Volunteers

All units are expected to provide volunteers. (Sign up at registration or Friday evening cracker barrel). One of the highlights of the Winter Rendezvous is the Saturday evening feast. You can expect at least five main dishes, three sides and two desserts. This years feast will be prepared by Art Collins and Venture Crew 119. No one goes away hungry!

BOY SCOUT / VENTURING ACTIVITIES

BOY SCOUT / VENTURING KLONDIKE EVENT (Subject to change)

REGISTRATION AND SCHEDULING: Teams MUST register in advance to guarantee a start time (See registration form). Registered teams will be assigned a start time after arrival at the rendezvous. Teams will leave on regular, 10-minute intervals, beginning at 9am. Once started, the challenge stations must be completed without interruption. This means you cannot leave the course [for any reason] and then return. There will be a maximum time allowed to complete the course. Teams absent when their start time arrives will be sent to the end of the line and may not be able to compete. **PLEASE NOTE:** This event will run continuously from 9am - 3pm, ie, through the normal lunch break, to insure maximum participation. Please plan accordingly.

BASIC GUIDELINES: Assemble a team of 4-8 members. Select a Team Representative or SPL to attend the Friday 9 pm Unit Leader/SPL Meeting. Each team is required to have a Klondike-style sled. NO MORE than 2 teams should plan to share a sled. A list of equipment/gear needed for each sled or by each scout, will be handed out at the Friday 9pm Leader meeting. Remember - "Be Prepared". The sled can be adapted to weather and course conditions, but every sled MUST have traditional "runners" as an option. Other permissible sled options will be announced at the Friday night Youth Leaders Meeting by the Derby Chairman, based on course and weather conditions. All sleds must be able to safely transport any adult Scouter over the entire course. All derby stations will include mandatory scored or timed elements . The overall team score will be based entirely on the combined score for all derby events completed.

General Events for Boy Scouts, Venturers and Adults

Events run from 9am—12 noon and 1pm-4pm

One-Tough Voyageur (West Ridge)– individual obstacle course. Score will be based on time.

OA Fire Challenge (West Ridge)— Compete against fellow teams to build the fastest fire...bring your own natural materials.

Tomahawk Throw (P) – Individual best throws determine winner.

Snowshoe Race (J) – Individual best time on course determines winner.

Cooking – Youth members of unit must prepare 1 or 2 dishes. Categories are Vegetable, Meat, Bread or Dessert. Adults may supervise only. Judges will be looking for taste, appearance and effort put into your culinary best. Judging will occur 12 Noon to 1PM at the Dining Hall (**D**). Adult leaders may participate separately.

Shooting Sports – BB Rifle Dueling Tree (B); .22 Rifle Dueling Tree (I).

Period Dress – We encourage everyone to come attired in an outfit of their choosing from the time frame of the late 1700's to the early 1800's. Check in with the re-enactors near the admin building for judging.

Atlatl – (P) Participants will be instructed on how to use this traditional spear throwing weapon.

Cub Scout Klondike Volunteer Opportunity— All Scouts, Scouters and Adults are encouraged to sign up and volunteer at the Cub Scout Klondike event.

Cub Scout Klondike Derby: Participants/Teams must sign up at the 12:15pm participant/leader meeting located at the trail head between Rifle and Archery Range (I-J)]. The event will run from 1:00p to 3:30 pm. Running at 10 minute intervals. We have a sled for Cub Scouts to pull. You are welcome to bring your own sled if you like. 4-8 Cubs will participate as a group, pulling the sled through the course together. They will stop at stations where they will have to complete a task before proceeding to the next station. This is a timed event. Adults may follow along the course with their Scouts, but not assist. Adult volunteers will be needed.
