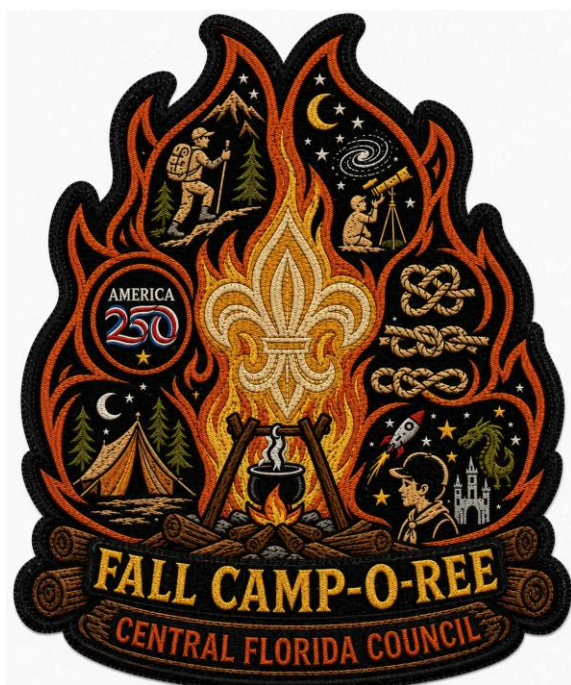

Check In Procedures

- Please have a unit leader be the first to arrive, as the campsite assignment and registration packet will be given to the first arrival.
- The roadway through camp will be well marked, but please stay within the lanes.
- Parents can drive to the campsite and drop off gear, then follow the same route back to the gate.
- The vehicle attached to the Troop trailer can remain in the campsite.
- Leaders who are remaining for the weekend are asked to drive back towards the exit, and the parking area will be marked (along the Highbanks Rd side of the property). Vehicles should be moved to the parking area as soon as they are unloaded.

Camp Rules

- Camp HQ will be the first campsite next to the playground.
- Medical issues should be handled at the Troop level first. If the injury needs additional attention, contact the Medical Officer or HQ for assistance.
- The campground is used throughout the year as sports fields. No holes should be dug or ground fires.
- Scouts are to use the portable toilet facilities scattered across the property. The permanent bathroom facilities in the pavilion are for adults only.
- There is potable water available at the north end of the pavilion (past the adult bathrooms).

SPL/Leader's Meeting

- There will be an SPL/Leader's meeting at 9:00p at the Pavilion. Please have the youth leader and an adult leader representative present as the final advancement and gaming schedule will be distributed, along with announcing any changes to this Plan Book.

Advancement Descriptions

- Scouts will have several options for their morning activities. The primary activity will be completing partial merit badges they have open. A map will be provided showing the location of the counselors that are available. Please send your Scouts with blue cards, so the Counselors can mark down what was signed off during this session
- For "newer Scouts", there will be an area they can work on Scout Skills through the First Class Rank. Scouts who complete requirements will be given a form signed by the lead instructor, listing which items were completed. If your unit has a "spare" leader, they can also attend and sign the Scout's handbook at the time.
- There are two merit badge classes currently scheduled, for Scouts who want to complete (or almost complete) an entire Merit Badge this weekend. Geocaching and Radio. To participate in these classes, Scouts must be present when the class starts (immediately after opening flag). Scouts need to bring their own chairs.
- There will be two Life-to-Eagle seminars for Star and Life Scouts to attend, so they will have time to both have merit badges signed off and meet with the District Eagle Representative. The Scout can also meet individually with the Eagle Representative to discuss project ideas or answer specific questions.

- Scouts who choose not to participate in any of the advancement activities should coordinate with their Scoutmaster to have a task within their campsite, so they don't distract the other Scouts who are trying to advance.

District Spirit Award

- As part of the District Spirit Award, there will be scored games and competitions to determine the winner who will hold the plaque until the next Camporee.

Afternoon Games

- The games are designed to provide a standardized score, so Patrols of various sizes will be averaged to determine an equivalent result. Points will be deducted if all registered youth are not participating.

Campsite Competition

- During the day, your campsite will be "inspected" for:
 - General cleanliness and order
 - Gateway related to theme

Cooking Competition

- On Saturday night at 6:30p, your SPL and Troop Dinner Cook should report to camp HQ with a plate of dinner. This should be the normal meal your Troop is eating, and not something specially prepared for this competition. The youth will provide a small plate for tasting. Scoring will be done by a local executive chef, who is also a Cooking Merit Badge Counselor.
- The dish will be scored on:
 - Originality of menu items
 - Difficulty to prepare dish
 - Variety of side dishes (my plate requirements)
 - Plate presentation

Explanation for how the menu item was developed and how it was cooked
Ability to name the ingredients and explain how they contribute to the meal
Overall taste

Campfire Show

- The campfire show will be hosted by Micco-Tomokee Chapter and will include skits, songs, and concluding with a call out ceremony for the District.
- Troops should be prepared with a skit or song, and the SPL will be asked about it during Friday night's Leader's Meeting (to ensure the skits/songs aren't duplicated among Troops)

Cracker Barrel

- After the campfire program, Scouts will retreat to the pavilion for a camp wide cracker barrel. Troops will be sent a list of preferred food items to bring and share.

Check Out Procedures

- When your Troop is ready to leave, please send a representative to camp HQ. Staff will inspect your vacant campsite for cleanliness (should be cleaner than how you found it) and provide your patches and any other distributions. All trash should be packed out, as there is no dumpster on property for our use.
