

## Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) Personal Equipment Checklist

Only official BSA uniform and parts are acceptable.

Be prepared for an overnight hike & living/working in an outdoor "wilderness" camp site

## REQUIRED (PLEASE properly ID ALL your clothing and equipment PRIOR to arrival at NYLT)

BSA Uniform headgear of your troop/crew/ship *	Wrist Watch (MANDATORY - NO CELL PHONE
BSA Uniform shirt short sleeves **	or SMART WATCH use during course!) – no internet!
BSA Uniform shorts or "BSA switchback" slacks (2 pairs) **	Alarm Clock (battery operated)
BSA Uniform socks (3 pairs minimum*) knee high or crew	Medium-size Backpack (for overnight hike)
BSA belt and buckle	Backpacking Tent (*waterproofed, lightweight
BSA Neckerchief, troop or team	2 to 4-person for overnight hike)
BSA Neckerchief slide	Ground cloth (10' X 10' waterproof or plastic)
Camping air mattress/foam pad	Knife, fork, spoon (BSA or equivalent)
Hiking Boots, waterproof (NO tennis/casual footwear allowed)	Canteen/Water Bottle (1 provided with fee)
1 Change of boots, as desired	Plate, bowl, cup (BSA Mess Kit or equivalent)
Raincoat, poncho, or rain suit (MANDATORY!)	Warm Sleeping bag/blankets (liner/sheets) – 30°F bag
Sweatshirt, jacket, or Jac-Shirt (for cold weather)	Flashlight, with spare batteries & bulb
Underclothing (3 sets minimum)	Bandanas (as needed)
Pajamas/camp warmer/sweat suit	Sewing kit (simple, for clothing emergencies)
BSA Field Uniform (1 course T-shirt provided with fee)	Personal, simple first aid kit (NO Meds Please!)
Work gloves (leather or similar for camp chores)	Ball-point pen; pencil (1 provided with fee)
Towel (for available hot showers)	Pocket knife (4" max)
Washcloth	(absolutely no sheath knives are allowed!)
Toothbrush and paste	Official BSA/Venture/Sea Scout Handbook
Compass (official BSA or equivalent preferred)	equivalent for reference
Hand soap and container (biodegradable "Camp Soap" OK)	Insect & Tick repellent (Pump, NO Aerosols allowed)
Required/prescribed and "OTC" medication:	Sunscreen (Tube or Pump, NO Aerosols)

**ALL medications**, including any/all "over the counter (OTC)" products **MUST be** in a **Zip-Lock plastic bag**, which includes a completed and signed "Medical Permission Slip". NYLT staff cannot dispense **any** antacid, allergy, or Tylenol **WITHOUT** your permission being listed on this form. **Note also**: NYLT STAFF does **NOT** stock any OTC products!

\*One NYLT cap is provided from registration, Only BSA or plain headgear/clothing is allowed

**NOTES** — **Most items can be borrowed from a Unit if scout does not own them.** Venture Scouts may substitute for appropriate authorized Crew Uniform. Everyone must be in "official" BSA Field uniform (the first five items on the required list) when they travel to/arrive at NYLT; this uniform is also worn most times during course. Participants may not use foot lockers or trunks at their outdoor "wilderness" campsite and must be able to carry all their equipment by themselves, for at least one mile. A standard patrol box issue is provided and will be assigned to each Patrol for their use during the course.

<sup>\*\*</sup> If for religious or medical reasons, long trousers/shirts must be worn, this is allowed.

## **OPTIONAL Items:**

Mirror (metal)	Comb
Wash basin (plastic or canvas; shower facilities are available)	Clothesline and clothes pins for drying items
Coat hangers to keep uniforms neat	Sharpening stone
Personal Scouting equipment	Olive long trousers (1 pair) **
Laundry Soap (if your son/daughter will need to do laundry)	Extra socks (2 pairs)
Sunglasses	Pillow/case
Extra prescription eyeglasses/contacts	Camping Merit Badge book for reference
Religious book(s)	Pioneering M.B. book for reference
Moccasins or sneakers (campsite wear only)	Cooking M.B. book for reference

Upon arrival to Camp Wabaningo, "contraband" and medicines will be collected by the Troop Guides and secured for the week. Medication will be administered by the medical staff/officer. All items will be returned for the bus ride home.

- No knives > 4"
- Money not needed
