

Ordeal Candidate Checklist

Wear To Your Ordeal: Arrive in a BSA Field Uniform (aka Class A)

These items should be packed in a separate bag from the rest of your gear and be easily carried:

- _____ Waterproof Ground Cloth/Tarp (Big enough to cover over and under Scout, size 8 x 10 recommended)
- _____ Sleeping Bag and Ground Pad
- _____ Flashlight
- _____ Insect Repellent & Sunscreen
- _____ Pocket sized, personal hand sanitizer
- _____ Face mask (no bandana or buff types permitted)
- _____ Water Bottle (already filled at home)

Your remaining gear should include the following:

- _____ BSA Medical Form (Parts A and B required)
- _____ Medications (if applicable) - Inform those in charge at check-in if you have prescribed medications.
- _____ Backpack (or duffle bag for carrying your gear)
- _____ Wet Weather Gear
- _____ Basic Toiletries
- _____ Work Clothes (Some work projects may involve work that will potentially stain/soil your clothing. Bring clothes that you don't mind getting dirty or paint on. You may also encounter poison ivy, so consider wearing a long-sleeve shirt and pants for your work clothing. Bring a spare change of work clothes in a plastic bag in case you need to change during the day.)
- _____ Sturdy boots or work shoes (no open toed shoes allowed)
- _____ Work Gloves
- _____ Baseball Hat (or other type of hat with a brim)
- _____ Filled, one (1) gallon jug of drinking water. **Label the jug with your name.**
- _____ Sharpened Pocket Knife (no fixed blade knives permitted)
- _____ Small Tent (with ground tarp)
- _____ Other clothing appropriate for the weather and time of year. Pack for the season; be prepared
- _____ Anvil loppers, hand pruners, bow saw, rake or shovel (**labeled with Scout's last name**)
- _____ Camp Chair

DO NOT BRING electronic devices such as iPads, ear buds, radios or handheld games. You may be asked to check-in your cell phone or to lock it in your vehicle.

DO NOT BRING any snacks or food items.

REMEMBER: All clothing should be appropriate for the outdoors and time of year. You should pack for the season; be prepared!
