## Welcome to Camp Sol R. Crown

This guide is for information and safety while at the Cub Scout Camporee regardless if you are camping or just attending for the day.

#### Parking (for the safety of Scouts and others)

Friday night camping

- Only two cars per campsite parked overnight off the road.
  - Other cars parked at the entrance of the camp.
  - No car movement in camp during activities on Saturday (9:30 AM to 4:30 PM)

Cars arriving on Saturday or cars that need to leave camp before 4:30 PM Saturday will park just inside the camp entrance.

### Safety at Camp Crown

- There will be a brief leader meeting Friday evening at 7:30PM at the Jadel Center
- Emergencies
  - o Call 911 if needed
    - Camp address: 11651 304th Ave Trevor, Wisconsin 53179
    - Send someone to the camp entrance to direct to location
  - Notify the Camp Master
- Severe Weather
  - Notification with air horns three short bursts, repeated
  - Designated Shelters
    - Jadel Center
    - Miller Cabin
    - Fisher Shelter
    - Concrete Block Latrines
  - Bring a filled water bottle with you. Refilling will be available.
- Wear comfortable walking shoes.
- If staying after dark, bring a flashlight.
- Staff are here for both safety and to have fun.
- Always move about camp with a buddy or parent.
- Any injuries at camp are to be reported to the Safety Officer at the Jadel Center.
- For Day Visitors, a completed BSA Health Form QR code below.
  - Parts A and B only must be handled in at check-in.
  - (Not part C, no doctor's signature required.)
- For Campers, the unit leader should keep their unit's health forms.
  - Scan QR code below for blank forms
- Youths who are not Scouts who are taking part in activities need to complete the Non-Scout Activity Form.
  - Scan QR code below for form
  - Scouts and Parents need not complete.
- Shower Hours for Youth Protection
  - $\circ$  Youth 6:00 AM to 8:00 AM and 5:00 PM to 10:00 PM
  - o Adults 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM

- There will be Event Staffing at the Jadel Center during the entire weekend,

#### • Units that are camping

- Campsites will be assigned based on order of registration and unit size.
- Check in with the Campmaster before going to your campsite.
- $\circ$  Turn in a Unit Roster of who is camping per night to the Campmaster in the Jadel Center
- Receive your activity schedule.
- Complete the Check-In inspection and record all cleanliness and/or physical damage observations on the Check-In form, as applicable. Sign the form.
- Check-Out with the Campmaster or Caretaker. Complete the Check-Out inspection and record all cleanliness and or/physical damage observations on the Check-Out form. Sign the form.
- Saturday only visitors
  - After parking, check in at the Registration table by parking area.
  - Turn in your Health Form and Non-Scout Activity Consent Form (if needed).
  - Blank forms will be available
  - Receive your activity schedule.
  - $\circ \quad \text{Start having fun.}$

### **Getting around at Camp Crown**

While at camp please walk on the roads or trails

- Packs and Troops will be camping at some of the campsites in camp. Unless it is your campsite, please respect their privacy and do not enter without asking first.
- Activities areas will be identified with signage. All are welcome to visit, learn and enjoy.
- See attached map of Camp Crown for Activity areas.
- Special arrangements can be made if needed. See Camp Master at the Jadel Center.

### **Activities**

- Have Fun
- Note: This is not a Cub Scout advancement program event
  - Due to the date of the camporee, it is too late in the Scouting year.
  - $\circ$  This does qualify as part of the Summertime Fun Adventure
- Listen to instructions from staff.
- Activities are open from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM
  - Please note that staff do need to be fed and may reduce staffing then.
  - All activities are open for participation at any time.
  - Scouts and parents are expected to follow the activity schedule.
  - Please understand there may be a wait at some activities.
- Activities Guidelines
  - Biking
    - Personal bikes are only allowed on the roads of Camp Crown (not on the pump track).
    - Biking helmets must be worn at all times while riding a bike.
    - Helmets are available to use at the pump track or personal helmets can be used.
    - Elbow and knee protection are NOT provided.
    - Close toe shoes are required, long pants are recommended while riding a bike.
    - Only NEIC bikes can be used on the pump track

- Parents or others are not allowed to walk alongside riders at the pump track.
- Riders need to be able to ride the bike themselves.

#### • Climbing Wall

- Climbers and parents must follow all instructions from the climbing directors.
- Closed toed shoes are required, NO crocs.
- If parents want to help with their kid on the climbing wall, they MUST wear a helmet.
- Only 6 people are allowed in the climbing area at a time
- Additional non-climbers will limit the number of people on the wall.

#### • Shooting Sports (BB's, Archery and Slingshots)

- For all activities
- Shooting Sports Staff reserve the right to disallow/remove from any range, any
  participants who refuse to follow safety rules or whose actions are deemed as a safety
  hazard to other participants or staff.
- Cubs should have their adults with them to participate.
- Both adults and youth are expected to listen to safety briefings, follow all rules, and follow all staff instructions.
- Adults are asked to assist their youth during the activity as well, especially for BB's & Slingshots.
- Participants should ask for permission from staff prior to entering any range.
- Participants are allowed to bring their own eye protection if they prefer, prescription glasses count as eye protection.
- Closed toed shoes are required.
- Youth participants will be prioritized over adults.
- BB Rifles
- For Cubs, adults will be asked to sit with their youth to assist them and ensure they are being safe

#### • Pioneering Rope Bridge

- Pioneering Staff instructions must be followed or participants will be asked to leave the area.
- Closed toed shoes are required, NO crocs.
- The flow pattern must be followed with no exceptions.
  - Start at one end of the bridge and walk to the other end.
- Users should climb up the inside of one frame (away from the anchor system) and walk the bridge to the other frame.
- Users should climb down on the frame and not cross over the frame towards the anchor system.
- Other methods of mounting and dismounting may be directed by the staff.
- An adult or older Scout must spot the person on the bridge.
  - Extra attention for smaller participants.
- Only one person at a time on the rope bridge, this includes the frames.
  - Once the person is fully off the bridge, the next person can climb the frame.
- Saturday Evening Events
  - All are welcome

- Camp Fire at 7:00 PM by the Jadel Center
  - Inside the Jadel Center if bad weather (will be advised if needed)
- Please have you Pack prepare a skit or song to share at the campfire
- Please bring your own chairs down to the campfire
- Cracker Barrel (snacks only) after the campfire in the Jadel Center

### Food

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- A lunch will be available at the Jadel Center for those who wish.
  - Please include the lunch when registering online if desired.
  - Lunches will be available for 11:30 to 1:00
- Anyone who has a food issue (i.e. allergy or religious restrictions) must make their own arrangements.
  - If camping, check with the unit you are camping with
  - Bring their own food.
  - Packs are responsible for any meal planning and food preparation in their campsites.
- No evening food will be offered at the Jadel Center.
  - o Be aware there is very limited food service around camp
- If you prefer, pack your own snacks and drinks if you are only planning to spend the day.
