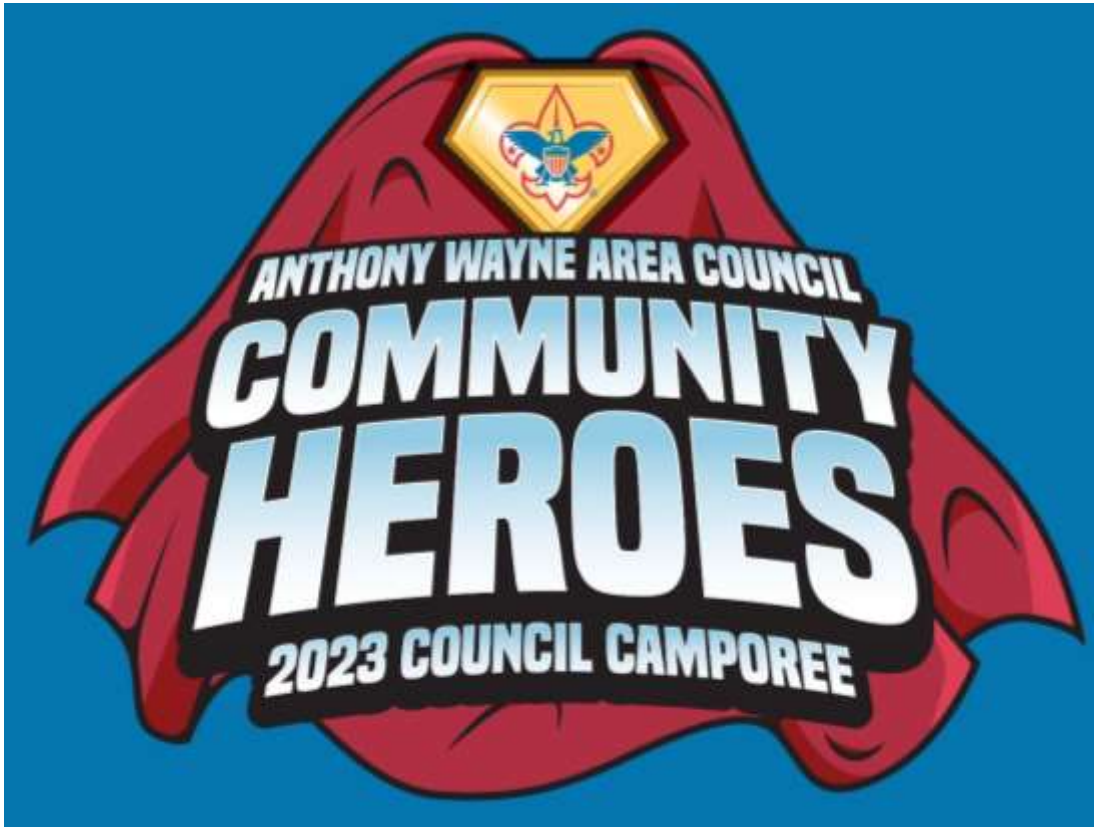


Leader Guide



General Camporee Information

Date: October 13-15, 2023

Location: Noble County Fairgrounds – 580 Fair St, Kendallville, IN

We will be using the Dowling Street entrance, Gate #4.

Check-In

Check-in will take place at the entrance off Dowling Street. Please follow signs. To keep check-in and traffic moving smoothly, only one adult leader, per unit, is needed to check-in.

Trailers & Parking

After checking in, you will be directed to your campsite. Trailers are permitted to be parked at the unit's campsite. Vehicles are not permitted to be parked at the campsite. All vehicles will

need to be parked in the parking area. For the safety and security of all participants and attendees, campsites will be closed to moving vehicles after check-in Friday and will re-open Sunday for check-out. If your unit needs to leave Saturday evening, please let a staff member know so the area can be secured. All participants who arrive on Saturday can unload at the parking area and walk their gear to the campsites.

Adult and Youth Leader Meeting

There will be a 9:30pm meeting on Friday night for **one** adult and **one** youth leader from each unit. This meeting will be held in the log cabin / headquarters building.

Fires

Only above ground fires are permitted. Under no circumstances should fires be lit on or in the ground. Should your unit decide to have a fire, please bring a portable, above-ground fire pit, and ensure the ground is protected. Units are responsible for their own fire safety materials, firewood, and kindling.

Water & Restrooms

Water is readily available for you to transport to your campsite. Restrooms are located behind the grandstand and throughout the fairgrounds. See map for locations.

First Aid

Unit leaders are responsible for having current health forms for all attendees. Camp staff will not be collecting medical forms. First aid will be located at the log cabin/headquarters. Please report any major medical incidents to camporee staff.

Storm Shelter & Severe Weather

In the event of severe weather, staff will direct you to a storm shelter on site.

Camporee T-shirt & Sweatshirt Pre-Orders

Shirts pre-ordered online will be available to be picked up at registration Friday evening and all day Saturday. Shirts will be distributed by unit only.

Camporee Uniform / Dress Code

Participants should wear BSA Field Uniform (Class A), council camporee t-shirt or sweatshirt, or activity uniform (Class B). Closed-toe shoes are required at all times.

Interfaith Worship Service

There will be an Interfaith Worship Service Sunday morning at 8:00am – all are welcome.

Meals

Breakfast will be provided only for participants camping Friday night and lunch will be provided on Saturday for all participants who registered before the 10/1 deadline. Participants will need to prepare the rest of their meals for the duration of the camporee.

Saturday morning breakfast – please send only 2 people per unit to pick up the breakfasts for your unit. Lunches will be served per-person. Tickets are required for lunches and will be in your check-in packet.

Meals provided are going to be cold meals only. Due to the nature of our camporee and limitations due to food preparation and storage, dietary restrictions cannot be accommodated. If you have dietary restrictions, please plan to bring your own meals. All participants are welcome to provide their own meals, should they choose. No registration discount will be given for units bringing their own meals. Dinner Saturday is not provided. No meals will be served on Friday or Sunday. **Meal pick-up location will be at the Prairie Farms truck.**

Volunteers

We have plenty of spots available for volunteers at the camporee! If you're interested in volunteering, see a staff member. Staff members will be wearing bright orange shirts.

Check-Out

Units will be required to check out with the Council Commissioners prior to leaving the camporee grounds. Principles of The Outdoor Code will be followed. All unit campsites will be inspected prior to the unit leaving.

Trash

Dumpsters will be available on site for trash.

Designated Smoking Area

The designated smoking area will be in the parking area. No smoking, including vaping, is permitted in any building or location other than the parking area or within sight of participants, per BSA policy.

All-Terrain Vehicle (ATV) Program

Participation and Hold-Harmless Agreement

Camp Chief Little Turtle, AWSR

Camp Chief Little Turtle, AWSR from the Anthony Wayne Area Council will be conducting an ATV program at camp. Scouts will be instructed how to ride on and drive an ATV. Scouts will be taught ATV safety and will drive on a training course, then on approved trails only. Scouts will be on the unit individually and in control of the power and brakes. Scouts will be required to wear a helmet, goggles, gloves, over-the-ankle boots, long-sleeve shirts, and long pants. Scouts are expected to abide by all safety rules and the instructions of the camp instructor(s).

I, the undersigned, give my child, _____, permission to participate in this program. I understand that participation in the activity involves a certain degree of risk. I have carefully considered the risk involved and have given consent for my child to participate in the activity. I understand that participation in the activity is entirely voluntary and requires participants to abide by the rules and standards of conduct. I release the Boy Scouts of America, the local council, the activity coordinators, and all employees, volunteers, related parties, or other organizations associated with the activity from any and all claims or liability arising out of this participation.

For safety, my child and I agree that he/she will do the following or he/she will be removed from the program. Because space is limited, any additional cost associated with participation in this program will not be refunded.

1. Complete the ATV safety class taught at Camp Chief Little Turtle Scouts Age: _____
2. Wear all required safety gear at all times on or around the equipment. Week coming to Camp: _____
3. Follow all safety rules provided in the training class.
4. Follow the instructions of the camp staff instructor(s).
5. Maintain control of the ATV at all times and remain within the speed determined to be safe by the camp instructor(s).
6. Be in full compliance with all local, state, and federal guidelines, including age restrictions and original equipment manufacturer standards.
7. Respond to the camp satisfaction survey from the Boy Scouts of America as it evaluates the ATV program.
