attend due to COVID-19, a full refund is available

### Adult Leader Fee

- Each unit receives 2 free adult leaders
- \$215 per adult leader over 2
- Must be paid by May 23
- Adults are not eligible for early bird rate



### Leader Mugs

- Adult leaders who stay in camp for the entire week receive a leader mug
- Additional leader mugs can be preordered
  - \$8 per mug
  - Pre-order due at 11:59 pm on Sunday,
    May 5
  - Include with other unit pre-order
  - Delivered on Sunday at camp

- In Black Pug
- Opens on Saturday, April 6 at 8:00 pm



### Merit Badge Registration Closes

- 2 weeks prior to your arrival at camp
- 12:00 am on the appropriate Sunday






