Everyone, youth and adults, must report to the designated area during a camp wide emergency alarm unless instructed otherwise by the camp staff. SAFETY RULES

- One fire is permitted per site. <u>Do not</u> use pine cones, pine needles, Spanish moss, kerosene, or gasoline in the fire. While burning, the fire must be attended at all times.
- <u>No flames or fires</u> of any kind are permitted in tents.
- Stick, roll-on, or pump insect repellent and deodorant is preferred, and aerosol should be avoided if possible.
- Wear closed toed shoes <u>at all times.</u> Open toed shoes, flip flops, or sandals may be used between campsite and latrines only.
- Riding on the tailgate of a car or in the back of a pickup truck is <u>prohibited</u> at all times while in Scouts, BSA.
- Park all vehicles in the main camp parking lot unless you have a parking pass designating your permission to be in camp.
- Use extension cords only inside buildings.
- Camp La-No-Che <u>discourages</u> camouflage clothing due to safety.
- Use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances are <u>not permitted</u>. Any individual or group violating this rule must leave the facility.
- No fireworks or privately owned firearms are permitted on BSA Property.
- All bicycle riders <u>must</u> wear safety helmets.
- The Buddy System must be followed whenever possible while at camp.
- Water filling Stations are located throughout camp and it is highly encouraged to carry your own <u>filled water bottle</u>. Drink Plenty of Water!

BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA SMOKE-FREE POLICY

Boy Scouts of America policy is to provide a smoke-free environment for all Scouting participants. Therefore, you may smoke only in the designated adult break area behind the Trading Post. Thank you for your assistance!
