

Old Ben Scout Reservation-Camp Protocol for Covid 19 Time period.



PLEASE READ CAREFULLY PRIOR TO RESERVING SPACE AT OBSR

These procedures shall be enforced by Scouting volunteers in coordination with the OBSR Campmaster Corp, and shall be applied to Scouts and Scouters at Unit events and at Council/District Activities.

The following facilities will be available for use: Campsites including Becker Point, Dining Hall, Dining Hall Restrooms, Shower Houses. Waterfront, with adequate verifiable supervision leadership of the swimmers.

	_ Pre-departure Screening must include self-reported temperature check at least one week in advance of
	departure and self-reported or Unit leader temperature check on day of departure. Reporting must be
	made to the Unit leader and reported on a Unit Roster provided. All participants must self-report
	Covid symptoms and if any symptoms are present they must STAY HOME. Symptoms can include sore
	throat, dry cough, fever, recent prior travel to Covid elevated area.
	Participants are to be delivered to camp by parent or guardian. One person to one person. No
	communal travel as a Unit. Communal travel participants will be denied entry to camp (family, sibling exception.).
	Use a Unit Roster to report. Unit Roster must be presented to the site team or Campmaster upon
	arrival at camp. Roster can be generated from Unit resources or a roster form will be available from
	BTC website when reserving camp use.
	_ Temperature check upon arrival at camp by site team or Campmaster in conjunction with Unit leader.
	Anyone with elevated temperature will not be allowed to enter camp.
	In-Camp reminders:
	 Sleeping should be limited to one person per tent, unless they are family.
	Here is a reminder about Youth Protection rules around this: In Cub Scouting, parents and
	guardians may share a tent with their family. In all other programs, youth and adults tent separately. Spouses may share tents.
	 Use safe guidelines for activities. (keep groups small-10 or less) Exercise care to keep
	out-of-group interactions to a minimum. Limit sharing of supplies and equipment.
	 On-going Covid monitoring of participants is required. If symptoms start, a participant must leave camp.
	 Isolation prior to leaving camp, if removal is needed.
	 No sharing of campsites with groups from other communities.

Provide at least two handwashing or sanitizing stations for campers.

Campsite recommendations:

- Unit needs to provide and check frequently to maintain supplies for handwashing.
- Shared equipment must be cleaned and disinfected after each use. This also includes all equipment used in food preparation and distribution.
- Unit must have one adult responsible for maintaining the cleaning and sanitation protocols for your area used. You will also be expected to work with the Campmaster with the cleaning of all common areas used at camp.
