## Check-in and Campsites

Friday arrival: Scout Units may Check-in is between 4:00 pm and 9:00 pm. Check in will be at Entrance of Maumee Scout Reservation where temperatures will be checked, and health forms will be collected. Please arrive as a unit, as this will expedite the Check-In process.

Bring a copy of your Registration Receipt and Complete Unit Roster. You will receive info about your campsite location at check in.

Trailers can be taken to campsites and dropped off. If there is only one unit per campsite then they can leave the tow vehicle as well attached. All other vehicles must remain in parking lot.

# Health and First Aid Information

## First Aid & Emergency Procedures

An emergency contact telephone will be Maumee Scout Reservation's number. Should anyone outside need to contact anyone at Camporee. The number is 812-995-3272

- The First aid station will be at the Health lodge.
- All serious injuries or illnesses need to be reported to the First Aid team members.
- No Participant shall be removed from camp, for medical reasons, without contacting the First Aid team.
- Each unit should have a First Aid kit to handle minor injuries on their own.
- All prescription medications used by Scouts must be in possession of and dispensed by an adult unit leader and shall remain safe/secure/locked within your unit campsite.
- A completed health history with a parent or guardian signature, for each Scout attending, must be in the possession of the Unit Leader. Official BSA Health Forms are available on-line at <http://scouting.org/filestore/pdf/34605>

# Description of Events

Units are to build a boat out of corrugated cardboard. Teams are to be made up by patrols or in the case of a small troop then by troop. Your team of intrepid sailors will race across the lake (and try to stay afloat). Winners will be judged on best times. Teams should use their imagination on their boats. They can be as big, as decorative as the team wants.

Rules:

2-6 scouts per boat. This means as many as 6 people can be in the boat during the race,

Constructed from only corrugated cardboard. No sona tube or carpet rolls may be used,

Boats may be assembled, decorated using glue, latex paint, duct tape and caulk,

Boats may be any length. There is not a size limit on the team's boat,

Teams use paddles to power their boats, this can be canoe paddles, kayak paddles etc, and teams may bring their paddles or use some from the camp.

PFD's/lifejackets required when in the boats and on the water. PFD's will be supplied by the camp

Only repairs may be done the day of the race. Boats should be constructed and transported to the camporee,

Racing begins at 9:00 am

Awards for fastest heats, best design, scout spirit

Design judged by adult scouters

**Have fun building your boats and competing with the other patrols!**

Scout games and treasure hunt (scavenger hunt) available during race

# Campfires & Cooking Fires

Wood fires will be permitted within Camporee campsites in above-ground portable fire pits or grills only. Remember to bring a firepan.

Units should bring their own firewood to Camporee.

All unused firewood at the end of the camporee must be stacked by campsite shelters or near tree lines and not in the grass where the camp would mow.

- All meals to be prepared and done in unit campsites.

# Grey water policy

All grey water shall be filtered to remove food particles and other solids before disposal. Filtering can be achieved using a strainer and paper towels or coffee filters.

# Check Out on Sunday

- All units are asked to follow the "Leave No Trace" camping guidelines.
- Pack it in / Pack it out—Please do not leave remnants of your camp behind.

- All units must police their campsite and dispose of bagged trash properly.
- No trash is to be left in the Camporee and campsite areas. Trash maybe disposed of in the dumpster next to the dining hall. This includes the cardboard boats after the race.
- Administration Staff will inspect campsites before releasing units Sunday Morning
- Inspections begins at 8:00 am Sunday.
- Camporee staff will hold Camporee patches until campsites are clean and unit is ready to leave.

IMPORTANT – Only cargo vehicles will be permitted to enter the Camp Areas to load gear. This is for the safety of the Camporee participants and to ensure that traffic congestion is kept to a minimum so that units can pack up and leave smoothly on Sunday.
