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General Guidelines

The Akela & Uwharrie Districts are hosting a merit badge college on Saturday March 1st, 2025. Below are the key points of the event. Please review these with your scouts.

Participation: Any Scout can register and participate. Registration and course selection is on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Cost: \$15 per participant registered in the Old North State Council. The registration fee covers facility use as well as lunch. There is an additional \$5 fee for Scouts registered outside of the Old North State Council.

Check-in: Will Begin at 8:15am and will take place behind Gee Building, see the attached campus map for exact location.

Sessions: The morning session will start at 9am and run through 12pm. The afternoon session runs from 1pm through 4pm.

Classes: Some merit badges classes may require both sessions to complete, some may have prerequisites that need to be completed beforehand, and some have additional class fees for class materials. Please read over the course offering catalog carefully before selecting classes to make sure you are aware of additional requirements.

Lunch: A pizza lunch will be provided from Domino's from 12-1pm serviced outside in the campus courtyard along with chips, fruit and water. If your scout has any special dietary requirements, please plan accordingly.

What to Bring: Please have the scouts prepared with appropriate materials before checking in. Most scouts will need something to write with and paper. Some classes may require additional items listed in the class catalog.

Leadership: We ask that at least one adult volunteer from each unit, or a parent for Scouts, register individually to remain on campus for the duration of the event. We must maintain two-deep leadership in each classroom.

Dismissal: Please make sure everyone in your unit that brings scouts knows classes end at 4pm and need to be on-site for pick-ups. For units that bring multiple scouts, please make sure they stay together until everyone is picked up.

Blue Cards: For this event we **DO NOT** issue Blue Cards, each unit leader will receive a Black Pug import file to load into Scoutbook or Troopmaster the completed requirements for each participant. A user guide to import Black Pug into Scoutbook is available in the documents section of this event. Please make sure to include your Scout Master's email address when registering so these reports can be sent to the appropriate person in your unit.

Scouts BSA Position Specific Training

Saturday March 1st, 2025

The merit badge planning committee is offering Scouts BSA Position Specific Training during the 2025 Akela/Uwharrie District Merit Badge College. This gives Scouts BSA leaders a chance to complete training requirements while the college is in session.

Training will cover two sessions from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM AND 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM with lunch provided from 12-1pm.

This is the **fourth** time the planning committee has offered in-person training using the NEW format released in June 2021.

New Training Format

- The instructor(s) will show the same training modules, videos and slides used in the online courses.
- The instructor(s) will then lead a short discussion following each presentation regarding information covered in that module.

Advantages of the New Format

- All leaders receive the same content, whether taken online or in-person.
- Experienced instructors will be available to answer questions about the content.
- Have more questions? Don't worry, we will have a parking lot established where questions can be posted for instructors to answer later. These include:
 - During breaks.
 - Later in the day at appropriate times, including a planned period at the end of the day.
- Since most training modules have some overlap, the Scouts BSA Position Specific Training courses (listed below) will be completed in two sessions.

Courses Covered

- **Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmaster Training* (S24)** – This is the major course because it covers almost all the modules.
- **Committee Member Training (WS10)** – All modules are covered in Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmaster training
- **Committee Chair Training (WS10)** – Requires only 1 additional module - Troop Committee Meetings (SCO_483)
- **Merit Badge Counselor Training (D76)** - Requires only 1 additional module - What is a Merit Badge Counselor (SCO_486)
We will also add a short presentation on Group Merit Badge Instruction from *The Guide to Advancement* with additional information

The additional courses beyond the minimum required give all leaders valuable cross-training knowledge when working with other unit leaders giving Scouts a better program. The following quote *paraphrased* from the *Facilitators Guide* for all the courses: "Training *course* is designed primarily for *position ... position* and other interested adults are welcome to attend."

Prerequisites – ALL adults attending these classes must have completed YPT.

For the Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmaster Course, Hazardous Weather Training SCO_800 MUST be completed ONLINE in advance and cannot be taught in-person. **Please bring a copy of your Hazardous Weather Certificate** to class.

"PLEASE NOTE, HAZARDOUS WEATHER TRAINING IS A PREREQUISITE WHICH MUST BE COMPLETED IN THE BSA LEARN CENTER PRIOR TO ATTENDING THIS COURSE FOR SCOUTMASTER AND ASSISTANT SCOUTMASTER. CREDIT SHOULD NOT BE GIVEN FOR COMPLETION WITHOUT EVIDENCE OF THIS REQUIREMENT."

Hazard Weather Training would also be beneficial for committee members, especially those who review activity and/or trip plans, however it is not mandatory for class participation.

It is also recommended you bring a 3-Ringer Binder for your notes, and saving handouts distributed during classes.

Venturing – BSA | Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews Saturday March 1st, 2025 Davidson-Davie Community College

The ONSC Venturing Officers Association is offering introduction to leadership skills for crews during the 2025 Akela/Uwharrie District Merit Badge College. This gives Scouts BSA leaders a chance to complete training requirements while the college is in session.

Training will cover two sessions from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM AND 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM with lunch provided from 12-1pm.

Modules Covered

- Leading Self
- Leading Others
- Leading Crews

Introduction to leadership skills for crews is an excellent opportunity for venturers to learn the fundamentals of leadership, instructing participants on time management, communication, goal setting, and more. ILSC is a pre-requisite for any venturers who wish to take National Youth Leadership Training as well as a requirement for the discovery rank.

Prerequisites

ALL participants attending the course must be registered venturers who have earned the venturing rank (*unless an exemption is made by the VOA*). Any participants 18 or older who are attending the course **MUST** have proof of a completed youth protection course.

Required Materials

All participants attending the course must bring the following materials:

- Laptop or tablet computer and appropriate charger
- 1 bandana
- Pens and pencils

Other Information

All participants should arrive in the appropriate uniform for their crew. There will be a few outdoor activities so participants should be dressed appropriately for the weather. All graduates of the course will be presented with an ILSC completion certificate as well as a Trained patch to be placed on their crew uniform.

The Venturing Officers Association will provide a certificate notebook for each participant which will include the appropriate handouts and sufficient space for note-taking.


The cost for this class is \$15 per participant to cover the cost of training materials. For out-of-council participants the cost is \$20.

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Importing Merit Badge Advancements for Summer Camps or Merit Badge Events

NOTE: This feature is included in an extension/add-on developed by a volunteer. Any support or update is the responsibility of the volunteer.

Summary: This extension/add-on feature enables the direct import of Merit Badge information from summer camps or other merit badge events who use Black Pug or Tentaroo Software to track registrations and merit badges. Black Pug and Tentaroo are third party vendors contracted by multiple Councils to provide their services. Black Pug also can be recognized by its web address, scoutingevent.com. This feature is only available to Leaders with permissions to use the Scoutbook Quick Entry for Merit badges. NOTE: This extension/add-on is not an endorsement for either of these vendors but they are the only ones that I am aware of that support the import format.

Installation: The features described herein are part of the *Feature Assistant Extension/add-on for Scoutbook*. To obtain the extension/add-on, discover other features it offers, and install it, please see this [document](#).

Importing Data

Currently, two Camp Management/Reservation systems support recording and downloading merit badge advancements that may be imported into Scoutbook, Black Pug, and Tentaroo.

Black Pug

If your unit's summer camp is managed by Black Pug (scoutingevent.com), then the individual who registered your Troop with the Summer Camp needs to log into scoutingevent.com to their summer

camp reservation, select Reporting,



then click on the Scoutbook Export button.

Scoutbook Export


This report exports merit badge completion data in Scoutbook format using Scoutbook's "advancement.csv" template.

Chrome Users - an extension is available that allows direct import of this data into Scoutbook. That extension can be obtained here: [Feature Assistant Extension for Scoutbook](#). There is also a new forum post in Scoutbook here: [Feature Assistant Extension](#)

Firefox Users - a similar extension is being created (as of 6/1/2017).

A CSV file will be exported containing merit badge data. Do not edit the file, since your editing software can make it unusable.



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Tentaroo

If your unit's summer camp is managed by Tentaroo, then, to download your completion records from summer camp or another event in Tentaroo, login to your unit account and navigate to your event registration.

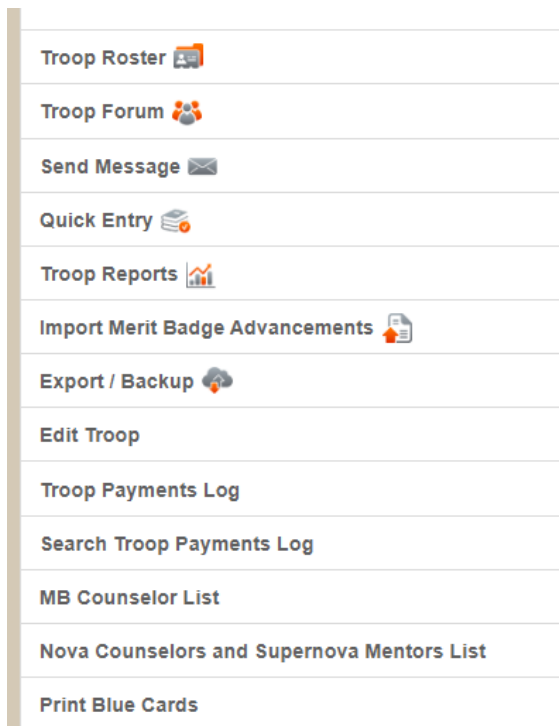
For current or upcoming events, these will be displayed on your home screen. Click on the card to enter the registration.

For past events, click on the Events button in the left-hand panel (on mobile, this can be found under the hamburger menu) and click on Past. Select the type of event, such as Scouts BSA Resident Camp, then click on Past to display only past sessions. Click on the session to enter the registration.

Once you are in your Registration, click or tap on Reports. The Requirements for Scoutbook (Excel/CSV) report is third from the bottom, just before the Blue Card reports. Download this data and save to your computer but do NOT modify the file.


Use the Extension

After installing the extension/add-on as directed to above, log in and navigate to your Troop's unit page. You will see an option to Import Merit Badge Advancements.




Click on the option, and use Choose File to select the CSV file. You will have the option to import merit



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badge requirements or completed badges or both. Additionally, you have the choice to mark information as Leader Approved when importing. If you mark it Leader Approved, it will NOT appear on your Needs Approval Report. It may be prudent to not mark it approved, so you have easy visibility into what you just imported or if you have concerns about what was approved at Camp.




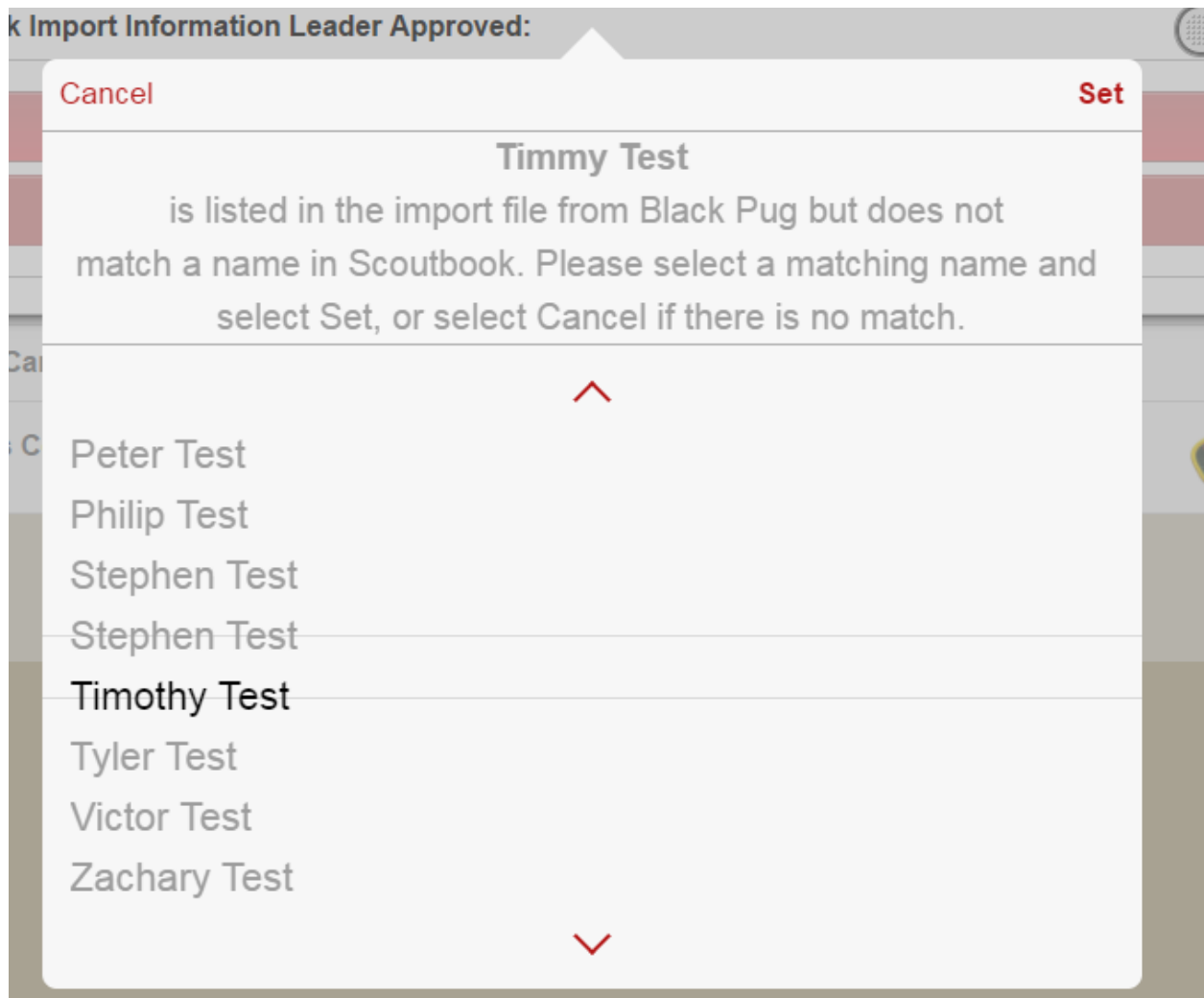

When you click Import File, the import process will check the unit name in the file to make sure it is associated with your unit.

Additionally, it will resolve differences in Scout names between Scoutbook and the CSV file. Chances are, there are differences between the Scout's name entered into the Camp system and what is in Scoutbook. When a name is not recognized, a popup will ask you to match up the name with a name in Scoutbook.



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Scroll down the list until you have matched the name then click Set. If you cannot match the name, click Cancel to ignore those Scout records in the CSV file.

NOTE: The extension tries to match the first and last name in the CSV file with names on your Scoutbook Roster, which uses nicknames, so you will have to manually match those names as discussed above.

Any notes contained in the Import Note field will be added to the requirement notes in Scoutbook. You can edit this note if desired (recommended to identify the specific event!).

When complete, you may see a few exceptions noted on the Import Popup screen. If Scoutbook previously contained a completed badge or the Scout already started a Merit Badge but it is an old revision, it will not overwrite the original Scoutbook information.
