The fun begins on Saturday morning. Check-in will begin at 9am outside of Sampson Lodge (located next to the main parking lot). The program will kick off with an opening ceremony on the Parade Field at 9:45 am (adjacent to the main parking lot).

Adventure programs will run in Eastern and Western program areas from 10:00 am to 4:45 pm. Start with the section you are assigned to in the morning and cycle through those activities as you wish. After lunch you will switch to the other section. You can travel as a whole Pack or break into smaller groups. Program areas close for lunch from 12:30 - 1:30 pm.

Cars & Carpooling:

Parking is at a premium in camp, so please carpool as much as possible!

Please drive only on established camp roads, and follow the posted speed limits.

Vehicles will need to be parked in the main parking lot and remain there until departure.

Getting here:

Rodney Scout Reservation, 400 Rodney Scout Road, North East, MD 21901

Once you turn into camp, it is about 2.5 miles to the main parking lot.

GPS Directions to camp may lead to "Boy Scout Rd." Please do NOT use this road.

Use "Rodney Scout Road" only.

Check In:

Check in will begin at 9am outside Sampson Lodge, near the main parking lot at Rodney Scout Reservation.

All attendees must be checked in. You will receive a program map for the day and your event patch at check-in.

Program Times & Trail Groups:

The Arrow of Light Outpost Program is available for Arrow of Light Scouts. Please register using the AOL Outpost Program Participant option for interested Scouts.

The Arrow of Light Outpost is a specialized program for Arrow of Light Scouts teaching skills that will apply to the Outdoor Adventurer, Knife Safety, and High Tech Outdoors adventures.

There may be limited availability at check in for Scouts to register for the Arrow of Light Out Post program.

Family Adventure Day programs will begin at 10am and run until 4:45pm. The program will kick off with an opening ceremony on the parade field at 9:45 am (adjacent to the main parking lot). There will not be a closing ceremony as participants may leave at various times. The day will be full of adventure and hiking, and some Scouts may tire out faster than others.

Meals:

Meals are available for prepurchase through the registration page at <https://scoutingevent.com/081-rsrfad>. Please purchase all meals when completing your registration.

Day visitors will have the ability to purchase a separate lunch meal for Saturday. Wristbands will be issued for each of the meal plan types.

Units camping for the weekend will have the ability to purchase a separate meal plan for Saturday lunch, Saturday dinner, and Sunday breakfast.

Please ensure that all your weekend visitors eating with us are pre-registered, so that there will be enough food ordered.

Saturday lunch will be served at 12:30, Saturday dinner at 6, and Sunday breakfast at 7:30am

Please respect campsites where others are camping for the weekend.

Trash cans will be available in each program area.

Please remember: A Scout is clean!

First Aid:

There will be a Camp Health Officer located on the property for any first aid needs.

Please make sure that you have a completed and updated Scouting America Annual Health & Medical form (Parts A & B) for each person attending. These forms will remain with the Pack Leader, or individual family.
