REGISTRATION

Register online at <u>https://scoutingevent.com/156-2020OARankUp</u>. Select which skills each scout needs to complete, and which sessions they want to attend. These choices are provided with the intention of not wasting a scout's time by making them go to a station with requirements they have already completed. You can group your scouts together in the same sessions; but registration is on a first come, first served basis with a limited number of scouts allowed in a session.



WHAT TO BRING

PLEASE PUT YOUR NAME ON ALL GEAR

- Units should bring their own tents and other camping gear
 * Cooking equipment is not needed, meals are being served *
- Day-pack
- Water bottle
- Scout Book
- Notebook and pencil/pen
- Closed toe shoes/boots and weather appropriate clothing (rain coat, hat, etc.)
 * This is a rain or shine event *
- If scouts are in:

Orienteering, bring a compass First Aid, bring a personal first-aid kit Tools and Firecraft, bring a pocket knife Rope work, bring a 6 ft. rope

Camp Courtesy and Rules:

- Scouts are to follow the Scout Oath and Law
- No fireworks, alcoholic beverages, or any other illegal substances
- No electronic games or equipment
- Wagons and carts are permitted to move gear to/from campsite
- Leave No Trace guidelines will apply at all times
- Campfires are permitted in designated areas and within fire rings only
- All medical incidents other than minor cuts and scrapes must be reported to event Campmaster
- Willful property damage or injury to another person is not allowed
- No interference with any staff member (bullying, harassing, arguing, etc.)

All vehicles except for staff vehicles must park in the main parking lot. This is to limit congestion and enhance safety. No vehicles will be allowed to stay in campsites.

HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT/TALENT RELEASE AGREEMENT


By attending this event, you agree to the following:
