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MAKAHIKI INFORMATION

Makahiki, first held in 1967, is a collection of exciting water and land events with a Hawaiian theme. It is held on the 1st weekend in August every year at Lucerne Park and the Pike Lake Campground beach, on Pike Lake in Warsaw, Indiana.

Makahiki is a competitive gathering for registered youth in the various programs of <u>all</u> Scouting organizations. (SA, GSUSA, AHG, etc) Youth Participants must be <u>14</u> <u>years of age</u> (or have completed the 8th Grade) by the first day of the event. Units are expected to conduct themselves as proper Scouts at all times.

Check-in begins Friday around 6:00pm at Cabin 1.Youth and adult leader meeting will be held around 7:30pm. Opening ceremony around 8:00 pm. Closing ceremony and awards will be on Sunday shortly after all events conclude. (noonish)

Registration fees include all Makahiki events, Friday night Taco & Salad Bar, Friday evening gathering activities, Saturday evening Luau, Makahiki patch, and all awards.

Unlimited fun also included!

Enjoy fun & fellowship with amazing young people from across the Midwest and Great Lakes area!

A <u>minimum</u> of two qualified Adult Leaders 21 years of age or older must accompany the unit. Co-ed Crews must also have co-ed leadership. Unit Leaders are expected to be with their unit at all times, are responsible for the conduct of their unit at all times, are ex-

pected to follow the same guidelines set for youth, and are expected to set a good example.

Makahiki is a NO SMOKING/NO VAPING area for Youth and Adults

Non Scouting America Units must email a Certificate of Liability Insurance with their registration form/fees.

ATTIRE

Appropriate attire (not just swimwear) must be exhibited by all units. Shorts should be of an appropriate length. (if you have to ask yourself if it's appropriate, it probably isn't) <u>No bikinis for females or "speedos" for males.</u> Modest tankini's for females <u>may</u> be acceptable. Swim attire may need to be covered for some of the events.

Participants not adhering to this will not be allowed to compete until issue is corrected.

- Water shoes are *strongly recommended* for all events at the campground beach. Shoes required in Lucerne Park.
- It is suggested that units consider wearing a unit t-shirt.
- Bandanas received in check-in packet MUST be VISIBLE on ALL participants Youth and Adult at ALL times.
- ALI-NUI candidates will wear a special lei that will distinguish them from the other participants.
- Hawaiian dress is highly encouraged for Saturday's Luau.

MEALS

- Friday night taco & salad bar and Saturday evening Luau are both provided for all registered participants and are included in the registration fee.
- All other meals are the responsibility of the unit; grills and picnic facilities are available in the park.
- Meals may also be purchased at local restaurants: KFC, McDonalds, Pizza Hut and Subway are within walking distance. Other options are within a short drive.

LODGING

- Units are responsible for securing camping/housing for the entire weekend.
- All units are encouraged to take advantage of the *primitive* camping available at Lucerne Park. Cost is \$2.00 per person for the entire weekend! Bring your gear to camp out. Plenty of trees for hammocks, too!
- Be sure to indicate how many people in your unit will be camping on the registration form. Units that are staying "off-site" must give those details as well as their contact information to Makahiki Staff upon check-in.
- Male and female participants and adult Leaders must have separate sleeping quarters. (Youth Protection Guidelines)
- Bathroom facilities are located at Pike Lake Campground Beach and Lucerne Park. Full shower facilities are in the Pete Thorne Community Center Gym. Times for Youth and Adult showers are in the Unit packet, are posted at Makahiki HQ (Cabin 1), and on the door of the Community Center. *Please adhere to these times*. <u>Only 1 person may shower at a time</u>.
- Pike Lake (Modern) Campground and Fireman's Cabin (1/2 mile East of Lucerne Park) may be available. If your Unit is interested, Contact Warsaw Parks Department for info/reservation: 574-372-9554 Monday-Friday 9:00AM-3:00PM EST

EVENT INFORMATION / IMPORTANT STUFF

- Large Units may have more than one team. Accommodations can be made for units having less than number of required team members. Inquire at Friday evening adult/ youth leader meeting for details if needed.
- Life jackets will be provided and must be worn during all boating and canoeing events.
- Units are responsible for knowing the swimming skills of members. No swim tests will be offered. Adults from each unit will be utilized as lookouts during all water events.
- Some events require physical exertion. These are marked with an * on the event description pages. Unit leaders are responsible for the safety and health of their youth. Unit leaders may need to limit participation of their members based upon, but not limited to, physical and medical restrictions, limitations and/or physical condition. Unit leaders should be aware of their Scout's limitations and restrictions.
- Any event/location changes will be discussed at the Friday night or Saturday morning Youth and Adult Leader Meetings. Changes are at the discretion of the Makahiki Committee. *Remain flexible Change is inevitable!*
- Rules for the events are explained before the unit starts the event. These are the rules by which the event will be judged. (while the event may have been done at a previous Makahiki, the rules may have been adapted to change the event.)
- Scores are tracked on a judging sheet, which is tallied into the final event results. Judges will NOT share the event scores. Please don't ask them!
- Any issues with event judging or rules should be directed to the Makahiki Chair <u>by the Youth Leaders of the Unit</u> for review . Decisions of the Makahiki Committee and/or Chairman will be final.

OBSTACLE COURSE/ CASTLE CONSTRUCTION

4 Member Team. Timed Event. 2 members complete the obstacle course while 2 others build a sand castle (with specific requirements).

ALI-NUI INTERVIEWS

All Ali-Nui (King/Queen) Candidates need to report for their interview immediately after Hungry Hawaiian.

HUKIHUKI (TUG-O-WAR)*

700-pound limit per team. (800 lb. all female units) Move center flag past your starting pylon.

BUCKET BRIGADE*

4 Member team. Timed event. Fill the large barrel one leaky bucket at a time.

MOVE THE OCEAN

Team members will be relaxing on the sunny beach of Pikekiki and will share the tropical ocean waters with their teammates relay-style.

MARLINSPIKE

4 Member Team. Know Your Nautical Knots, Lashings, and splices. Judged on speed, accuracy and completion of task. (Jiffy whip, larks head, Backsplice, and other sailing knots) Use these knots and others to raise and maintain an object suspended off the ground.

CANOE TUG-O-WAR*

2 Member Team. Pull opposing canoe over dividing line.

HUNGRY HAWAIIAN

3 person teams compete in this human version of the popular Hungry Hippos game

COMPASS RELAY

Team members take turns identifying compass directions...Do you know all 16?

TACKY TOURIST*

Team members get dressed up in their finest Hawaiian tourist garb. All props provided.

DRILL & MANEUVERING

Time Limit: 3 minute *minimum*; 5 minute *maximum* Time keeper will blow one short whistle burst at 3 minutes and 2 short whistle bursts at 4 minutes. One long whistle shall be blown at 5 minutes, if still performing.

Movements the judges will be insuring are performed by your unit are listed, in no particular order, below. Use all movements properly <u>at least once</u> to insure full credit.

They will also be watching for creativity in your routine.
