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

INTRODUCTION



This Guide contains the information your Pack/Family will require to have a successful and fun time at this year's Cub Adventure Camp. Be sure to read all the information carefully as we expect all participants to act in accordance with the best of our Scouting Traditions. The Pack Representatives will be notified in advance of any changes. The Cub Adventure Camp is a Family Event. Its focus is on the Scout and his family to have a fun filled weekend while the Scout learns the fundamental of "Do Your Best". We expect all leaders and parents to supervise their Scouts and siblings maintaining safetyand discipline always.

PACK REPRESENTATIVE

Registration will be available on the council website; links will also be posted on district websites and Facebook pages. Packs need to register as units only, in the event a unit does not wish to register but a scout family would like to attend they can register on their own. Please ensure a **correct** e-mail address is included on the roster so the assigned Pack contact for Cub Adventure can get all necessary information.



REGISTRATION FEES AND FORMS

The registration fee is \$25.00 for each person and families of 5 or more are \$110.00. Children ages 4 and below are free. Registration will include a Cub Adventure Camp Patch, 2 nights of camping, and meals (Saturday Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner, & Sunday Breakfast). An Official Event T-Shirt with logo will be available for \$10 by preorder only by March 23rd. Units are responsible for registering their pack either online or at the Council Office in Tampa by close of business day on Monday, April 2nd. If you do not pay by the April 2nd deadline patches will not be guaranteed to any scout, sibling, adult or Staff! After March 23rd T-shirts will not be available but you may still register online until April 2nd.

REFUND POLICY

Unless otherwise specified, all requests for activity registration refunds need to be in writing and received in the council service center at least fourteen (14) days prior to the activity. A twenty percent (20%) service charge will be assessed, unless the registration fees are being transferred to another activity in the same calendar year. Requests for refunds received less than fourteen (14) days prior to the activity will be considered for the following reasons only: * Personal illness of the registered participant * A family emergency preventing attendance The same 20% service charge will apply. If unable to notify us within the 14-day period, these types of refund requests will be granted an extra seven (7) days following the completion of the activity. Again they must be made in writing and submitted to the council service center. After that time the activity accounts will be closed and no more refunds will be given.



STAFFING

If you would like to be on staff you will register online as well. The staff option will be available, please be sure to mark this if you are an approved staff member. The staff fee is \$10.00 which includes two nights of camping and four meals. Staff t-shirts will be available to order until March 23rd for \$10.00.

PERMISSION AND MEDICAL FORMS

The permission form is integrated with the required medical forms for any BSA event. Please have these forms readily available if needed. Each unit is required to have a medical form with section A and B and photo release form signed and dated for each individual adult and child attending the event. WHAT TO EXPECT AT CHECK IN


Check-in will start Friday afternoon at 4:00 pm. The following information must be submitted by the Pack representative at check-in:

- Updated Pack Roster
- Any Changes to the original roster submitted with registration fee.
- Confirm all medical forms are on site for all attendees.
- Any other missing information from registration.

NO VEHICLES LEFT IN CAMP

Vehicles are not to be left in the camping area. One vehicle per unit will be allowed at the unit camp site during unloading and check in. Any vehicles that are left IN camp after 9pm (unless other arrangements have been made with a camp director) may be towed at the owner's expense. This policy will remain in place for the duration of the Cub Adventure Camp. The safety of our members is top priority and any violation of safety rules will not be tolerated. Pack trailers are approved at camp sites as space is available. If space is needed for additional campers the trailer will need to be moved.

Camp sites will be assigned by pack please be prepared to share a campsite with another pack.





FIRST AID

Medical emergencies should be directed to the First Aid Station during the Event. After hours, contact the Camp Director. Minor first aid should be handled at the Pack's campsite if you have supplies.

PATCHES AND T-SHIRTS

All patches will be handed out after the director has inspected your assigned camping area. Inspections will begin after the Sunday Morning Flag Ceremony and Services. Please make sure all trash is removed, and your used site looks better than how you found it. Leave No Trace! Official event T-Shirts will be available for purchase through online registration only and these will be handed out at check-in when you arrive on Friday evening.

WHAT TO WEAR

The BSA Field uniform (Class A) is required for our flag ceremony on Saturday morning and evening, Saturday dinner, closing campfire and our Scout's Own interfaith religious service on Sunday morning. We encourage Pack t-shirts or other scouting t-shirts during the day at the activities. **Your Scout will be doing several physical activities during the day. We ask that all registrants wear closed-toe shoes at all times while at Sand Hill Scout Reservation.**
