Camp Fees

Fee for Winter Camp Youth \$160.00 (\$25 more after Dec 6th)
All Adults \$80.00 (\$15 more after Dec 6th)
Provisional Scouts \$25 additional fee
Fees go up \$25 after December 6th.
All fees must be paid in full by December 15th.

Staff and CITs

Staff and CITs (Counselors in training) will apply online at: https://tinyurl.com/FASR2021W

CITs must be a minimum of 14 years old, Scouts with a year of service as a CIT can be staff at 15. All other staff must be a minimum of 16 years old.

Adults and Unit Leaders

- > All rules are in place for the safety of the Scouts.
- > The best rules are the Scout Oath and Law.
- > Youth Protection guidelines must be followed by everyone at all times.
- ➤ Clothing should be appropriate. No explicit or suggestive logos or printing. Scout "Activity Uniform" is always best.
- > Tobacco use in designated areas only and out of sight of youth.
- ➤ Alcohol and any other controlled substances are prohibited.
- > Personal firearms and bows are not allowed on GTBAC properties.
- > Fireworks are prohibited on GTBAC properties.
- ➤ Remember we are leaders; set the example for the Scouts.
- ➤ Leave the Scouts to be themselves, and enjoy yourselves.

Provisional Campers

Provisional campers are youth coming to camp without the traditional formation of a Scout Unit. If your unit is not coming to Winter Camp, individuals can come as provisional participants. Please register as a provisional Camper. There will be a \$25 fee added to cover the expense of extra staff to lead these Scouts. Registration online can be done by individuals in the same unit. Units will be placed together. Proper leadership is defined as two BSA registered adults. Parent/ Scout pairs are provisional.

Camp Trading Post

The Flaming Arrow trading post is open daily and the schedule will be posted. Scouts and parents should plan on having some spending money for camp gear and snacks. The Trading Post accepts cash, checks, and MasterCard/Visa.

Leaving Camp

Any Scout or leader who leaves the camp property must check out at Saunders Hall. If a Scout is planning to leave camp, a "Permission to Leave Camp Form" (available by request) must be on file in the camp office. Scouts will only be released to adults listed on the form.

SPL and Adult Leader Meetings

SPL Meetings will be conducted as needed. There will be an adult leader meeting at 2:30 on the 27th at Wood Hall. Other meetings will be scheduled and announced as needed.

Buddy System

The buddy system is simply a pairing of Scouts that go to places together. The buddy system should be used at all times during camp. Everywhere the Scouts go they should be with their buddy, and an adult leader. No Scout should be seen alone in camp. As outlined in NCAP Standard HS-511 and the Guide to Safe Scouting..

Program Areas

All program areas, including the pool, lake, C.O.P.E. courses, climbing tower, rappelling tower, and rifle, shot- gun and archery ranges are off-limits when closed. No one is permitted to swim in, wade, or cross any undesignated body of water on the property.

Footwear

Closed-toe shoes must be worn in camp except when showering or at the waterfront.

Check-in December 27th

Check-in begins at 10am. Please do not arrive early or you will be waiting in the parking lot until 10 AM.

- ➤ A Flaming Arrow staff member will greet your troop at the parking lot and give further directions.
- ➤ One unit leader should begin the registration procedure at Saunders Hall. Each unit will be asked to confirm registrations and will receive class schedules.
- > Any changes to class schedules need to be completed at this time.
- Adult and youth Annual health forms (Parts A, B and C) will be turned into the Camp Medic at check-in.
- The SPL and Site Host will get the troop to start unloading their gear and transporting it to the assigned campsite. Vehicles are allowed to drop off gear, and return to the main parking area. Once at the campsite, staff will instruct you what to do.
- ➤ A camp tour will be given to everybody.
- ➤ Lunch should be brought. There will be a brief introduction at 1:30. Classes will begin promptly at 2:00 PM.
- ➤ An opening campfire will be held the evening of the 27th.

Check-out December 30th

Checkout documentation will be available starting at 3:00 on the 30th. It will include tracking sheets for each class your Scouts attended. Each troop should review all advancements prior to departure. Medical forms will also be returned in your packets.

Advancement Records will not be available earlier. If you leave earlier, advancement records will be available though the online registration system.

- ➤ **One** Unit leader will need to report to Saunders Hall to review all advancement records.
- > Site hosts will be in campsites to coordinate and confirm campsites are clean.
- ➤ Packing should be complete prior to bringing vehicles into camp.

Planning Information

December 27th thru December 30th Plan to arrive between 10:00am and 12:00pm for check-in.

- > Bring lunch or eat on the way the 27th.
- ➤ Make your plans early. Notify parents of all information.
- > Arrange for qualified two-deep leadership.
- ➤ Plan the program your scout wants to achieve. Copy and distribute the Merit Badge choices to your scouts.
- ➤ Handicap need requests must be made to the Camp Director by email at <u>jaysheri1976@yahoo.com</u> at least two weeks prior to arrival.

Meal Plan / Dietary Restrictions

The Greater Tampa Bay Area Council recognizes that there are many potential dietary restrictions as well as common diets (e.g., low-calorie and low-carbohydrate) and common food allergies (e.g., to gluten, citrus fruit, dairy, eggs, fish, nuts/ peanuts, and shellfish). Individuals will need to consider this and avoid such items in their choices in the dining hall. In addition, remember that the Food Team cannot feasibly plan for all specific dietary needs of all persons attending the event. **Therefore, all special dietary needs must be indicated at the time of registration**. Depending upon the special food requirements they may be asked to make their own arrangements to meet those needs by bringing their own food — just as they would bring their own medications. Any dietary requests made within 2 weeks of the event will not be able to be honored.

INDIVIDUAL CHECKLIST

Before your Scout attends Winter Camp, please make sure that all of these items have been completed.

- > Your scout has spoken with their Scoutmaster about merit badges they wish to take.
- > You have completed medical forms A, B and C in their entirety available here: https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/ahmr/
- > Your scout has completed any prerequisites required for the merit badges he will be taking. This will ensure his completing those merit badges.
- > Make sure your Scout has all of the appropriate equipment needed for Winter Camp.
- > All clothing should be appropriate for camp. No inappropriate graphics or print.
- > Closed toe shoes required at all times in camp. No flip flops, slides, or sandals.
- > Scout uniform (Scouts and leaders are expected > Jeans/long pants to wear full Field Uniforms (khaki button down ➤ Long sleeved shirt shirt, green shorts/pants) at all evening flag ceremonies and evening meals. Full uniform includes:

official shirt, shorts, socks, and belt.)

- > 5-7 pairs of socks
- ➤ Sweater/jacket
- ➤ Raincoat/poncho
- ➤ Extra underwear
- ➤ T-shirts
- > Two pair closed toe shoes
- ➤ Bath towel/washcloth
- ➤ Toothbrush/toothpaste
- ➤ Comb/brush
- ➤ Sleeping bag/bedroll
- ➤ Air mattress or sleeping pad
- > Pillow
- ➤ Flashlight/batteries

- ➤ Insect repellant
- ➤ Hat
- ➤ Scout handbook
- ➤ Individual program needs
- ➤ Chosen merit badge books
- > Medical form completed and signed
- Spending money
- ➤ Sunscreen
- ➤ Water bottle
- > Stationery, pen/pencil
- ➤ Portable Camp Chair for classes
- ➤ Face masks

Each Scout needs to take care of and safeguard his personal property.

ALL CLOTHING AND PERSONAL ITEMS SHOULD BE MARKED WITH THE SCOUTS NAME.

Electronic devices- smartphones and tablets are welcome at camp. There are a lot of valuable uses for them. They need to be used appropriately, at the appropriate time. Camp is not responsible for any damage or loss.

MEDICAL DESCRIPTION FORM



We are asking all campers who will be taking any kind of medication while at camp (prescription or nonprescription) to complete a **Medication Description Form**. This form is at the bottom of (**Part A**) of the Annual BSA Health and Medical Record. Please enclose all medications (enough for the time your Scout is at camp) in a sealed bag and send this with your Scout's Scoutmaster to camp. Please note, all prescription medications must be in a pharmacy labeled container with your child's name or their over the counter packaging.

TO ATTEND WINTER CAMP ALL YOUTH AND ADULTS ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE A CURRENT ANNUAL BSA HEALTH AND MEDICAL RECORD (PARTS A, B and C) COMPLETELY FILLED OUT. Please notice the signature line at the bottom of the page on (Part A) of the Annual BSA Health and Medical Record.

Due to COVID, all participants must have a completed Pre-Event Medical Screening and Hold Harmless Agreement to enter the camp. These can be found at: https://tampabayscouting.org/covid-mitigation-procedures
