- Our **Adult Leader Merit Badge** encourages leaders to be involved in our camp program and to have an enjoyable experience. Information is in your units “Check-in Box”.
- **Night Owl** is a patch that can be earned for leaders who assist in patrolling camp trails in the evening. Meet at 10PM on the front porch of the Dining Hall, serve at least 4 nights.

## SAFETY RULES

- **The Buddy System must be followed always while at camp. Buddy Pairs must be the same gender, and also be all under 18.**
- One fire is permitted per site. Do not use pine cones, pine needles, Spanish moss, kerosene, or gasoline in the fire. While burning, the fire must be attended at all times.
- No flames or fires of any kind are permitted in tents.
- Stick, roll-on, or pump insect repellent and deodorant is preferred, and aerosol should be avoided if possible.
- Wear closed toed shoes at all times. Open toed shoes, flip flops, or sandals may be used between campsite and latrines only.
- Riding on the tailgate of a car or in the back of a pickup truck is prohibited at all times while in Scouts BSA.
- Park all vehicles in the main camp parking lot unless you have a parking pass designating your permission to be in camp.
- Use extension cords only inside buildings.
- Camp La-No-Che discourages camouflage clothing due to safety.
- Use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances are not permitted. Any individual or group violating this rule must leave the facility.
- No fireworks or privately owned firearms are permitted on Property.
- All bicycle riders must wear safety helmets.
- Water filling Stations are located throughout camp and it is highly encouraged to carry your own filled water bottle. Drink Plenty of Water!

- Merit Badge changes can be made in the Main Camp Office through 5 pm on Monday.
- Due to bear activity, please do not leave campsite trash unattended. For your safety, please deposit trash in the dumpster. Use bear boxes. (for food and smellables)
- Report facility repair request to **camplocal@camplanoches.com** or report daily to Main Camp Office, Quartermaster, or Daily Leader Meeting.
- Food Service is provided in our Dining Hall. Please do not waste food; please have your Troop's Service Patrol clean tables and the floor.

## LIGHTNING ALARM PLAN OF ACTION

Florida is the lightning capital of the world and represents a hazard that all should be made keenly aware. This plan has been developed for the use of Scouts, called “Thor Guard” for the Dr. Phillips Park Area. The system senses lightning within a predetermined safety zone then sounds an alert.

### ***PLEASE FOLLOW STAFF INSTRUCTIONS DURING A LIGHTNING ALERT RED***

#### **Alert Red**

You will hear one fifteen (15) second blast of the air horns. This alarm means that lightning is close and you need to seek appropriate shelter where you should **remain until given the all clear signal**. Safe shelter locations include:

#### **Locations**

All Program Areas  
All Campsites

#### **Safe Shelters**

W. T. Bland Dining Hall  
Campsite Activity Shelters

#### **All Clear**

You will hear three (3), five (5) second blasts of the air horn. The area should now be considered safe and you may proceed but still be cautious of dangerous weather as it still may be near the camp.

#### **Camp Wide Emergency**

In the event there is a camp wide emergency a wailing (air raid) siren will sound. If you hear this siren, please proceed to the following: report to Seneff Plaza Flag Pole. Line up with your unit, take roll call, have your SPL report to the Camp Commissioner that your unit is accounted for, and wait for further instructions from the Camp Staff. Everyone, youth and adults, must report to the designated area during a camp wide emergency alarm unless instructed otherwise by the camp staff. The entire camp will have an opportunity to practice these procedures during your stay at camp.



## **VEHICLES**

To protect our camp and all Scouts and Scouters, we ask that all vehicles be parked in the Main Camp Parking Lot. Vehicles will be allowed to transport gear to and from the campsite on the Sunday and Saturday. Units will be permitted to park their equipment trailer in their campsite. The trailer must be detached from the vehicle, and the hitch must be marked off. Units without a trailer are permitted one vehicle at the campsite with a parking pass (please see Commissioner at the Monday Leaders Meeting for a pass).

- Once a vehicle is parked it will remain unless there is an emergency.
- Golf carts will only be allowed in camp with approval by Camp Administration. All camp policies regarding golf carts and UTV's must be followed. No youth are permitted on golf carts without approval of the Camp Health Officer

## **SCOUTING AMERICA SMOKE-FREE POLICY**

Boy Scouts of America policy is to provide a smoke-free environment for all Scouting participants. Therefore, you may smoke only in the designated adult break area behind the Trading Post. Thank you for your assistance!

## **UNIFORMS**

We recommend the Field Uniform (Class A) for dinner. During the day units are free to make their own uniform expectations. However, all campers must wear closed-toe shoes at all times, and all men a shirt unless in an Aquatics Program. The only exception is that flip flops or sandals may be worn in the campsite when going to and from the shower.

## **WILDLIFE WARNING**

- Animal information is on the bulletin board in each campsite
- Food must be stored properly in vehicle, trailer, or bear box
- Trash must be disposed of daily before dark due to wildlife.
- Bear boxes are provided in each campsite, please store food and smellables in them.

## **VALUABLES**

- The Leonard and Marjorie Williams Family Scout Reservation and Staff will not be responsible for campers or units valuables while at camp.
- Use these tips to avoid any losses while at Summer Camp:
  - Advise Scouts to bring only a few valuables and lock trunks.
  - DO NOT carry large amounts of money around camp.
  - Never leave a Scout alone at the campsite.
  - Advise your Scouts to walk around others campsite.
