## Health Medical Forms

Cub scout day camp requires all participants to complete Parts A & B of the [Annual Health and Medical Record](#). All participants, scouts and leaders, must provide a copy of the health forms (updated within the last twelve months) to camp staff at check-in on the first day.

## First Aid

Any and all injuries must be reported to the camp director immediately. A complete first aid kit and AED is available on site, at the Main Shelter House.

## Youth Protection

It is Scouting America policy that all registered adults working with the youth within the program must have current Youth Protection Training. If you are not a registered leader within Scouting America, you may attend as a chaperone with your son/daughter. Packs should arrange to have at least two (2) Youth Protection Trained, registered leaders accompany your pack to camp each day. If a pack can't meet this requirement, let the camp staff know ASAP so that we can arrange to combine packs as necessary.

Parents, if you attend with just your scout, we will put you with another group to meet the 2-deep leadership requirements.

# Leader & Parent Guide

## Daily Schedule

Each day will begin with check-in. Upon arrival, come to the check-in station at the main shelter house. On the first day, you will need to provide your medical forms and any medications. Everyone is highly encouraged to pre-register! If you haven't, you may register at this time.

Check-in will begin at 7:30am CDT (8:30am EDT) each morning, and must be completed before our opening ceremony at 8:15am CDT (9:15am EDT).

You can find a complete schedule later in this document. All times and scheduling follow council time, Central Standard Time. Some important daily highlights include:

## How to Dress

Dress for the weather! Keep a close eye on the weather forecast and dress appropriately and comfortably. We will be outdoors and potentially getting dirty. Wear durable and comfortable, closed toe shoes. There will be a lot of walking and activities that require closed toe shoes.

There is no need to wear your class A scout uniform. You are welcome to wear any pack or previous camp class B shirts.

Our theme is the Wild West. Feel free, even encouraged, to dress for the theme and join in on the fun.

## What to Bring

As you will be traveling throughout camp, you must carry your items. Plan accordingly. Some suggested items include:

- Backpack
- Water Bottle
- Hat
- Sunscreen
- Bug spray
- Sunglasses
- Poncho / Umbrella
- Extra Clothing/Swim Clothes – Water activities are planned.
- Towel
- Camera

Sack Lunch – You are responsible for providing lunch and any other snacks or drinks each day. Plan appropriately for food, drinks and cold storage.

Medical Forms/Medications – This must be provided to camp staff at check-in one the first day.

Be sure to label everything that you bring with at least your name, if not also your pack number. We will do our best to return lost items to owners, but unlabeled items are difficult to return. A lost and found will be available at the main shelter house.

## Scout-like Behavior

We kindly ask and expect all participants, staff, and adults to follow the Scout Oath and Law during the event. The following are prohibited:

- Smoking (Traditional & Vapes/E-Cigarettes)
- Alcoholic Beverages
- Willful property damage
- Willful injury to another person
- Bullying, Hazing, Harassing, Arguing, etc.

This is a NO TOLERANCE Policy for these behaviors. Violation of these policies will be investigated and reviewed by the camp administration and council staff members and may result in your dismissal from camp premises, with no refund.


## Activities Meeting Requirements
