

Talking Points for 2020 Webelos Woods: Monster Island: All Out Attack

- REGISTER NOW!!! **Early Registration for Webelos is \$16 per scout and \$8 for their parent/guardian and concludes midnight January 3rd** and then increases to \$21 per Webelo and \$13 per adult. Registration for BSA Scouting Troop scouts and parents/guardians is FREE (register as STAFF).
- There will two (2) Friday evening complimentary Cracker Barrel/campfire programs; one for the parents conducted by Boy Scout leadership and Webelos Woods staff and one for the Webelos and AOLS conducted by Boy Scouts
- Camping with Boy Scouts and developing and/or enhancing Scout skills with hands on experiences and networking with the troops will be the focus of this weekend event. Come out Friday and Check-Out Sunday for the full experience
- Webelos and AOLS will have hands on learning opportunities Saturday morning and spend Saturday afternoon in a variety of competitions and challenges (a lot of fun has been built into the event – a good time is pretty much guaranteed)
- There will be a camp-wide catapult competitions between Webelo Patrols and Scout BSA Troops
- Saturday evening will showcase dinner and dessert competitions, gateway and campsite judging

- Patrols for Webelos and AOLS will be assigned Saturday morning; Patrol Flags will be provided
- Godzilla is the theme and Boy Scout units can pick their monster (any monster) and create a patrol flag, Unit leadership will need to contact the Event Chair, Harvey King or Lydia Gregg to advise them of the troop's choice to avoid duplication
- Boy Scout Troops will host an 'Open House' style Cracker Barrel Saturday night to encourage visitation
- Troops are invited to astound and amaze the Webelos with their scout constructed catapults or trebuchet. Troops may join the Catapult Competition on Saturday afternoon. The Webelos and AOLS will be constructing their during their morning classes.
- Be prepared with a skit for campfire program Saturday night
- Scout's Own Ceremony concludes the event Sunday Morning
- All units are responsible for their own food and food prep with the exception of the Cracker Barrels at Friday night's Fireside Chats for Webelos and their Parents/Guardians
- Troops are asked to participate by taking on an activity, being a Patrol Guide, teaching a class/skill, taking charge of camp-wide games or the Friday night Fireside Chats or Saturday night campfire program or the Scout's Own service.
