THE PROMISE OF SCOUTING

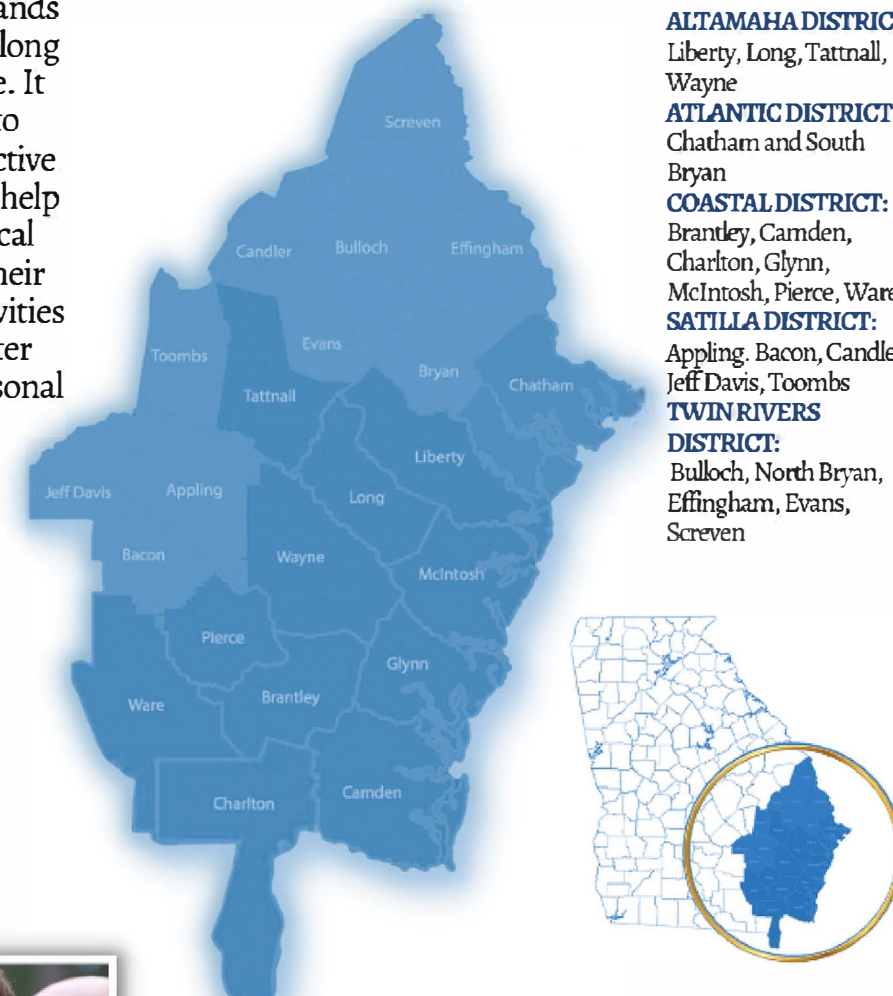

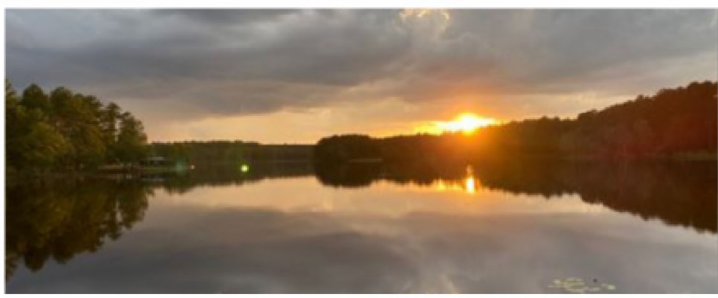

- 41% increase in participation at annual council events

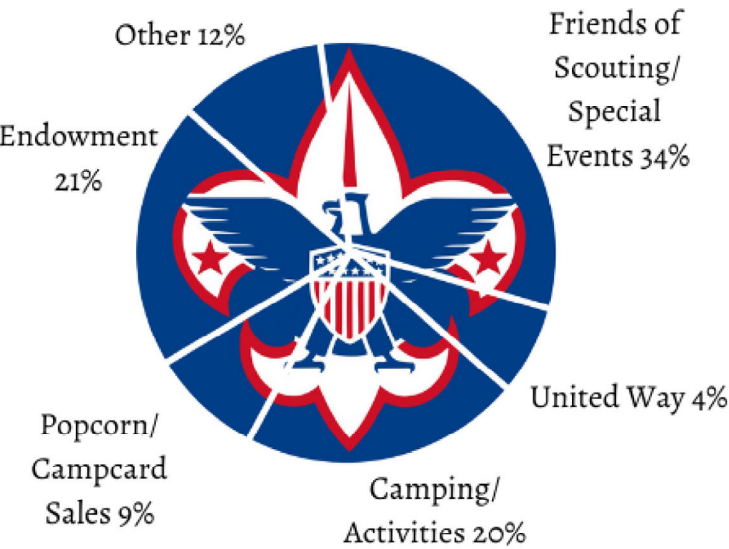


All of our programs and scouts are led by teams of trained and experienced volunteers who work tirelessly to serve the youth of the Coastal Georgia council.

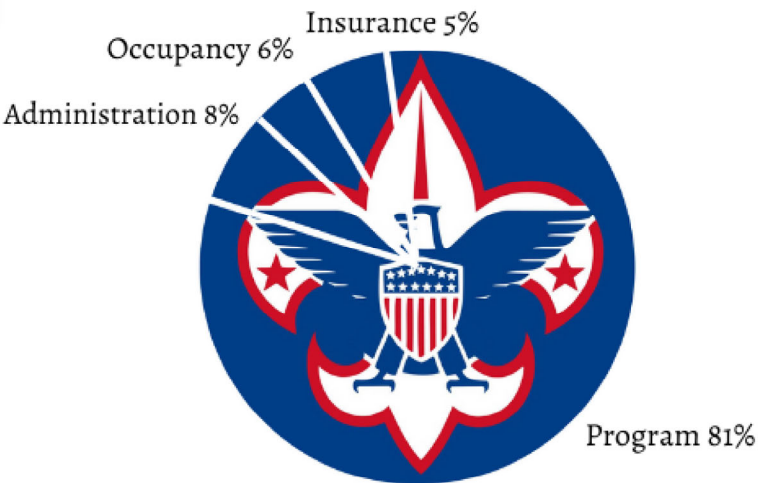
