Camp Castanea: Survivor 2024 Parent Guide

We are excited to Camp in Survivor FUN! When you arrive, someone will check you in and give you instructions on your campsite and how you'll get to it. Camp will open at 5:00 P.M. and you'll have the evening to set up camp and enjoy the camp. We have a gaga ball pit and tether ball if your scout wants to play. Please be courteous and take turns. All meals are provided for the Saturday activity day. Friday will be on your own. Please see the schedule below.

The first tribal council (campfire) we will go over the schedule and if there have been any changes to it. We will then sort everyone into tribes, and this will be determined by what buff (neckerchief) you unwrap. These buffs should be worn to represent your tribe. An adult leader for each tribe will be selected by each individual tribe. That leader will oversee keeping up with their tribes' points. At the last council meeting on Saturday night, they will participate in a final challenge and earn more points. The tribe leader will have the tribe's torch and be in care of it for the entirety of the camp. All tribes will move as a tribe and follow their leader. Each class will have different adventures and if the whole tribe is present will gain points for participation. At the last Tribal Council (campfire) each tribe will do a skit or song and then we will snuff the torches until only one remains! Let the fun begin!

This camp was started by Ken Whitson and his wife Mary several years ago and has been a joy to so many scouts since then! The name came from its very own roots!! Castanea is a chestnut! The chestnut orchard is on top of the hill. If you've not seen a chestnut before then stop by on Saturday and see one for yourself. At a certain time of the year you'll see the tough brown husk that surrounds the white nut on the inside. Love of the camp has brought several volunteers throughout the years and changes have been made and the camp has come to life! Super grateful to the Whitson's for their dedication.
