### Rules

Rules are for the safety of the scouts, siblings, parents and leaders. Please follow the rules and if you see a problem, please report the incident to the Camp Management at the Camp Office.

### Safety Rules

- Closed toed shoes must be worn at all times. Flip-flops or sandals are permitted only at the pool and while traveling to bathroom from campsite.
   No passengers in the rear of pickup trucks or on tailgates.
- All vehicles must be parked in the area assigned to you at Check-in.
- Vehicles cannot be parked in the campsites.
- Alcohol, Fireworks, personal firearms, and/ or controlled substances are strictly prohibited.
- 5. ALL campfires must be in the dedicated fire rings of each campsite and must be attended at all times while burning.
- 6. No flammable liquids are permitted.
- 7. NO OPEN FLAMES IN TENTS.
- 8. Cooking stoves must be no less than 20 feet from buildings and tents and under adult supervision at all times while operating.
- Stored food in lockable containers in a secure location to help reduce wild animal visitations.
- 10. Insect repellent is strongly recommended. If using aerosol repellent avoid spraying while inside of tents.
- 11. All bicycle riders must wear a helmet at all times while riding.
- 12. Extension cords are permitted only inside of activity shelter or for medical equipment only.
- 13. Camouflage clothing is highly discouraged at Camp La-No-Che.
- 14. During your stay please limit the use of your vehicle to ensure the safety of pedestrian and emergency traffic.

# Welcome to Camp La-No-Che!

### Camping

Your campsite is assigned to you and will be given at check-in. To the best of our ability, Cub Scout Packs will be kept together in the same campsite. When setting up camp, please be considerate to others and do not pitch your tent in pathways to the rest rooms or activity shelters. You may also set up your tent anywhere immediately outside of your assigned campsite area except in roads, paths or fire ring.

### Parking

No parking is allowed in the campsite area by order of the Lake County Fire Marshall due to access needed during emergencies. Please park your car in your assigned parking area. Assigned areas are: main parking area; the Sports Field across from campsites 4 & 5; and ATV field by Adventure Camp. The speed limit in camp is 10 m.p.h. Please Note: The roads to/from all campsites are now ONE WAY. Please follow the posted signs. Thank you!

### **Camp Food Service**

If you have purchased camp food service, please come to W.T. Bland Dining Hall with your meal tickets at the assigned time. If you have any questions please ask.

#### Guest Service

Guest Service Representatives are located at the camp office to assist with your visit. If you have any questions, campsite problems or other needs, please look for a Guest Service Representative or a Campmaster for assistance. Also, our Camp Rangers are always available to fix maintenance issues in your campsite or latrine. We are here to make sure you have a great outdoor experience.

### Camp Safety

For the safety of our guests here at Camp La-No-Che, we employ the use of an emergency alert system in the event of a camp wide emergency. We also have weather alerts from time to time. These plans have been developed for the use of Scouts, Scout Leaders, and Staff while camping and/or participating in activities at Camp La-No-Che.

### Weather Alerts

Florida is the lightning capital of the world and represents a hazard of which all should be made keenly aware. If inclement weather is forecasted, camp staff will monitor any approaching storms and will notify all staff to assist campers to seek appropriate shelter when necessary. When lightning is eminent, appropriate shelter is any building that has 4 walls such as the Dining Hall. Campsite activity shelters and camp pavilions are not safe shelters. When notified, please ensure that everyone in your group goes to one of the nearest building with 4 walls as instructed by staff and stays there until given all clear.

### Camp Wide Emergency

If there is a camp wide emergency, a wailing (air raid) siren will sound. If you hear this siren, please immediately proceed to the Seneff Flagpole outside of the W.T. Bland Dining Hall and await further instructions from the Camp Staff. Please ensure that everyone in your group comes and do not leave anyone at the campsites – adults included. We will need to account for everyone in camp.

#### Trash

All trash is your responsibility. The Boy Scouts of America lives a Leave No Trace philosophy. We teach all Scouts to respect the outdoors and take care of our precious lands. Please keep in mind that trash (even trash in bags) will attract wildlife. In the evening and when you leave the camp at departure, please take your trash to the dumpsters at the exit of campsites 1-16 (behind Trading Post) and 17-25 (behind the camp offices). Thank you!

#### Fishing

Fishing is only allowed at the Cheney Waterfront next to Campsite 20. We do not allow fishing at the Phillip Starr Waterfront due to the dangers of hooks where Scouts get in the lake.

#### Wildlife Warning

• Please respect our wildlife and enjoy watching from a distance. Keep food stored properly in a vehicle or trailer and make sure trash is disposed of properly.

BE BEAR AWARE! We share camp with black bears. Help keep scouts (and bears) safe by safely storing food. No Dumping food/trash in woods. Keep a clean Campsite. No food or trash in tents!!
BE BUG AWARE, TOO! Our camp is home to ticks and chiggers. Stay out of long grass, wear long pants when in deep woods, and check for ticks daily! (Have a parent/guardian check their child.) Evening/Overnight Emergencies

Should you have an emergency overnight/after office hours, you must report it to the health lodge. This does several things; the health officer can help or health officer can get the gate open for emergency vehicles if needed. If you call 911 use the green numbers (address) on the activity shelter with Boy Scout Rd. Paisley, Fl 32767 to dispatch.

#### Lost Child

If you get separated from you child(ren), please report to the trading post or health lodge and stay there. We will get information from your and get our staff to do the searching. This way we can also bring the child(ren) to you.
