2026 Webelos Weekend

Date: August 28-30, 2026

Place: Camp St. Charles located at 15375 Stella Maris Drive,
Newburg, MD 20664

Theme: The 2026 Western Shore Spring Cub-O-Ree theme is
Adventures Unleashed

Time: Registration begins at 7:00 am and will run until 8:00 am; the program begins at 8:30 am with morning flags and will end at 4:00 pm. After 4:00 pm, Webelos wishing to camp are welcomed to set up in their host Troop's camp.

Dress: Field Uniform (Class A) is required upon arrival and opening ceremony. A Pack related t-shirt uniform (Class B) is optional for program periods and lunch. Packs should coordinate their own storage of Field Uniforms during program periods and lunch.

What to Bring: Lunch, snacks, water bottle, and ten essentials. Scouts and parents should remember to dress for the weather as the event will not cancel due to rain. Scouts must have their BSA A and B medical forms. Adults may wish to bring a portable camp chair.

***** Adults, traveling outside of the camp for lunch is not an option. Please remember to bring your scout their meal.*****

For Packs wishing to stay overnight, you must have a Troop willing to host you. The District does not provide equipment for you to camp and/or prepare meals. Fires are not permitted unless they are in an off the ground fire pit. Vehicles are not permitted in the camping area unless approved by camp staff and escorted onto the property. Once the vehicles are inside the camp area, vehicles are to remain parked until after the event.

Medical Forms: The standard *BSA Annual Health and Medical Record*, parts A & B, must be completed for everyone attending - Adults and scouts. Packs should bring copies of these forms to the Cub-O-Ree. They will be held by the event leader until the end of the event. Registration: Each Scout must pre-register in advance to participate at Webelos weekend. If staying overnight, the Scout must provide the Troop number in which they and their adult would be camping.

If you do not have a Host Troop or know of any Troops, please contact Dave Myrda at dave.myrda@gmail.com and he will assist.

Cub Scout to Adult ratio: Each pack MUST have no less than 5:1 Scout to Adult attendance, and a minimum of two adults to the event.

Registration: Registrations will be accepted until two weeks before the start of the event.

RULES AND GUIDELINES:

- You are expected to read this booklet in its entirety and share all pertinent information, with all Leaders, Scouts, and families that will take part in this event.
- BUDDY SYSTEM: Please enforce the buddy system at all times. No one should be without a buddy. Remember two-deep leadership as well.
- TRASH: Please follow the Leave No Trace Guidelines. All trash must be disposed of in the proper Waste Recepticals. At the end of the event, all trash must be deposited in the dumpster located at the entrance near the road.
- ELECTRONICS: To experience camping at its best and because we require your full participation during the event, we suggest you leave Electronic Devices “Toys” at home.
- TOILET FACILITIES: Remember, a scout is clean! Please talk to your scouts and their families about sanitation and the need to keep the bathrooms clean.

***** Youth participants are to use the restrooms marked “Youth”. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES are adults allowed to be in the facilities with youth. Adult participants and staff are to only use the bathrooms marked “Adult”

UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES are youth allowed in adult bathrooms. This is a violation of Safeguarding Youth Procedures and will be enforced. If an exception is needed, please contact Camp Staff. *****

Events and Activities:

In order to properly schedule a large number of participants through as many activities as possible, it is important that your group follow the schedule rather than just wander around. This will

assist in locating a Scout or adult if for any reason we need to locate your unit for questions or an emergency.

Rotation schedules will be given out during check-in. All participants will be assigned a unique wristband to be worn on Saturday. Please stick with your rotation schedule, and do not skip any sessions as it will cause a problem with other stations.

Meals:

Meals will not be provided, so please make sure your Cub eats breakfast prior to arriving and has lunch ready for them. If you are staying overnight, please make sure meals are planned. This is the perfect time for Webelos to interact with Troops. If you are planning on spending the night, please let us know which Troop, so we can notify the Scoutmaster. This will allow them to prepare to feed enough Scouts.

Adults, YOU WILL NOT HAVE TIME TO LEAVE CAMP AND GET FOOD FOR YOUR SCOUT. There are limited options near the camp for food.

Cooking:

Cooking is a skill learned in Scouts and can be an adventure all in itself. Scouts will learn how to prepare a meal over an open campfire or on a gas stove. Please let us know of allergies prior to the event.

First Aid:

Scouts will learn basic First Aid and how to react during an emergency. Emergencies can occur during our adventures, so Scouts should be prepared to take over if such an emergency event happens.

Canoeing:

A large part of the Scout program is spending time on the water. Scouts will be learning the basic skills of canoeing and how to navigate our waterways.

Gaga Ball Tournament:

Because what isn't a Scouting event without a Gaga Ball Tournament. Do you think you have what it takes to be the best in the District?

Fishing:

Do you have what it takes to capture the "Catch of the Day"? Scouts will learn how to fish, what types of fish are in our waterways, and how much fun fishing can be.

Pioneering:

Knots, most people dread tying knots, but what if you can make something useful or fun? Scouts will learn basic knots and participate in a race to build small catapults to launch tennis balls in a field. Who knew knots could be useful and fun?

Geocaching:

Have you ever been Geocaching? Do you know what it's about? How about setting up your own course? Did you know electronics can be useful even in Scouting? Adult leaders will show you how much fun Geocaching is and what exciting adventures you can have all around the world.

Service Project:

Scouts are Helpful, Courteous, and Kind... which means we provide help where help is needed. Service Projects are a way for Scouts to

give back to their community. Scouts will be assisting in a Service Project at Camp St. Charles.

Cub Master/Scoutmaster notes:

- Webelos Weekend will not be called off due to weather. Be prepared for rain.
- It is the responsibility of the Webelos parent to confirm which Troop their Scout may be staying with if sleeping overnight. If a Troop has not been decided, please contact Dave Myrda or Elizabeth Clark so the Webelos can be assigned.
- Saturday morning check-in is from 7:00 to 8:00 AM at the Administration Office. Please be prepared to show the Scout and any adults staying, medical forms. Unit Leaders will keep possession of medical forms. During check-in, please confirm whether or not your Scout will be camping on-site and if a Troop has been selected.
- ALL Vehicles must be parked in designated parking area. Approval for the exceptions to this policy must be done BEFORE unit check-in. Only one vehicle is allowed to go to the campsite to drop gear. No vehicles can go to the campsite once Webelos Weekend starts.
- No sheath knives, fireworks, alcoholic beverages, or firearms; ALL FIRES MUST BE CONTAINED OFF THE GROUND.
- Anything beyond basic first aid must be reported to Camporee medical staff.
- Each Troop is to provide leaders to assist with each event.

Parent/Leader guidance:

- Each activity will begin at the time indicated in the schedule, please ensure that your group is on time. A schedule is located in this guide, but a more detailed schedule will be provided on the day of the event.

- BSA Field uniforms are required for the opening ceremony, campfire, and closing ceremony. Class “B” or Scout appropriate apparel should be worn during the event.
- Practical jokes are not Scout-like and will not be tolerated.
- If a Dutch oven is used for cooking, it may be done in your campsite. However, it must be elevated high enough, so you do not burn the grass beneath the fire.
- Lights out Saturday at 11PM. Due to the close proximity of units, this policy will be strictly enforced.
- Checkout: Make sure your campsite is clean in accordance with Leave No Trace principles. You will not be allowed to leave until your campsite has been checked.
