## INTRODUCTION AND SUMMARY

The FSK District Cub-O-Ree will be held on Saturday April 27th, at the Walkersville Watershed. This District Day Event will be open to all Cub Scouts from Lion through Webelos (I & II). Optional Family Camping will be available Friday and Saturday Night. Family Camping is separate from the Cub-O-Ree. If choosing to camp at the Walkersville Watershed, parents must camp with and be responsible for their own children.

The Cub-O-Ree is a rotation style day event filled with a variety of activities for scouts. Each Pack will spend ½ of the day in set rotations. Those rotations are Archery, Cooking, and Orienteering. The other ½ of the day will have open choice activities scouts can visit. These include STEM, knots, hiking, Team Building, geocaching, and more. All Packs attending the Cub-O-Ree will be assigned a Campsite so they have a place to cook and eat meals during the day event. Packs are responsible for bringing their own food.

Siblings in K-5th that aren't registered in Cub Scouts can participate if they register for the event as Cub Scouts and pay the registration fee. Youth that are too young or too old may not be able to join in some events because of age restrictions. They are welcome to attend with the Pack and either stay in the assigned campsite with their parent, or walk with the Pack, but know they may not be able to participate in the activities.

**REGISTRATION FOR FSK CUB-O-REE DAY EVENT**

Patches: Every Paid and Registered Youth will receive a patch. Each Unit will receive two Adult patches at no charge. Additional patches may be available for purchase.

Membership: Youth must be Cub Scout age to participate in the event (K-5th grade). Siblings who are older or younger are welcome to walk with the group but may not be able to participate in some activities. Every Pack must have at least 2 adult leaders over the age of 21. If there are female youth members with the Pack, one of these leaders must be female. Lions and Tigers are required to have an Adult Partner with them at all times.

Medical Forms: Each Pack should have BSA Medical Forms A and B in their possession for all Scouts and Adults attending the event. Each unit is expected to bring a binder or folder containing these forms, in the unlikely event that medical care is required beyond first aid. The Packs will hold onto the medical forms.

Registration: Pre-Registration is required for the event with payment in advance requested. Registration is through the NCAC Event website.

Registration price is \$20 per Youth Scout. Registration for the event will close on April 13th. <https://scoutingevent.com/082-fskcuboree>

**CHECK-IN PROCEDURES**

Check-in registration will be available at 5:00 pm on Friday April 26th for individuals that choose to participate in Family Camping. Family Camping is separate from the FSK Cub-O-Ree District Event. Individuals not camping will Check-in at 8:00 am on Saturday April 27th. At check-in, all Packs must submit their Campfire Participation Form. Campsite assignments will be provided at check-in. Sites may be shared by multiple units, so be friendly and considerate neighbors!

## **CHECK-OUT PROCEDURES**

Check-out will begin at 7:00pm on Saturday for individuals who are only participating in the FSK District Cub-O-Ree day event. For those participating in the optional Family Camping, camp check-out will begin at 7:30 am on Sunday, April 28th. Your campsite **MUST** be inspected by a member of the Watershed Staff before you leave. Prior to inspection, please complete the following:

- Ensure the campsite is litter free.
- Restore your campsite to better than you found it.
- Pack up your gear and be ready to depart.
- Carry out all garbage to be disposed of at home.
- Request a site inspection of a Watershed Staff member.
- Complete, and be ready to submit, a Cub-O-Ree Evaluation Form.
- Complete the check-out.

The check-out sheet will be signed when the inspection is completed. You will receive your Cub-O-Ree Patches at the May Roundtable meeting.

## **PARKING**

Parking is always tight at the Watershed. Please carpool when possible and park vehicles completely off the road. It is imperative that we keep an emergency path on every road for First aid emergencies.

## **FSK DISTRICT CUB-O-REE GENERAL RULES**

- The Scout Oath and Law will govern the behavior of all participants!
- The Buddy System must be followed by all Scouts at all times.
- Leave No Trace principles apply as always.
- As with any Scout event, there will be no illegal drugs, alcohol, fireworks, firearms or other weapons. Cigarette smoking, vaping, or similar activities by adults is prohibited at all stations and areas with Cub Scouts. A designated Smoking area will be identified at Check-in
- Sheath knives and fixed blade scabbard knives are prohibited.
- Wood tools must be properly stored and used in the ax yard (see the Scout Handbook for proper Patrol campsite setup). Improper use of wood tools is prohibited. All wood already cut at Campsites was put there by youth for their Troop. Pack leaders should collect their own firewood and bring their own tools to chop firewood. Campfires must be built in an established fire ring/pit or raised above ground and must be properly extinguished when camp site is unattended. Keep filled water bucket handy. You can find water onsite at the newly installed well.

- Report all accidents, injuries, or other emergencies to a member of Watershed or Cub-O-Ree Staff. Medical personnel will always be on site during the Cub-O-Ree.
- Lost and found items should be brought to the Admin Pavilion.
- Class B T-shirt, or similar Pack attire is encouraged for all activities. Class A's are required for flag ceremonies.

### **HAZARDOUS WEATHER**

In the event of severe weather, stay in campsite/program area and send 1 runner to the center of camp for roll-call. Utilize your hazardous weather training and react accordingly. Further direction will be communicated through staff to leaders via radios.

### **CUBMASTER GUIDANCE**

- The Cub-O-Ree will not be called off because of weather. Some activities may be modified.
- Campsites will be assigned based on Registration and then by the number of Scouts and number of Adults
- Optional Family Camping Friday evening check-in begins at 5 PM at the Registration Hut
- No sheath knives, fireworks, alcoholic beverages, or firearms; ALL FIRES MUST BE CONTAINED WITHIN A ROCK FIRE RING WITH PROPER CLEARING and fire buckets.
- Anything beyond basic first aid MUST BE REPORTED to Cub-O-Ree medical staff.
- Dutch oven cooking must be contained within fire rings or off the ground.
- Packs are responsible for removing all the trash from the campsites and event areas. There are no dumpsters on site. Leave the camp better than we found it.
- Each activity will begin at the time indicated in the schedule, please ensure that your Pack is on time. A detailed schedule for each Pack will be provided at Check-In.
- BSA Field uniforms are required for the campfire, scouts own service, Flag Ceremonies. Class "B" or Scout appropriate apparel should be worn during stations.
- Practical jokes are not Scout-like and will not be tolerated.
- For those participating in Family Camping, lights out Friday and Saturday at 10PM. Due to the close proximity of units, this policy will be strictly enforced.
- Checkout: Make sure your campsite is clean in accordance with Leave No Trace principles.

### **HELPFUL INFORMATION**

- Water will be available at the Watershed. Bring your water containers/water bottles full.
- Porta Johns are located around the camp and near several of the activity areas. Ensure you utilize your gender labeled facility.

- Cell signal is available in the camp depending on your carrier.

## **EMERGENCY PROCEDURES**

Small first aid needs should be tended to at the using the Pack's first aid supplies and trained adult leaders. Larger needs should be directed to the medic located at Admin. Medications requiring refrigeration may be stored in the Aid Station located at Admin.

Cub-O-Ree participants must bring their medical forms. Please have all medical forms for each Pack in one binder/folder. Medical forms will be kept by the Pack and brought to Medical as needed.

If any of our adults who attend this event are medical professionals, please let the Cub-O-Ree Staff know upon your arrival. If units know of campers with serious medical problems, please discreetly inform the Health and Safety Staff. The Aid Station (at the Admin Pavillion) will be manned during the event. Medical Emergencies should be directed through Admin during other hours. Medications for all Scouts and Scouters should be administered by the units.

### Orienteering

Location: Parade grounds

Description: Learn how to use a compass to orient through a course.

### Cooking

Location: Admin Pavillion

Description: Make a Foil Packet dessert to enjoy

### Knots & Lashing

Location: T628 Pavillion

Description: Practice knots from Overhand to Bowline. Learn lashings for various purposes. A shoe tying practice area will also be set-up

### STEM

Location: Near the Archery Range

Description: Learn how to make your own compass

### Map Skills

Location: Cabin

Description: Learn how to read a map and then work together to create a map of the watershed.

### Hikes

Locations: T1070 Entrance

Description: Pick up trail maps for the watershed and materials to create a Theme hike

### Day Camp

Location: Admin Pavilion

Description: Come get all the information about FSK Day Camp

### Gaga Ball

Location: Gaga Ball Pit

Description: Play a round or two of Gaga ball Following posted rules

### Group Games

Location: Field between 1011 and 1070

Description: Have fun playing a game or two with other scouts.

### Geochaching

Location: Over the Watershed

Description: information will be provided so scouts can search for caches within the watershed.

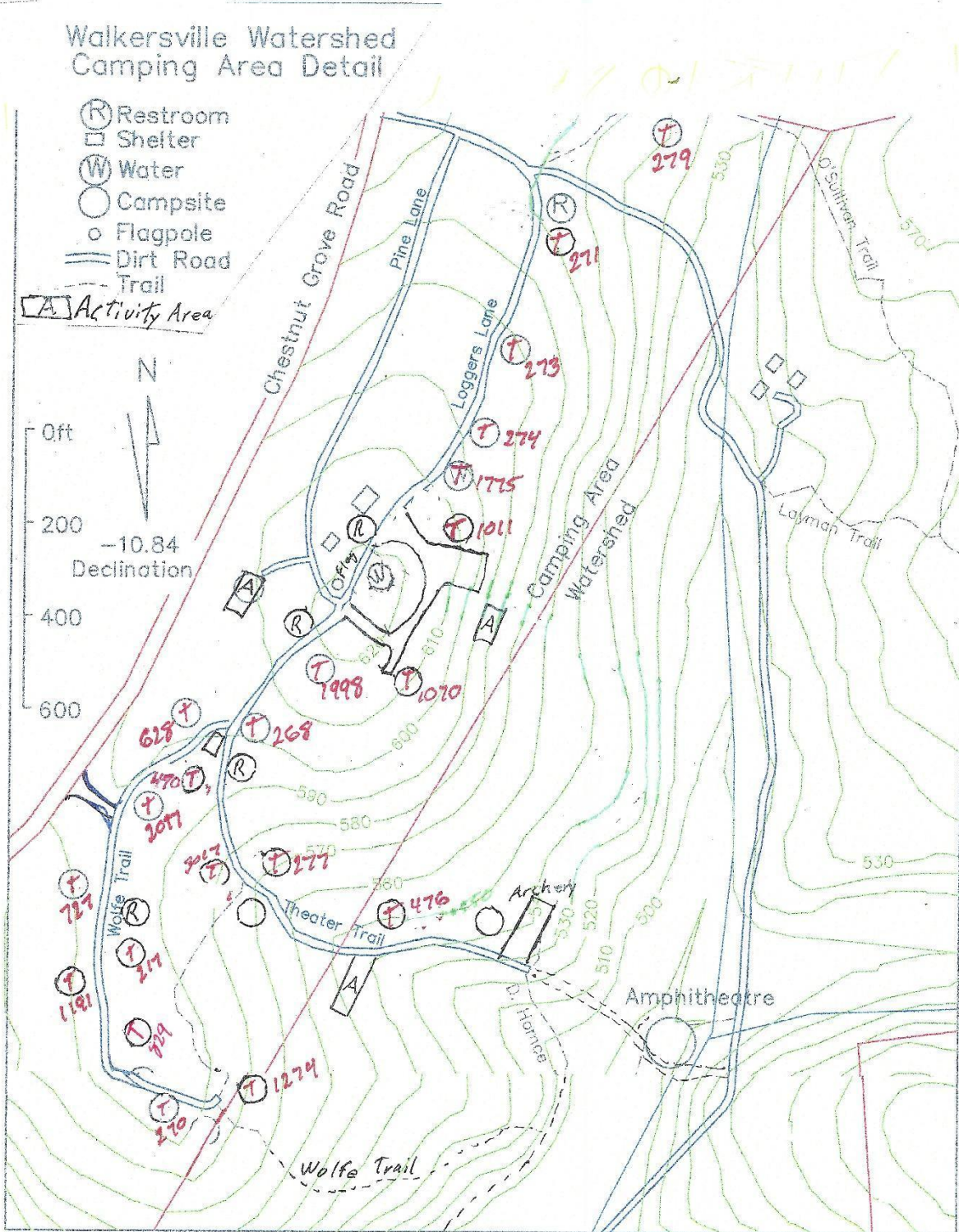

- No camping in the pavilion area within the fence.
- All fires should be in fire rings and thoroughly put out and wetted down before leaving
- No throwing or leaving rocks and/or large sticks in the pavilion area. (The mower thanks you!)
- No trash and/or bottles in porta pots.
- Police area and carry out all trash.
- If you use already stacked firewood, replace it.
- If you need to move tables or benches, return them to their original position. Also please no standing or walking on tables. People do eat from tables.
- Be courteous to the neighbors who also use the property for hiking, walking, etc.
- No charge is required to camp but donations are accepted to help with maintenance.
