SAFETY RULES

- ***One campfire is allowed per campsite, and must always be supervised.***
- No flames or fires of any kind are permitted in tents.
- Stick, roll-on, or pump insect repellent and deodorant is preferred, and aerosol should be avoided if possible.
- Wear closed toed shoes at all times. Open toed shoes, flip flops, or sandals may be used at the pool & between campsite and latrines only.
- Riding on the tailgate of a car or in the back of a pickup truck is prohibited at all times in Scouting America.
- Park all vehicles in the main camp parking lot unless you have a parking pass designating your permission to park at the campsite.
- Use extension cords only inside buildings.
- Camp La-No-Che discourages camouflage clothing due to safety.
- Use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances are not permitted. Any individual or group violating this rule must leave camp.
- No fireworks or privately owned firearms are permitted on property.
- All bicycle riders must wear safety helmets.
- The Buddy System must be followed always while at camp.
- Water filling Stations are located throughout camp and it is highly encouraged to carry your own filled water bottle. Drink Plenty of Water!

SCOUTING AMERICA SMOKE-FREE POLICY

Scouting America's policy is to provide a smoke-free environment for all Scouting participants. Therefore, you may smoke only in the designated adult break area behind the Trading Post. Thank you for your cooperation!

WILDLIFE WARNING

- Animal information is on the bulletin board in each campsite.
- Food must be stored properly in vehicle, trailer, or bear box.
- Our camp is home to ticks and chiggers. Wear bug spray & check daily.
- Trash must be disposed of daily before dark due to wildlife.

OPERATIONS

- Due to bear activity, please do not leave campsite trash unattended. For your safety, please deposit trash in the dumpster. Use bear boxes. (for food and smellables)
- Report facility repair request to **camplocal@camplanoche.com** or report daily to Camp Admin Office. Meal service is provided in our Dining Hall. Please do not waste food; please have your Service Patrol clean table/floor.

VEHICLES

To protect our camp and all Scouts and Scouters, we ask that all vehicles be parked in the Main Camp Parking Lot.

VALUABLES

The Leonard and Marjorie Williams Family Scout Reservation and Staff will not be responsible for camper or unit valuables while at camp.

UNIFORMS

We recommend the Scouting America, Field Uniform for dinner. During the day units are free to make their own uniform expectations. Campers must wear closed-toe shoes at all times.

TRASH

All trash is your responsibility. Camp practices a Leave No Trace philosophy. We teach all Scouts to respect the outdoors and take care of our precious lands. Please keep in mind, trash (even trash in bags) will attract wildlife. In the evening and when you leave the camp at departure, please take your trash to the dumpsters at the exit of campsites 1-16 (behind Trading Post) and 17-25 (behind the camp offices) Thank you!

FISHING

Fishing is only allowed at the Cheney Waterfront next to Campsite 20. We do not allow fishing at the Phillip Starr Waterfront (thats for boating).

GUEST SERVICE

Guest Service Representatives are located at the camp office to assist with your visit. In addition, our Camp Rangers are always available to fix maintenance issues in your campsite or latrine. We are here to make sure you have a great outdoor experience.

LIGHTNING ALARM PLAN OF ACTION

Florida is the lightning capital of the world and represents a hazard of which all should be made keenly aware. If inclement weather is forecasted, camp staff will monitor any approaching storms and will notify all staff to assist campers to seek appropriate shelter when necessary.

When lightning is eminent, appropriate shelter is any building that has 4 wall. Campsite activity shelters are safe shelters. PROGRAM PAVILIONS ARE NOT SAFE SHELTERS. When notified, please ensure that everyone in your group goes to one of the nearest building as instructed by staff and stays there until given all clear.

CAMP WIDE EMERGENCY

In the event there is a camp wide emergency a wailing (air raid) siren will sound. If you hear this siren, **everyone must** report to Seneff Plaza Flag Pole. Line up with your unit, take roll call, report to the Camp Commissioner that your unit is accounted for, and wait for further instructions from the Camp Staff. Everyone, youth and adults, must report to this designated area during a camp wide emergency alarm unless instructed otherwise by the camp staff. The entire camp will have an opportunity to practice these procedures during your stay at camp.

EVENING/OVERNIGHT EMERGENCIES

Should you have an emergency overnight/after office hours, you must report it to the health lodge. This does several things, 1) the health officer can help and/or 2) health officer can open the gate for emergency vehicles if needed. If you call 911 use the green numbers (address) on the activity shelter with Boy Scout Rd. Paisley, FL 32767 to communicate with dispatch.

LOST CHILD

If you get separated from you child(ren), please report to the Trading Post or Health Lodge and stay there. We will get information from you and get our staff to do the searching. This way we can reunite you when found.
