Camping Policies

Tipisa Lodge abides by Scouting America's Youth Protection policies.

Attendance Requirements

- All Participants must be registered in Scouting.
- Tipisa Lodge members must be dues-current.
- For the purpose of these policies,
 - “Youth” are under age 18.
 - “Adults” are 18 years old or older.
 - Participants who are, or will become, adults by the end of the event must have completed YPT within 2 years of the event's end date.
- Leaders must follow the Scouter Code of Conduct.
- No one-on-one contact: Adults cannot be alone with youth (in-person or online).
- Discipline: Must be constructive; corporal punishment, humiliation, and ridicule are prohibited.
- All Participants must uphold the Scout Oath and Law and follow Youth Protection policies.
- Appropriate attire is required for all activities.
- Prohibited behaviors include violence, bullying, hazing, discrimination, harassment, drugs, alcohol, pornography, inappropriate public displays of affection, sexual activity, and unauthorized weapons.

Chapters Camp as “Units”

- Youth males and females within a chapter will be considered separate, single-gender, “units.”
- Two registered adult leaders 21 years of age or over must be provided for each unit.
- Adult leaders are responsible for establishing the barriers and reminding Scouts that members of one gender must not enter the tent/housing of another.
- Although 18-20 year-olds must be YPT trained, they do not meet the age requirement for adult supervision.
- A registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over must be present for any activity involving female youth or female adult program participants.
- A single girl or boy may not be in the campsite alone. They must be with another same-gender youth with whom they can be “safety-buddies.” Chapters are permitted and encouraged to collaborate on this point.

Campsite Layout

- Separate sleeping areas are required for male and female adults and for male and female youth.
- Separation can be achieved through natural barriers, physical distance, or by the campsite being divided, so long as privacy is achieved for both adults and youth, as well as by gender.
- Youth sharing tents must be no more than two years apart in age. Solo tenting is permitted.
- Smartphones, cameras, mirrors, drones, etc., are prohibited in places or situations where privacy is expected.
- Restrooms/showers shall be separately designated or (scheduled, if unavailable).

- Leaders monitor but respect youth privacy.

Sleeping accommodations

- Youth sharing tents must be no more than two years apart in age.
- Youth siblings of the same gender may share sleeping accommodations regardless of age with permission from their parents or legal guardians.
- Adults and youth may not share tents.
 - 18-20 year-olds, of the same gender, may tent together as they are considered adults. They may not tent with scouts who are less than 18.
 - Exceptional circumstances may warrant a parent or legal guardian sharing accommodations with their same-gender or special needs child if the parent/legal guardian meets all leader registration requirements.

Buddy system

- The buddy system is designed to provide an additional layer of safeguarding by ensuring no youth member is alone and that a buddy can get help in an emergency.
- The buddy system is used whenever youth members are outside the line of sight of qualified adult leadership and specific activities where the buddy system is required for participation.
- Buddies are two and can also be three to prevent youth members from being alone.
- Buddy pairs must be same-gender
 - Where appropriate a third youth must be added (for a “truddy” group of 3).
 - “Truddies” may be mixed gender.
- Youth siblings of the same gender may serve as buddies regardless of age with permission from their parents or legal guardians.
- The adult unit leadership oversees and approves buddies.
- Except for siblings, it is recommended that the age gap between buddies be at most three years for non-sleeping activities but must be no more than two years for tenting.
- When exceptional circumstances warrant, a parent or legal guardian may serve as a buddy for their child’s Scouting activities, but youth buddies meeting the above criteria, if available, are always preferred.

Note: To avoid a separate female-only campsite, chapters who cannot meet “buddy” or adult supervision requirements are encouraged to collaborate with other chapters to achieve YP compliance. “Teamwork makes the dream work.”

Program Requirements

- All aspects of the Scouting program are open to observation by parents and leaders.
- The BSA does not recognize any secret organizations as part of its program.
- Hazing and initiations are prohibited and have no part during any Scouting activity.

Reporting Violations

- Mandatory reporting of abuse to law enforcement and child services.
- Policy violations must be reported to the Scout executive.
- Scouts First Helpline (1-844-SCOUTS1) available for abuse-related concerns.

- Call 911 if someone is in immediate danger.

Brotherhood

Brotherhood Counseling will take place on Saturday afternoon, following lunch. All those completing the Induction will meet at **1:00 PM** at **Coggins Pavillion** for Brotherhood Counseling run by TBD. Nimats shall be selected based on the brotherhood members present as staff during check-in. We will strive for 1 Nimat for every 8-10 people

Callout

At 7:30 PM Friday, all those present and ready will go to the Council Ring for the Brotherhood Callout and opening show.

Brotherhood Hike

The brotherhood hike will be led by TBD beginning at 9:35 pm on Saturday

Candidate Meeting & Cracker Barrel

At 8:40, all present members will meet in the dining hall for a cracker barrel and candidate meeting. This will also be when candidates are split up into their groups and do a meet and greet with their elangomats. Candidates should come prepared with everything they will need for the ordeal.

Pre-Ordeal

The Pre-Ordeal ceremony will be conducted at the Woodbadge ring

Ordeal Ceremony

The ordeal ceremony will commence immediately following the elections on Saturday night. The ceremonies team shall have dinner as early as possible to allow for an earlier ceremony. After eating, they shall be allowed time for one practice run-through. Immediately after the conclusion of the practice, the first group of candidates will set out. The next group will set out 30 minutes later on a walk of a longer distance. (If Applicable)

Candidate Bed Down

Candidates will be bedded down at the Alpine Tower (Adults) and the High COPE Course (Youth M & F) with their elangomats. Elangomats will set up their bedding, AND SASH first, and will proceed to individually direct each candidate to their individual bed down site. Prior to going to sleep, each elangomat shall check on their crew members and radio in their status.

Inclement weather bed-down sites will be Campsites w/activity shelters if required.

Candidate Wake Up

Kitchkinet (not elangomats) will awaken candidates with at least one member of the bed down crew. Each crew will meet up, take a headcount, do the morning talk, and proceed to breakfast. Staff breakfast should be after the crews set out for worksites.

Candidate Breakfast

Candidates will head to the Williams Family Pavilion after dropping off their gear in their chapter campsites. Candidates will be given SOA 3 and will eat at Williams Family. They will then head to the quartermaster and collect the tools for their assigned tasks.

Worksite Distribution

Each elangomat will be given their task list at Saturday Breakfast and will pick up supplies on the way to the worksite after breakfast. Adults will travel around with water jugs. Kitchkinet and Chapter/Lodge Leadership will visit all job sites and assist for 5-10 minutes a couple of times throughout the day.

Lunch

All crews will remain at their worksites for lunch. They will report on task progress and additional needs. Lunch should be just long enough for everyone to eat and use the bathroom before returning to work. If needed, tasks may be adjusted at this time.

End of Work

All crews will clean up their worksites and return tools to QM. They will then proceed to their campsite to get into uniforms while continuing to maintain the challenge of Silence. Though they don't need to be worn, candidates shall be encouraged to have long pants with them as well as money for the lodge box.

- Lodge Officer Elections
- Only active (dues paid) youth members (<21) may vote in an OA election.
- Candidates for Lodge Officer positions must
 - o Be active youth members and remain so through 05-16-27
 - o Submit their letters of intent and Unit Leader endorsement to the Lodge Adviser or their designee by Friday midnight. (Lodge Chief candidates may post their letter for all to read.)
 - o All nominees for lodge office must either be
 - a declared candidate approved by the Lodge Adviser before the election or
 - approved by the Key 3 if not declared and approved before the election in order to become a valid candidate.
 - o Procedural rules covering the election process will be explained at the time of the election.
 - o Lodge Officer Installation
 - Newly elected officers will be installed and take office at the Sunday business meeting.
