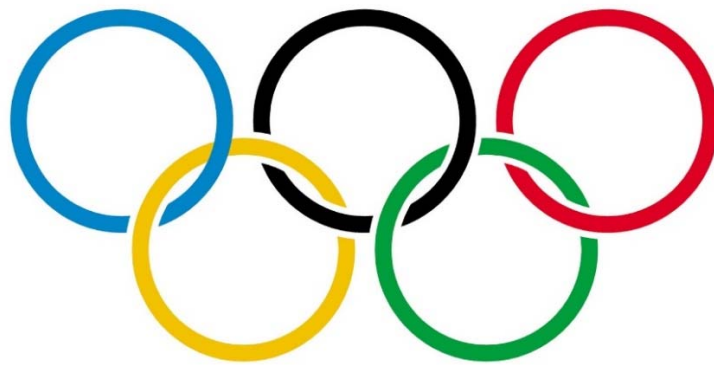


2021 Riverside District Camporee Leader Guide

Need to Know:

- Potable Water must be brought with your unit. Each Scout must carry a water bottle with them.
- Troops must bring their own supplies to build a catapult. See event description for details
- Some events will be held at the Troop level, some at the Patrol level, and some at the Individual Level. Please ensure all Scouts get to participate in events.
- Scouts are strongly encouraged to show your Troop Spirit by wearing their Troop T-Shirt throughout the weekend. Just like Olympic athletes wear the uniform for the Country they are competing for.
- All trash must be packed out by your unit.

Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts

Due to COVID-19, Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts will not be able to attend the 2021 Riverside District Camporee.

Olympic Events

Discus Throw

Each patrol will use a lifesaving ring to rescue a victim from drowning. The patrol to rescue their victim the quickest, will receive the gold medal.

Shot Put

Each Troop will build a catapult to launch a 16oz bean bag. Catapults must be built using poles that are lashed together. A single bungee cord may be used if desired, there is a small penalty if using a bungee cord. A target will be located approximately 25 feet away. Each Troop will have 3 shots. Scores will be based on accuracy to the target. Troops are responsible for supplying the materials needed to build your own catapult.

Chariot Race

Each Patrol will compete by building a stretcher (Chariot) and carrying one of their patrol members (Patient) through a short course. At checkpoints through the course, Scouts will use their First Aid skills to treat their patient. All supplies will be provided.

4x10 Meter Relay

Each Patrol will compete in a knot relay. Scores will be based on time to complete all 4 knots correctly.

Marathon

Open to any Scout that wants to participate. The race will be approximately 1 mile.

Biathlon

Using teamwork skis, teams of 4 will travel through a short obstacle course. At checkpoints in the course, teams will use nerf guns to clear targets. Scores will be based on time to complete the course and accuracy of clearing the targets. Each patrol can have 1 team participate.

Torch Run

Using Flint & Steel, fire building materials provided, and tinder provided by the patrol, each patrol will build a fire to burn through a string suspended 12 inches above the surface. Limited fire building materials (kindling) will be provided to each patrol. Patrols will provide their own tinder which must fit in the container provided. Scoring will be based on the time to complete the task.

Rowing

Using a “land” canoe, four members of each patrol will compete in a race to safely move all participants to the other side of the “lake”. Scoring will be based on the time to complete the course.

Golf

Scoutmasters (Or their Representative, 1 per Troop) will build their own golf club using sticks, rocks, and rope. No store-bought items except rope. Bring supplies with you. Using your club, we will have a longest drive competition.

Iron Chef

Each Patrol will be presented with 3 secret ingredients. (1 meat, 1 vegetable, 1 starch) Ingredients will be available for pickup starting at lunch time and need to be turned in by 6pm. Dishes will be judged on appearance, creativity, and taste.

Olympic Village Inspections

Troop campsites will be inspected and scored for proper setup.

Safety

COVID-19

Each unit is responsible for providing their own supplies to safeguard their Scouts and Leaders. (Disinfecting wipes, masks, hand sanitizer, etc.) The common items used at each event will be sanitized between groups. Hand sanitizer will be available at each event. Masks will be required in areas where social distancing cannot be maintained.

Temperature checks will be performed during check-in. Each participant is also required to have a completed Precheck Form. Wrist bands will be issued once

these requirements are complete. If a participant leaves the camp, their wristband will be surrendered and they will be required to complete a temperature check and precheck form to re-enter camp and receive a new wristband. Participants are discouraged from leaving camp.

Due to COVID-19 precautions, this event is open to Troops and Crews only. Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts are not able to attend.

Hydration

Each Troop is responsible for providing their own hydration for the duration of the campout.

Buddy System

Scouts must adhere to the buddy system at all times.

Fires

No ground fires are permitted in the Troop Campsites.

Parking

Vehicles will only be allowed to park in designated areas.

Check-In

Upon arrival, check-in will take place prior to entering the camp area. All participants must stay in their vehicle until instructed otherwise. Masks must be worn during check in and temperatures will be taken upon arrival. A pre-check form will be required for each participant at check-in. Units are required to bring a current Annual Health and Medical Records, Form A & B, for each participant, youth and adult.

Check-Out

Once ready to depart, Units will checkout with the Campmaster for area inspection and to receive patches for the event.

Registration

There is no cost for this event, the cost is included with the Council Activity Fee for 2021. However, registration is required. The registration deadline will be strictly enforced. There will be no walk-in registrations. Please register for the event using the following link.
