CASE CLUES:

DATE: You will begin on Saturday, Feb. 1, 2024, at 1 pm. Check-in is available Friday, Jan. 31 at 5pm and Saturday 11 am to 12:30 pm.

PLACE: Camp Wokanda, 620 East Boy Scout Road, Chillicothe, IL

In addition to Scout Spirit, each person must bring the following:

- A completed BSA Annual Health and Medical Record, Parts A & B (no more than one year old). Unit leaders will retain these records throughout the event.
- A completed Peoria Park District Liability Waiver (attached)

Patrols will provide the following:

- All meals (except Saturday Dinner)
- Your mystery mobile (sled) – prefabricated sleds are acceptable (wheels are allowed as ground conditions dictate)
- Scoutmaster entry into the Dutch oven desert cook-off

Hosts will provide the following for the Saturday dinner:

- Closing Dinner – Mystery meat with vegetables and bread with butter. We will have a meatless option of olive oil sautéed vegetables and rice served with bread and butter. Plates, forks / spoons, cups, napkins will be provided

Remember...

Dress Warm! Winter boots (no athletic shoes), layered clothing, gloves, and hats are essential. This is an OUTDOOR event in January, so watch the forecast and dress appropriately. If you are camping, please review cold weather camping information in the Scout Handbook, Field book, and other resources.

PREPARING FOR THE CASE:

- Scout handbook in Ziploc bag (or suitable protection)
- Blanket large enough to make a stretcher
- First aid equipment to cover up to first class scout requirements
- Roll of twine
- Fire by friction and/or striker equipment (no matches or lighters).
- Natural tinder and fuel (nothing manmade; only material that can be found in the forest)
- Water
- Paper and pencil

PATROL CHALLENGES:

- **Ms. Scarlet in the Dining room:** (Fire building). A great dinner starts with a roaring fire. Build a fire to save dinner and maybe save the day.
- **Mrs. White in the Kitchen:** (Cooking skills) Something happened in the kitchen, but was it? Look for clues to determine what was made and how.
- **Billiard room with Professor Plum:** (First Aid) The professor's first aid skills are first class. Are yours? Be ready to show your skill to treat typical billiard injuries and more.
- **Colonel Mustard in the Ballroom:** (navigation/relay). Circumnavigating the Ball room (and beyond) will require precise map reading and navigation skills.
- **Mr. Green in the Conservatory:** (Lashing) Pioneering in a greenhouse? It seems audacious but use your imagination here. Mr. Green will accept nothing but the finest rope work.

Scoring

Each challenge will be scored individually with Patrols receiving marks for their achievements. While the top Patrols will be determined for individual challenges, the overall awards for the top three patrols will be determined by the combined stations score.

APPENDIX A – SCOUTMASTERS’ DESSERT COMPETITION

Rule 1: Only Scout leaders (18 or older) are allowed to enter the competition.

Rule 2: Entries must be entered clearly marked with Cook’s Name and the troop they represent. Troops may have multiple entries.

Rule 3: Provide a recipe card with name and troop number on back. Recipes are needed to allow anyone with allergies to know what is in the dish.

Rule 4: Desserts must be cooked on site in campsites or at the fire pit at Iroquois or behind dining hall and brought to the dining hall prior at 4:30 in time for judging.

Participation in the dessert competition will result in bonus points for all the patrols from that Troop that entered.

Scoring: Dishes will be evaluated and graded based on taste, appearance, and creativity. *Once dishes are judged and subsequently consumed by Klondike participants at dinner, please collect your pots / cast iron and serving utensils.*
