## 1. EVENT INFORMATION and REGISTRATION

Throughout the “SUPER SCOUT BROS.” Camporee your patrol will embark on an epic quest to stop the Evil Bowser and save the camporee! The event will include the opportunity for two nights of camping, campfire program, target & range activities, and the opportunity to earn the Game Design Merit Badge!

Participating Scouts should bring their enthusiasm and gaming knowledge for this one-of-a-kind event that will encompass teamwork, creativity, and heroism.

**WHO** is to attend: All registered Scouts BSA members are welcome to attend.

All Adults must be current in their Youth Protection Training.

**WHERE:** CAMP REVEAL 1042 E Boonville New Harmony Rd. Evansville, IN 47725

**WHEN:** April 25-27, 2025

**PATCHES:** Each registered scout will receive a camporee patch.

**COSTS:** \$45 per Scout, \$25 per Adult Leader, \$25 per Event Staff. Additional \$10 fee on registrations after April 11, 2025.

**Costs include all meals, facility fees, Scout insurance, a camporee patch and materials for the various activities.**

- NO EXCEPTIONS DUE TO FOOD PURCHASES.

**UNIFORM:** Activity T-shirts (Class “B”) encouraged for daytime activities. Super Mario themed wear is highly encouraged! Long pants, hiking shoes/boots, and appropriate outerwear for weather are required. Field Uniform (Class “A”) is recommended for Flag Ceremony for Saturday dinner/ campfire, & Sunday morning breakfast fellowship service.

## 2. ARRIVAL, CHECK-IN, CHECK-OUT, and CAMPOREE GEAR

### a. CHECK IN:

- i. Friday night April 25<sup>th</sup> from 4:00-7:00 p.m. Central Time Zone (CST)  
-Under the Scouts BSA tent off of the main parking lot.
- ii. This is where you will receive your Campsite Assignment, Event Schedule and Rotation times. If you are unable to check in during this time frame, please contact the event organizers.
- iii. COPIES of Medical A & B forms should be kept with Scoutmaster.
  1. Must verify forms on hand at check-in

**b. TRAFFIC CONTROL AND PARKING:**

- i. On entering camp, please park in the parking lot and have ONE adult leader and SPL approach check in to check in the entire troop ( All remaining Adults and scouts should remain in the vehicle).
- ii. Designated areas will be available for parking. Since parking is near to campsites, please park and pack your belongings into your designated camping area. Wagons are welcomed.
- iii. Troop Trailers will not be needed at this camporee. All vehicles are to be parked in the designated parking area. No vehicles should be in the camping area.

**c. CAMPING:**

- i. Campsite assignments and a camp map will be distributed at check in.
- ii. Campsites will be assigned based on the number of Scouts and Scouters pre-registered. Your unit will be sharing a campsite with other unit/s in our council.
- iii. This will be JAMBOREE-style and tents will be set up in rows.
- iv. **No** individual troop fires will be allowed at this camporee per the properties request.
- v. Electricity is not available within the campsites. If you require electricity for medical reasons (i.e. C-pap), please plan to provide your own means of accommodating your needs. If you need assistance please reach out to BTC staff prior to the event.
- vi. **Male Units should be tenting in separated areas from female units**, likewise, youth and adults should be separated within the same camping site. Please use youth protection guidelines within camp.
- vii. No shower houses will be available during this event. The camp does have restroom facilities scattered around camp. Port-a-johns will be in designated locations around camp. Please remember a scout is CLEAN, including using the port-a-johns.

**d. CHECK-OUT PROCEDURE**

- i. After you have cleared your campsite of all unit and personal gear, and policed the area, your unit may check out with a Camporee Staff Member.
- ii. Please note that **Check-Out will begin AFTER the Reverence Fellowships (Catholic and Interfaith) breakfast Sunday morning.**

**e. TRADING POST:**

- i. The OA trading post will be open throughout the weekend, hours 7:30am-10:30pm. Bring cash to purchase treats of all shapes, sizes, and flavors.
- ii. The property also has an independently operated Ice-cream stand "Kelsey's Cone" that may be open at set hours throughout the camporee. Scouts are able and encouraged to bring cash for trading post &/or ice-cream purchases (if desired).

### 3. GENERAL INFORMATION

- SAFETY:** Troop leadership is responsible for the safety of the Scouts in their unit at all times. Reference the Guide to Safe Scouting before arriving.
- FIRST AID:** Minimal first aid should be handled by each respective Unit attending.
- In the event it is needed - **A First Aid Station will be available for more serious injuries.** The location of the First Aid Station will be communicated in the welcome packet at check in & again at opening flags.
- LOST & FOUND:** Located in the Trading Post.
- ATTIRE:** Scouts and Scouters are encouraged to wear their best Mario Brothers outfits and Costumes. Fake mustaches, toadstool hats, any combo thereof are encouraged! Let your creativity shine like a GOLD COIN! See "Uniform" section above regarding Field and Activity uniforms.
- CAMPFIRE:** Each Unit will have the opportunity to DESIGN a skit, song, run-on, or all of the above for our campfire program Saturday night.
- OA CALLOUT:** At the conclusion of the Campfire program, The Order of the Arrow will lead all scouts and leaders to the waterfront for an exciting and ceremoniously engaging "Callout" Ceremony.

  - Saturday- breakfast, lunch, & dinner
  - Sunday- breakfast
- Trading post hours 7am-10:30pm Central Time
