**MEDICAL FORMS** - Each unit is responsible for having medical forms for ALL ATTENDEES AT CAMP. This form can be found at: <https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/ahmr/>

**WHAT TO EXPECT AT CHECK IN:** Check-in will start Friday evening at 5:00 p.m. at the admin building. If you arrive prior to 5:00p.m. on Friday, you will be asked to wait at the gate. Check-in will be done by unit leader. Unit leaders will be responsible for keeping their members medical forms on site. We will not permit units to campsites until a designated leader has checked in. After check-in is complete the unit will be directed to their assigned camp site. Campsite assignments are not available until the leader arrives at camp. VEHICLES WILL NOT BE PERMITTED IN CAMP SITES. TRAILERS CAN BE LEFT IN CAMP WITH VEHICLE ATTACHED.

**FIRST AID:** Medical emergencies should be directed to the First Aid Station during the Event. After hours, contact one of the camp directors. Minor first aid should be handled at the campsite.

**WHAT TO WEAR:** Field uniform is required for opening/closing flag ceremonies, campfire program and Scout's Own. CLOSED TOE Shoes is required by ALL ATTENDEES – FLIP FLOPS, SLIDES, SANDALS, AND ANY OTHER OPEN TOED SHOES WILL NOT BE PERMITTED ON ANY ATTENDEE. You will be asked to return to your camp site or leave camp to get adequate footwear.

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**Suggested cooking items to bring:** Units will be cooking food provided by the camp at their camp sites. Raw food will be delivered by camp staff to each camp site. Scouts will be assisted by Troop Guides to cook their own meals. Each unit will need to bring cookware and mess kits or items needed for the scouts to eat at their campsite.

Camp stove, propane, fry pan or flat griddle, cooking utensils, large pot for mac n cheese and one for chili.

Each patrol will be feeding approximately 16 people – 8 scouts and 8 adults, the number may change based on the number of participants but will be no more than 16. We will have some disposable utensils and dishes for those who do not have a personal mess kit, but we will be limited. You can purchase a full mess kit at Walmart in the camping section, the scouts will be able to use them when they cross over into their troops.

**\*\*If your unit doesn't have cooking equipment, please let us know when you arrive at camp. \*\***

**GATEWAY BUILD:** Each patrol is encouraged to build their own gateway. This could be lights, wood, a banner etc. Whatever the scouts would like to use to create a walkway into their "site". Winners for all competitions will be announced at Campfire program. We encourage scouts to bring items from home that they can use to contribute to the gateway.

**CAMP AMENITIES** include flushable toilets, potable water, outdoor showers with hot water and pavilions with tables and seating.

**CHECK OUT** You will be required to maintain and remove your own trash out of camp. We have a dumpster you may utilize at the end of camp. A staff member will be around to inspect your site. Check out will begin promptly after Scout's Own and breakfast on Sunday morning.
