

Registration: Registration is available online at:

https://scoutingevent.com/082-SpringVenturingCamporee

The cost covers for activities, camping, cracker barrels and the patch.

The Early Bird registration cost is \$25, it will be raised to \$35 after May 10th.

You may also register on-site for \$35 as well. On site registrations need to be done with a Credit or Debit card, we are unable to take cash.

Crews prepare and bring their own food. Event is open to any registered Venturer, Leader or parent/guardian of a registered Venturer and all other Scouting Youth 14 and over. Adults attending whether registered Scouters or not, should have a current and up to date YPT completion.

• Note: Guests only attending the 7:30pm Court of Honor Saturday need not register; they may attend the ceremony for free.

Check-in: Check in starts at 6pm and is located at the Hylton Center/Admin building (K on the map). Please have a list of all attending from your unit and all complete/signed copies of medical forms for all attending. We understand you may all not arrive at the same time, but the unit roster will help us ensure we have accounted for everyone. Anyone arriving after 7:45pm will need to contact CVOA@ncacbsa.org. and let them know you will be arriving late.

Checkout:

Saturday Checkout: After a staff member has checked your campsite to ensure leave no trace practices, please proceed to the **Dining Hall to check out**. You will receive your medical forms back.

Sunday Checkout: After a staff member has checked your campsite to ensure leave no trace practices, please proceed to the **Hylton Center to check out**. You will receive your medical forms back.

Restrooms and Shower Houses: Snyder has bathhouses for youth males and youth females as well as adult females and adult males. Please use the correct corresponding bathhouse and clean up after yourself.

First Aid: Please bring a Crew first aid kit for use in your campsite. You will be asked to turn in BSA Health Forms A and B at check-in. Please observe the buddy system at all times. Should a more serious injury occur, there will be a first aider in Carroll's Cottage all day.

Weather: Events will proceed as planned in the event of light rain. Should more serious storms begin, event staff will be notified and shelter should be sought and indoor events will remain operational. In the unlikely event of a tornado, shelter can be found in the interior laundry rooms of each shower house.

Campsites: Camp Snyder has their canvas tents up, each tent has 4 cots inside. You may stay in the canvas tents or bring your own if you prefer your own tent. Crews will be assigned campsites and likely will be sharing with other Crews. Please observe the Scout Oath and Law and work together to create a better experience for all. Bring your own tents and supplies.

Religious Services: There will be a non-denominational religious service at 8am Sunday morning at the flags outside the Dining Hall

Smoking, Tobacco Use & 'Vaping': Scouting espouses that the use of tobacco in any form should not be promoted or done in the presence of youth members. Moreover, vaping is also strongly discouraged as it is also harmful to health. Youth members, even those over 18, are not to use tobacco in any form or engage in vaping at Scouting events. Adult volunteers or parents who must engage in the use of tobacco or vaping may only do so in designated areas away from youth. All smoking, tobacco use or vaping is only to be done in designated areas.

Water: Snyder has spigots all over the camp. Please ensure you always have a full water bottle and drink frequently to stay hydrated. It is also recommended that each unit bring a water receptacle for their campsite.

What to Bring: Weekend tent camping supplies (Canvas tents and cots are up so you do not *need* a personal tent unless you *want* one), BSA Health Forms A/B, food & water bottle, a costume for the Hoedown Saturday Night, supplies for the Birthday Dessert Contest, and a great attitude.

What not to bring: Personal firearms, toy guns, and any item that could be deemed a weapon (regardless of permit) are not permitted. Follow all camp, state, and federal laws (no fireworks, animals, alcohol, illegal drugs, generators, etc.).

Snyder Policies: Please follow all rules posted by Camp Snyder.

- Camping is allowed only in designated camping areas. By Order of the Prince William Fire Marshal and per PWC Land Usage agreement, all vehicles must park only in the main parking lot.
- One trailer will be allowed to remain in a campsite area designated space.
- Following Virginia State guidelines, no firewood may be brought into camp.
- Only make fires in the campsite fire pits. Please follow all fire safety procedures.
- Quiet time is 11:00pm 6:00am
- Note: The camp is shared with other scouts/events. Some areas of the camp will be off limits to our group; please be respectful and remain in areas designated for the Venturing Camporee.

Dress Code: Please remain in Activity uniform for the daytime program, Field Uniform for Worship Services, Flags and the Court of Honor Saturday Evening. At the Saturday night Hoedown you may dress in a costume you see fit for the Wild West Theme or casual clothing. **You may be asked to change your clothes if the staff or CVOA deem your outfit inappropriate.**

Camp Snyder Map: Please note that the area in the red rectangle with the line through it is off limits between 12pm and 6pm. All other areas marked are where our main program will be taking place.

NO VEHICLE PARKING In the CAMPSITE Loop.

Campers may drive to their campsite to unload ONLY.

(Maximum 10 minutes)

Any vehicle not moved to the main parking lot will be given 1 warning.

After 1 warning a notice will be provided to the Unit of the Parking

Fee for each vehicle not in compliance with Camp Parking regulations.

The dessert can be whatever you deem a "Birthday Dessert", that means it doesn't has to just be a cake, it could be any dessert you want!


You can prepare this any way you want in your campsite; Dutch Oven, stovetop, solar oven, etc.
