

We will be camping at Gunston Hall to celebrate the 20th Anniversary of the creation of Colonial, Old Dominion, and Patriot Districts from the great George Washington District, and to remember that great district from which we came. Scouts and Webelos will celebrate by participating and competing in fun activities from the days of George Washington and from

Scouting's fun and adventure. Scout Troops and Venturing Crews will be camping. Webelos will be visiting on Saturday to participate in the activities and campfire, and to visit camps upon invitation. Scout Troops and Venturing Crews are challenged to set up a campsite gateway that that honors and tells something about George Washington, or Colonial times, or the Old

Dominion, or Patriots such as George Mason, Thomas Jefferson, Benjamin Franklin, John Hancock, Paul Revere, Thomas Pain, John Adams, or James Madison. The gateways will be judged as part of the campsite judging by the Commissioners. There will be a variety of fun activities for all Scouts and Webelos to participate in such as archery, bb gun range, tomahawk throwing, shooting climbing wall, horse shoes, marbles, lashing, pancake cooking, surveying, relay races, nail driving, hatchet chopping, STEM challenges, and many more – up to 18 in all. There will also be some opportunities for Scouts to Mason's mansion tour George and

opportunities for all to see Archeology in action.

See registration information below. Registration fees cover costs for camping, program supplies, council fees and a patch for each participant.

Check-in begins at 5:00 pm on Friday evening. Events will be conducted on Saturday morning and afternoon. Campfire in the evening.

On Sunday morning, the Scouts will conduct a service project for Gunston Hall and plan to depart by noon.

#### **Directions Gunston Hall**

Traveling From points North

From Interstate 95 take Exit #163. Turn left onto Lorton Road. Turn right at the third light onto Lorton Market Street. Lorton Market Street becomes Gunston Cove Road, and after crossing Richmond Highway (Route 1) it becomes Gunston Road. The Gunston Hall entrance is 3.5 miles on the left.

#### **Parking and Traffic Control**

Units are encouraged to car pool as much as possible. Generally, all vehicles will need to be parked in the main parking lot and Scouts should expect to hike their gear to their campsites. There will be a trailer parking lot near the campsites. **Trailers will not be permitted at the campsites.** 

#### **Campsite Assignment**

For units that register by October 5, their campsite assignment, a Camporee map, and any other relevant Camporee information

will be emailed to them the weekend before the Camporee. If you don't receive one, park in the parking lot and go to the CAMPOREE HEADQUARTERS. You will need to get your site assignment and a map before you enter the camping area.

#### Checking-in and Paying Fees

After arrival, as the unit is setting up camp, one leader must go to the Camporee Headquarters to complete registration by turning in a completed registration form and paying any remaining fees. To assist the staff, please pay with checks or money orders. These should be made payable to "NCAC BSA."

# A single check per unit is the preferred method of payment.

#### Late Arrival and Early Departure

If your unit is not going to arrive Friday night please indicate this on your registration form. If your unit is going to leave Saturday night, make sure you also indicate this on the registration form.

If your unit must leave on Saturday evening, please check with the Service Project Coordinator Friday evening to potentially arrange for a service project your unit can do Saturday afternoon. You may pick up your patches and ribbons after you have vacated your campsite and had a commissioner sign the checkout form. Units leaving Sunday will receive their patches when checking out. Turn in the Campsite Check Out and Evaluation Forms.

#### **Check-Out Procedures**

Each unit will receive a checkout and program evaluation form at registration (see appendix). This form is necessary for final site clearance. A commissioner will inspect each site before units leave for home and complete the site inspection portion of this form. A troop leader, preferably with input from the SPL, will complete the evaluation portion of this form. Additional copies will be available from the Camporee HQ or from the Commissioner Staff.

#### **Leaders Meeting**

There will be a meeting for a leader and youth leader from each camping unit Friday evening at 8:30 PM at the Camporee Headquarters. Webelos Leaders will meet Saturday morning after the opening ceremony at the flag pole.

#### Webelos Registration

Webelos I and II dens are invited to attend the Camporee on Oct. 20<sup>th</sup>. Check-in will occur at Headquarters from 8:00 - 8:45AM. Den/pack Leaders will confirm the number of members with their group and will receive their patches at that time. There will be a Webelos leaders meeting following the opening flag ceremony to discuss the program for the day. Dens are encouraged to work with troops for lunch and dinner. Webelos and their leaders may stay at the Camporee through the campfire program but must depart after its conclusion. All other registration information noted above applies to Webelos Dens as well.

### **Religious Services**

On Saturday evening, we are working to provide opportunities for the Scouts to participate in Catholic, Protestant, Jewish, and LDS services, and Muslim communal prayers. The locations of each of the Services will be confirmed at the Friday evening at the leader's meeting.

#### **Emergency and First Aid**

#### First Aid / Fire & Ambulance Service

The First Aid Station will be set up near the Headquarters area and will be marked with a prominent sign. Unit leaders, please notify the First Aid Director of any participants who are prescribed EPI-Pens or who have potentially life-threatening conditions and emergency contact numbers for those individuals. (Diabetes, heart condition, epilepsy, other issues.) Each unit should have an on-site emergency contact and give that cell number to the First Aid Director on Friday night.

All injuries, even minor ones treated in the campsite, must be brought to the First Aid station personnel for treatment and/or recording.

In the event that fire or ambulance services are needed, send a runner to the Camporee Headquarters or First Aid Station, so that an emergency call can be placed and the Camporee Director can be notified. If the emergency call is placed from a cellular phone within your area, you still must send a runner to the Camporee Headquarters to notify the Camporee Director of the emergency and to arrange for the emergency equipment to be directed to the correct location.

#### **Emergency Contacts**

It is recommended that units have access to several cellular phones, which can be used as a primary contact for members of their Unit. Anyone calling other camporee contact numbers must know the individual's type of unit (Pack, Troop, Crew, or Ship) and unit number and, if possible, the unit leader's name.

#### **Parental Authorization**

In case of serious injury or illness requiring emergency medical services or hospital treatment, a health history record and permission form signed by a parent or guardian is required. This form must be accessible to the unit adult leader/leaders at all times. If a Scout is brought to the First Aid Station for any type of treatment, his parental authorization form should be available for review by the Camporee staff. All participants — Webelos, Boy Scouts, Ventures, Leaders, Staff, and Parents must have a Health Form, Part A and B, and all youth must have an Activity Consent Forms.

# **Campsite Logistics**

#### **Availability of Water**

Water resupply will be limited. All participants and units are asked to bring as much water as they can for their needs and to minimize use of water. There will be limited resupply from a water buffalo and from the property well.

Water bottles should be carried during the program on Saturday. *Proper hydration is key to keeping our Scouts healthy.* To avoid the serious consequences of dehydration, ensure everyone regularly consumes water, especially as they travel to and from program areas and while in the areas. Washing of dishes at the central water source is prohibited.

#### Meals

Units should plan for a Friday evening meal (or eat before you arrive), Saturday breakfast, lunch, dinner and Sunday breakfast. It is recommended that lunch be portable or quickly prepared as it maybe some distance from the program activity to your campsite. Scout Troops are encouraged to host Webelos Dens for meals – or Saturday dessert.

#### **Ground Fires**

No wood fires will be allowed in the district camping areas. Only charcoal and camp stove cooking will be allowed in the district camping areas. Charcoal ash must be taken home for disposal. All cooking must be elevated off the grass so that it does not burn the grass. This is to preserve the fields. There will be a group campfire on Saturday night.

#### TITO - Trash in, Trash out

Every unit should be prepared to take any trash home with them that they bring. Bring a supply of plastic trash bags to securely bag your own trash. DO NOT leave trash in your campsite. Please keep the campground clean and do not leave bags of garbage unattended; wild animals and birds love unattended garbage.

### **Camporee Rules**

# Conduct by All Attending the Camporee

The Scout Law is the Law of the Camp at all times. A scout is: Trustworthy – Loyal – Helpful – Friendly – Courteous – Kind – Obedient – Cheerful – Thrifty – Brave – Clean – Reverent.

Any individual who does not act as he or she should, may be putting their privileges in jeopardy and jeopardizing future Camporee privileges of the Districts. Unit Leaders are reminded that their Scouts should have adult supervision at all times.

In addition all units should have a copy with them and follow the Guide to Safe Scouting.

#### Knives


Sheath knives and knives with blades longer than 4 inches, except cooking knives, are not allowed at the Camporee. If any are found, a member of the Camporee staff will hold them for the remainder of the Camporee. Folding knives that are in a case or worn on a belt are permitted.

#### **Proper Uniform**

Scout shirt and Scout pants or Scout shorts with proper socks should be worn for the opening ceremony, religious services on Saturday evening, and to the campfire Saturday evening. Venturing Crews and Sea Scout Ships wear unit-designated uniforms. Scout pants or shorts and Scout T-shirts are acceptable during the Saturday program. No military garb or fatigues, including camouflage, should be worn.

#### **Quiet Hours**

All units will be subject to quiet hours and lights out from 11:00 PM to 6:30 AM. Leaders in each troop are responsible for enforcing quiet hours and lights



#### **Commissioner Corner**

#### **Commissioner Service**

In addition to helping with parking and assisting units in getting to their campsites Friday evening, commissioners will be available at all times during the Camporee to assist Scouts and Scouters whenever necessary. Commissioners may be found at Camporee Headquarters in the vicinity of the registration table or just look for the friendly individuals wearing purple neckerchiefs throughout the activity areas.

#### **Camporee Campsite Inspections**

During the day on Saturday, the Commissioner Staff will be conducting campsite inspections using the inspection form included at the end of this Camporee guide. The purpose of the inspection is to establish or remind Scouts and Scouters of a certain level of expectation for setup and maintenance of a campsite and then to recognize those units that achieves or exceeds expectations.

Inspections will be unit based, with each patrol contributing to the unit as a whole. In other words, a unit with three patrols that each exemplifies ideal campership will be adversely affected by a single patrol that fails to meet the established expectations. Ribbons will be awarded based on the campsite inspection results, with award categories: Award of Merit and Honor, Award of Merit, and Award. Special awards may be given for the top campsites.

#### **Order of the Arrow**



#### **Trading Post**

The Order of the Arrow will host a Trading Post on Saturday. Soda, candy and other snacks will be available for purchase. This will also be

the focal point for OA activities during the camporee. All OA members are encouraged to bring their sashes and stop by the trading post/exhibit during the weekend.

#### OA Cracker Barrel

All Chapter Members are invited to a special, OA-only Cracker Barrel Fellowship Gathering immediately after the Leader's Meeting Friday Night, location to be announced. Soda and snacks will be provided by the chapter youth leadership. (NOTE: Troop Leaders will have a cracker barrel at Camp HQ at the same time.)

#### **OA Ceremony Team Signups**

The OA Chapters will be setting up the campfire and leading the Scouts to it from

the opening ceremony assembly areas. Any chapter members who would like to help, stop by the cracker barrel or trading post and see one of the Chapter Chiefs

#### **Brotherhood Conversion Opportunity**

Youth and adult Ordeal members who completed their ordeal are encouraged to seal their membership in the order as a brotherhood member. A sign-up form is included at the end of this package. It should be turned in at registration Friday night or at the OA Trading Post. Candidates must then participate in the Brotherhood walk Saturday evening which will take approximately 30-45 minutes. Candidates should meet at the OA Trading Post at 4:45 PM. The induction ceremony will then take place Saturday evening after the campfire program. There is no cost for the Brotherhood conversion

# **CAMPOREE PROGRAM INFORMATION**20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration

The Camporee theme is celebrating the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the creation of Colonial, Old Dominion, and Patriot Districts from the great George Washington District and remember to great George Washington District. The games will be in a festival of fun. Many of the games will be from the colonial days of George Washington.

Each Patrol, Den, or Crew will have a passport to the games. The more activities they complete, the more punches they get on their passport, the higher grade ribbon they win.

Patrols, Dens, and Crews will participate in the games lead by their youth leaders.
Dens may have a Den Chief advisor and new Scout patrols may have an experienced Patrol Leader or Troop Guide as their advisor. Webelos Dens will play the same games but with adjustments for their abilities.

# All patrols/dens/crews should consist of at least 4 scouts but no more than 10 scouts.

In the spirit of fair games, adult leaders may observe their Scouts but may not offer them guidance during the games. Violating this rule could result in a penalty against scout spirit points for the Scouts.

Patrols/Dens/Crews will need to have with them the following gear to be prepared to play the games: patrol/den/crew flag, a compass, and water bottles for each member.

# Adult Leaders & Senior Scouts Needed for Boy Scout Program

Each game will be "hosted" by a troop or crew participating in the Fall Camporee. The troop/crew is responsible for staffing the competition with scouters, parents, and/or senior scouts and providing their own pop-up for shelter. Every game must have at least one adult present at all times. Units can volunteer to sponsor a game or they will be assigned to games on a first come basis. Units which do not volunteer for a game prior to the Camporee will likely be assigned to sponsor one at the Camporee. Questions and/or to volunteer to host for the Boy Scout Program, please contact your district program chair person.

- Alexander Hamilton Count Your Marbles (marbles colonial style – founding father's sons played marbles). Be prepared to play "Pots" like our founding fathers did when they were boys. You may bring your favorite shooter but no steelies. Marbles and shooters will be provided at the game.
- Patrick Henry Give me Liberty
  Horse Shoes. Our founding fathers
  played horse shoes and so will you.
  Count ringers and bangers.
- Francis Scott Key Oh Say Can You
   See. A race for best time in lashing together and raising a free standing
   12 foot flag pole with George

- Washington's flag on it. Webelos will not need to do lashings.
- Citizenship in the Nation Merit Badge for 75 Scouts
- Chaplain Aide and Religious Emblem Coordinator Training for 40 participants.
- Visit Gunston archeology site to see what they are discovering.

#### **GUNSTON HALL TOURS.**

There are a limited number of spaces for tour of Gunston Hall.

There will be space for 8 Scouts and one adult leader every half hour from 10 am to 4:30 pm for a total of 14 tours. Tours will be allocated one per troop by lottery announced at the Friday night leader's meeting.

The museum will not be open for tours as it will be closed for renovation.


