Camp Program – Camp Kateri at Camp Chief Little Turtle has a tremendous variety of activities so that the brand-new youth and the most experienced youth will each find some neat challenges to enjoy. Older Youth – try Project COPE, Welding & Forging, or Patriot Quest. Patriot Quest is a mini-high adventure program, Wednesday through Friday.

Program Areas:

AQUATICS: 2 hours a day is spent at Pit Lake, the former rock quarry is a crystal clear lake where all boating and swimming takes place. This program will not only help you beat the summer heat, but you will have a great time and earn some advancement! Swimming Badge may be worked on during lake time & each day you will have time of open boating & more.

FISHING: This program will cover requirements for the Fishing Badge at the dedicated Fishing Shack & shoreline area.

SHOOTING SPORTS: Always a favorite among youths & leaders, this program includes safety training in BB Guns & Archery. Along the way, youths will earn the Shooting Badge & Archery Badge. PIPA's get to enjoy Tomahawk & Knife throwing.

Evening Program – from our Opening Campfire provided by camp staff, to our Closing Campfire with songs & skits from Girls and their Troops, to special games and ceremonies, Girls are having fun! Be ready to play outside. Our focus is fellowship in the great outdoors.
