Western Shore District 2025 Fall Cub-O-Ree General Information:

Date: November 22-23, 2025

Place: St. Mary's Fairgrounds, 42455 Fairgrounds Road, Leonardtown, MD

Theme: The 2025 Western Shore Fall Cub-O-Ree theme is Fall Harvest!!!

Time: Registration begins at 7:00 am and will run until 8:00 am; the program begins at 8:15 am with morning flags and will end at 4:00 pm. After 4:00 pm, Packs wishing to camp are welcomed to set up in their designated areas.

Dress: Field Uniform (Class A) is required upon arrival and opening ceremony. A Pack related t-shirt uniform (Class B) is optional for program periods and lunch. Packs should coordinate their own storage of Field Uniforms during program periods and lunch.

What to Bring: Lunch, snacks, water bottle, and ten essentials. Scouts and parents should remember to dress for the weather as the event will not cancel due to rain. Scouts must have their BSA A and B medical forms. Adults may wish to bring a portable camp chair.

** Adults, traveling outside of the camp for lunch is not an option. Please remember to bring your scout their meal.**

For Packs wishing to stay overnight, the District will not provide equipment for you to camp and meals. Fires are not permitted unless they are in an off the ground fire pit. Vehicles are not permitted in the camping area unless approved by camp staff and escorted onto the property. Once the vehicles are inside the camp area, vehicles are to remain parked until after the event.

Medical Forms: The standard BSA Annual Health and Medical Record, parts A & B, must be completed for everyone attending - Adults and scouts. Packs should bring copies of these forms to the Cub-O-Ree. Registration as a Pack: Each pack must pre-register in advance as a group to participate at Cub-O-Ree.

Cub Scout to Adult ratio: Each pack MUST have no less than 5:1 Scout to Adult attendance, and a minimum of two adults to the event. Tiger and Lion Cubs MUST have 1:1 Cub to Adult attendance. Packs should also provide volunteers for stations during the event, or for breakdown of the event.

If a Pack is planning to camp, then they must provide their own BALOO trained leader for the event.

Registration: Registrations will be accepted until two weeks before the start of the event. Packs are to pay for the event online during registration.

RULES AND GUIDELINES:

- You are expected to read this booklet in its entirety and share all pertinent information, with all Leaders, Scouts, and families that will take part in this event.
- We want all participants to enjoy Fall Harvest Cub-o-ree, but Scouts must remember that they are not the only participants at this event as the Zombie Invasion Camp-o-ree is also going on at the same time.
- BUDDY SYSTEM: Please enforce the buddy system at all times.
 No one should be without a buddy. Remember two-deep leadership as well.

- TRASH: Please follow the Leave No Trace Guidelines. All trash must be disposed of in the proper Waste Recepticals. At the end of the event, all trash must be deposited in the dumpster located across from the Fairgrounds Main Office.
- ELECTRONICS: To experience camping at its best and because we require your full participation during the event, we suggest you leave Electronic Devices "Toys" at home.
- TOILET FACILITIES: Remember, a scout is clean! Please talk to your scouts and their families about sanitation and the need to keep the bathrooms clean.

****** Youth participants are to use the restrooms marked "Youth", which is located near the Fairgrounds Admin Office. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES are adults allowed to be in the facilities with youth. Adult participants and staff are to only use the bathrooms marked "Adult", which are located near the archery station. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES are youth allowed in adult bathrooms. This is a violation of Safeguarding Youth Procedures and will be enforced. If an exception is needed, please contact Camp Staff. *****

Events and Activities:

In order to properly schedule a large number of participants through as many activities as possible, it is important that your group follow the schedule rather than just wander around Cub-O-Ree. This will also assist if for any reason we need to locate your unit for questions or an emergency, we will know where to find you.

Rotation schedules will be given out during check-in. All participants will be assigned a unique wristband to be worn on Saturday. This will assist us in keeping Cub-o-ree and Camp-o-ree participants separated. Please stick with your rotation schedule, and do not skip any sessions as it will cause a problem with other stations.

Meals:

Meals will not be provided, so please make sure your Cub eats breakfast prior to arriving and has lunch ready for them. If you are staying overnight, please make sure meals are planned. Cub Scouts are NOT allowed to interact with the Troop, even if siblings are attending, so do not assume that they will be eating dinner with the Troops.

Adults, YOU WILL NOT HAVE TIME TO LEAVE CAMP AND GET A LUNCH FOR YOUR SCOUT. There are limited options near the camp for food.

Archery and Slingshots:

Since this is a Council Sponsored event, Scouts will be able to earn their Archery Shooting Sports awards. All Scouts and Siblings are required to attend the safety brief prior to handling the bows or slingshots. This is mandatory, as those who do not attend will not be able to shoot.

Crafts:

Beads/Knots to learn Scout Law- Scouts will be learning the Scout Law through a bead and knot project.

Scouts will be making a turkey decoration using toilet paper rolls and feathers.

Games:

Scouts will be playing against their own Pack mates in a GaGa ball competition!

Scouts will be using their knot skills to build a structure in order to transport their harvest! Scouts will use bamboo sticks and knots to build a device to transport dried beans to the farm.

Here are some ideas to put outdoor skills into action at Scout meetings - Aaron On Scouting

Scavenger Hunt:

Orienteering with a compass to locate some special items, which together, will lead to their next lesson... in cooking!

Cooking lesson:

Brown Bears- Scouts will take refrigerated biscuit dough and twist it around a skewer like a snake. Once it turns golden brown, scouts will remove the skewer, brush with butter, and sprinkle with cinnamon sugar.

Take a sugar cone and fill with various ingredients. Wrap the cone in foil and place over a fire until the contents have melted.

STEM:

Scouts will be straws, paper, and balloons to make a balloon rocket.

Cub Master notes:

- The Cuboree will not be called off because of weather. Campsites will be assigned based on the number of Scouts participating. Your assignment will be given during check-in.
- Saturday morning check-in is from 7:00 to 8:00 AM at the Administration Office. Please be prepared to show binder with medical forms for your unit at check-in. Unit Leaders will keep possession of medical forms. During check-in, please confirm whether or not your Pack will be camping on-site.
- The Shooting Sports Safety Brief will be held at the Archery Range and must be attended by everyone participating in the shooting event.
- ALL Vehicles must be parked in designated parking lot. Approval for the exceptions to this policy must be done BEFORE unit check-in. Only one vehicle per pack is allowed to go to the campsite to drop gear. Vehicle passes will be provided. No vehicles can go to the campsite once the camporee starts.
- No sheath knives, fireworks, alcoholic beverages, or firearms; ALL FIRES MUST BE CONTAINED OFF THE GROUND.
- Anything beyond basic first aid must be reported to Camporee medical staff.

Parent/Leader guidance:

- Each activity will begin at the time indicated in the schedule, please ensure that your unit is on time. A detailed schedule is located in this guide.
- Each Pack is requested to provide volunteers to assist in running activities.
- BSA Field uniforms are required for the opening ceremony, campfire, and closing ceremony. Class "B" or Scout appropriate apparel should be worn during patrol competitions.
- Practical jokes are not Scout-like and will not be tolerated.
- No vehicles are allowed in the campsites.
- If a Dutch oven is used for cooking, it may be done in your campsite. However, it must be elevated high enough, so you do not burn the grass beneath the fire.
- Lights out Saturday at 11PM. Due to the close proximity of units, this policy will be strictly enforced.
- Checkout: Make sure your campsite is clean in accordance with Leave No Trace principles. You will not be allowed to leave until your campsite has been checked.
